- » To Denham Village A and Chiltern team players who once again fought toe to toe to battle for League Championship One winner status. A great standard you continue to set.
- » To those younger players in Division Two who played for the first time in the League – well done to you all – we hope you enjoyed the experience and look forward to your participation next year!
- » As mentioned above, many of our younger players made impacts outside of our League. To Gemma, Ben, Danny, Mitchell, Gaurav – congratulations in your achievements this year in British League, Bucks County, ETTA

competitions or National School events. Many of these competitions are ongoing as this Chairman's Report is written, and we all wish you every success in what lies ahead.

- » To Division Two Champions Denham Village D for their consistent performance, but also to the new Team from Hillingdon under Steve Keyes leadership which achieved such a creditable 2nd place.

To all the Team Captains, and players, I sincerely hope you enjoyed playing in the League – thank you for your organisational and support.

As always, we receive a huge amount of Press coverage every week in the sports section of the Bucks Examiner, which gives the League both status, visibility and much satisfaction to the readers. I know many of you turn to the write up and commentary every week! However, this once again requires time and effort to deliver and therefore my thanks to David and Hazel for their weekly diligence in creating these reports and ensuring their publication.

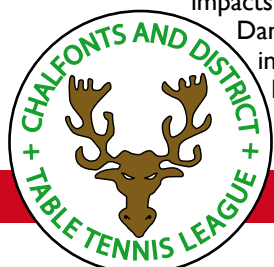

Match Secretary's Report

I make no apologies for endorsing the many credits which will be mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter, for without them we will not have negotiated another successful season. I am particularly indebted to Brenda without whose massive support there would have been no closed championships, to Richard for his assistance in preparing the Fairbank Cup handicaps and his invaluable contribution to the championships and, of course, his 'recruitment' of so many future junior stars, and to Nigel for his administrative skills and forbearance with the ETTA. My personal thanks also go to Steve Keyes for Hillingdon's splendid inaugural season, to Keith Holland for keeping his Ickenham team alive despite the odds, and to Chris Lee for organising a hugely successful Chalfont handicap tournament and procuring a super new venue for the league in the CSP Parish Church hall. Our very best wishes go to Andrew Taylor and Norman Dennis who have been very poorly...get well soon guys and see you back in action before long.

The League

After a second year of running a 2-divisional league structure, my view against this format has been reinforced for two main reasons, (a) there is a huge gap between the top 2 or 3 teams and the remaining teams in each division, and (b) more than half the teams in the second division belong to Denham Village, which is very lopsided. A more even spread would be ensured if we reverted to 3 divisions. I am strongly supported in this view.

For the third year in succession we had 19 teams in total, albeit 8 fewer players than last year. We are fortunate to have experienced a wealth of talented juniors, 3 of whom played for the Village A team and managed to wrest the title from last year's champions Chiltern. The second division champions Village D should have competed in the first division, easy with hindsight, as they romped home 11 points ahead of newcomers Hillingdon.

Many positive reports abound, from closely fought exciting matches to the raw talent of our juniors. However, one alarming statistic was that there were no less than 9 conceded matches, and this situation is unacceptable and must not be allowed to continue.

Fairbank Cup

With the same number of teams as last year, 18 matches were again scheduled to be played, but unfortunately 2 of these were walkovers. None of the matches went to 9 sets but eight of them produced 5-3 results, all of them in the early rounds.

The Denham Village F team, David Cottle, Shaun Bausor and Carys Evans, had a comfortable 5-1 win against the Village H junior girls in one semifinal, whilst the Denham Village B team of Gerry Hawkins, Nigel and Ben Naylor-Smith, had a harder match against Chalfont B in the other semifinal, 4 sets going to 3 games apiece in their 5-2 result.

The final was played at the new venue of CSP Parish Church hall. Village F fielded the same team as in the semis whereas Village B changed theirs to Steve Brown, Simon Barnes and Ben Naylor-Smith. The final score of 5-1 to the B team did not reflect the closeness of the match as 3 sets went to the final game.

To round up, the most salient feature of this year's league was the quite awesome talent of our juniors who seem to get stronger year on year and are now dominating play in league matches as well as the championships. Apart from Danny Lewis, Ben Naylor-Smith, Shae Thakker and Jemma Walker, we were fortunate to welcome 2 newcomers in Mitchell Jones and Gaurav Aravind, both of whom were the only players to record 100% averages. Long may the trend continue.

General Secretary's Report

Another season over and hopefully every League and Club member has enjoyed both the serious competition, and the fun and excitement of simply playing this great game. As always our thanks go to all the players, team captains, parents, Club helpers and administrators, Committee members, and finally Club Secretaries for making this another successful year. It goes without saying that without your help the League would not function in its current form.

As discussed in the Chairman's Report there is a large amount to be pleased with when reflecting back over the months. The continued strength of the League, the development and number of junior players, the addition of new teams, the strength of competition, and the popularity of the Closed Championship and Fairbank Competitions has shown we have a League to be justly proud of.

As to the activities of the Committee over the period, we have discussed, debated and reported back on a significant range of topics, issues and events, ranging from Divisional Structures, changes and impact from revision in the ETTA structure, financial status, League operation, rule changes, player and league development, and competition planning and execution. Our monthly meetings have seen us meet together and been hosted at either our Chairman or Match Secretary's venues with, I have to say, excellent refreshment (!), and so many thanks to Bob and David for this hospitality. The outcomes and decisions taken from the AGM held on the 19th May last year were incorporated in to the League Rules, or the operational management of the League.

Last year I commented that the Closed Championships were one of the best in the last few years, both from the standard of play and the smooth organisation and operation, however I think this may even have been surpassed this year through the combination of choice of venue, sheer volume and diversity of entries and quality of table tennis being played. Again, thanks to all the members of the Committee and League who ran the event, and for those that stayed at the end of a long day to return The Harefield Academy hall to its normal state.

Quite striking this year was the impact our younger players had on both competitions (Closed Championship and Fairbank Cup), and therefore it's fitting to pause and appreciate the efforts that three of our Clubs especially - the Denham Village Club, under the stewardship of Richard Cottle, Hillingdon under Olu Phillips, and Chiltern Club, under Mike Atkinson - have done to encourage a really healthy number of young people to play and enjoy the sport.

As mentioned last year, the performance and enjoyment of our League is only guaranteed by the generosity of those individuals

who run the Clubs and teams, organise venues / tournaments, set up and clear away, and help to run / administer all the numerous activities behind the scenes – our thanks to you all who continue to make this happen. No matter how small your contribution please continue to offer your support to your Clubs and the Committee – we all need to play our part.

Finally – as we plan for the AGM (Annual General Meeting) on May 18th and then turn our attention to the new season ahead, the Committee will continue to challenge itself on how the Chalfont and District League can be moved forward, benefiting the players, Clubs and communities from which we come and in which we play. Your thoughts, suggestions, and ideas are, as always, very welcome.

Closed Championships 2014-2015

This year's championships were held on Sunday 1st March at a new venue, the Harefield Academy. Despite the organising committee's fears that the space might be a little tight to accommodate 5 tables, this fear was groundless as the tournament seemed to be very well received. The number of entries, 40, was one of the largest in recent years, and required 101 matches to be scheduled. The 10 events followed the same successful format as last year, commencing with the Under 15, and Junior Boys and Girls events, and concluding with the Men's Singles Final at 6 pm. The committee would like to thank all the umpires and assistants for their invaluable support.

Once again, there were some spectacular matches to be seen, and the standard of our junior players was quite awesome. Indeed, the tournament appears to be totally dominated by the juniors nowadays, as they triumphed in every event bar of-course the Vets Singles. As always, it is very hard to select the memorable matches as there were so many. Particularly memorable however was the Under 15 final between Ben Naylor-Smith and Gaurav Aravind, which Gaurav managed to close out 13-11 in the fifth, having saved two match points. Ben's win against Danny Lewis, 15-13 in the fifth of the Junior Singles semi-final was equally exciting if a little against the odds, as was Mitchell Jones' 5 set win against Ben in the final.

Two matches worthy of mention in the earlier rounds of the Vets Singles were Gerry Hawkins' narrow 13-11 fifth set win against Nigel Naylor-Smith in the first round, and Bassam Mocharrafi's close match against Ron Bryant which Bass clinched at 11-8 in the fifth. In the Men's Doubles, Gaurav and Lee Clark surprisingly put out the experienced Mark Croucher and Chris Haines in 5 sets in the quarter-finals, proceeded to beat Gerry and Roland Stanbridge from 2 sets down in the semis, and then took a set off Mitchell and Danny in the final.

In the Men's Singles, Bassam took revenge by beating the third seed, Mark, in 4 sets in the first round, having lost to him in 4 sets in the Vets Singles semis. However he lost to Gaurav in the fifth set of a roller coaster match in the quarter-finals who in turn had to give second best to Danny Lewis in five exciting sets in the semi-final. The final of the Men's Singles final between Mitchell and Danny was quite breathtaking, both players trading banana shots 3 meters away from the table. Mitchell clinched it.

Many juniors were in contention for our star of the championships nomination, including Gaurav Aravind who won Under 15's and Restricted events and was runner-up in the Men's Doubles and Junior Doubles, Gemma Walker who won the Ladies Singles and Junior Girls Singles events and was a finalist in the Mixed Doubles, Danny Lewis who was co-winner of the Mens Doubles and Mixed Doubles and runner-up in the Mens Singles final, and Ben Naylor-Smith who was co-winner of the Junior Doubles and a runner up in the Under 15's and Junior Boys Singles. ***This year's star of the tournament however has got to be MITCHELL JONES who won all the events he entered, Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, Junior Singles and Junior Doubles.***

I'm delighted to announce we will be welcoming a new club, St. Joseph's into the league, I'm planning an open evening at the church hall where their prospective league players will get a demo and tips from our league champions, I hope this may also encourage interested players to come along and get involved.

I have been working on the return of our Junior League, which has been a great success in past years, and am hoping this will be ready to take off in the new season. I have many keen juniors at Denham village plus we now have more young players joining the Ricky Club thanks to the efforts there, plus juniors from Hillingdon and the CSP Middle school, which is still a very keen TT centre. I currently have a waiting list at Denham such is the interest in junior TT, but as always the tricky part is finding the man power and hours to accommodate them all.

Junior and youth players continue to play a big part in the senior league with around 10 players in the first division and up to 20 in the second. Of course the youngsters made a big splash at the recent championships, and 3 of the 6 Fairbank Cup finalists were young players. I hope you agree that it's great to see these players compete in our local league and follow their progress. In the England junior rankings we see Mitchell Jones at 13, Danny Lewis at 35. Ben Naylor, Jemma Walker and Shae Thakker are in the TOP 30 in their age groups and Carys Evans breaking through into the top hundred,

Every year I make an effort to bring in some new young players into the senior league to get a feel for competitive play, and little Sonny Dalston was delighted when he recently won his first league match at just 9 years old!

We have been building on a good alliance with Harefield Academy and we are pleased that one of our friendly faces there Nicholas Li, not only passed his coaching badge but picked up a coach of the year award too ! He has now started a new club venture at the Academy and I also hope to welcome them into the league next season.

Another most exciting venture has got to be the development of the Hillingdon TT Club and I congratulate Steve and all his helpers there for the superb work they have been doing, We look forward to seeing more Hillingdon teams in the senior league next season as well as joining our new Junior league.

I'd like to say a huge thank you to Brenda Cranfield-Thompson, she is stepping down to pursue other ventures after committing years to local TT, Brenda has been a tremendous help, both at the Denham Village club and on the League committee, she'll be greatly missed.

Finally, appreciation and thanks are also due to the Chairman and my fellow committee members for their efforts, especially David Stephan who works tirelessly behind the scenes to keep the league ship afloat.
