Closed Championship - 2018-19 Season

We were delighted to be able to host the Closed Championships this year, following the difficult decision to cancel them last year due to poor entry levels. A key objective from the League Committee this year was to drive up participation from players across all three Divisions, to gain traction and momentum back with the Championship, even if that meant sacrificing some of the more traditional events, and introduce more relevant competitions.

.....and so on March 17th at Hillingdon Table Tennis Club (Oak Wood School), a huge entry of over 30 players descended to play over 140 matches in one afternoon across 12 table tennis tables. The format was simple and designed to ensure that all players played a minimum number of matches; gained enjoyment from the event (although competitive!) and reduce the normal wait time for the next match.

Play kicked off, under the watchful eye of Tournament Referee James Johnson, with a brand new event, the Divisional Singles, across all three divisions. Each player in their divisional pool played every other player across 3 sets, with the top two players fighting it out for the title of Division Champion. After a couple of hours and some very closely fought and competitive matches, and with one Division even requiring a count back to identify the result, the winners and runners up emerged. Congratulations to all those who pictured on the next page!

With three hours of play remaining it was on to the Handicap Singles – another new event for the Championship – played as a straight one set knockout – whoever reached 21 points first won!! A great chance for those players from Division 2 and 3 to take on and beat players from the 1st Division....and so it proved with many scalps being taken and a number of single point shoot outs. One player however stood out during the Handicap Singles, and so it proved that Luke Shelbourn-Frost took home the trophy.

With the Tournament in full flow, the Doubles and Men's Singles event kicked off, with again some great table tennis being played and tremendous competitive spirit. Many games went to five sets in the Singles events as the standard ratcheted up across the later rounds. Players from Hillingdon TT club again came to the fore with Krisztian Bonsar winning the Doubles Final with Nigel Wong and reaching the Men's Singles Final where he came up against Geoff Grange. Due to the event running out of time at the Hillingdon venue, the Men's Singles Final was played on the same night as the Fairbank Cup semi-final. After a terrific match full of high class table tennis, Krisztian edged through to win 3-1 in sets.

Just a couple of thanks to finish this report off with – firstly to the Championship Sub-Committee (Stefan, James, Hazel, Derek, Nigel) who planned this exciting new event – a really great job – we have had lots of players expressing their appreciation for the new format (see right), and the amount of table tennis they got to play.....please keep the feedback and ideas for improvement coming in. If you feel you could help out next year, please let one of the Committee know. Secondly, to all the players from across the League who supported the event – thank you so much for entering, your energy, positivity and commitment to the afternoon – the event was played in wonderful spirit.

....and finally huge thanks to Oak Wood School and Hillingdon Table Tennis Club (Steve Keyes) for the use of the Hall and the facilities – simply perfect for the Championship this year.

Commiserations to the Chalfont A team comprised of Steve Whitehurst, Chris Lee and Mark Croucher. A great effort made against some very consistent and inspired play from the opposition.

Many congratulations go to the winning team of Ted Parkes, Chris Elmer, and Nicholas Carter. Congratulations to Nicholas for being on the winning team for the second year running!

The Cup ran quite successfully this year with only one team having to concede during the tournament. This year did throw up some challenges around handicap regulations, the subject of which will be explored at the AGM and before the start of next season's competition by the League Committee. Where clarity is required then we will amend the competition regulations, and ensure communication is widely made.

Back to the tournament itself, this kicked off in the first week of January with the last 3 years winners being knocked out in the 1st round – both Denham Village A and B teams losing to Denham Village F and Ickenham respectively. Round 2 saw some very tight matches with three matches going to either 5-3 or 5-4. The semi-finals comprised two Denham teams, together with Hillingdon A and Chalfont A, with Chalfont A and Denham Village G winning through to contest the final held on the 17th April.

Lastly, my thanks to all the team captains for getting the matches played on time, and for those who have assisted me in running the Fairbank Cup this year.

Junior League Competition

I again ran four days of Saturday matches with our junior league. It's aimed at the developing players that will hopefully transition into the senior league over the next few years.

Each season we hold four afternoons of competition and the venues are shared out between the clubs. All the young players thoroughly enjoyed the matches. We started out with our first Division of six teams- two from Denham Village, two from Hillingdon TT club and two from Chalfont St Peter Academy.

We did not get the entry from Reach TT club this year as their coach Roger Close told us that he was unable to secure the venue to continue his youth program so that was a great shame. Another blow was Hillingdon were not able to attend the final session, as their leader Steve Keyes had left the club - he has done a great job the last couple of years in bringing his junior players to compete in our league - he'll be sorely missed by all and we wish him all the best for the future.

Division One had a rather broad standard of play, with the Denham Demons already playing in our senior league. There were some thrilling matches, one of them in fact the last game of the season where the much improved Edward from CSP Killers was taken all the way to the wire and just pipped at the post by 9 year old Aiden from the Dynamo's, 12/10 in the deciding set.

Although they didn't get many points on the board the girls 'superstars' team did a great job in competing in this division, and have gained some valuable match experience. Their team of Alice, Poppy, Bella and Clarissa were also commended for



being the most improved players from the division. It was great to see the spirit in which our junior players competed, there was a good-sportsmanship feeling that ran through the season.

Division Two was a little bit more informal as we've had different teams on each day; we were also pleased to welcome a team from Oakwood School to one of our sessions. But at the top of the division the CSP academy's teams of 'Allstars' and 'champions' were hot on the heels of the Denham entries of the 'dodgers' and the 'dragons'.

The CSP players have been making great improvements thanks to the sterling work carried out by Joseph Underwood and his coaching sessions for juniors at the school, they also got through to the finals in the National School competitions. We had a nice surprise as CSP were accompanied by their ex-headmaster John Underwood on one of the league afternoons. John was an inspiration for many years at the CSP Academy and has left a great legacy that his son Joseph is carrying on.

Match Secretary's Report

It has been another very successful year for the League.

As well as the very high standards throughout the Divisions, and some extremely competitive leagues, the matches have again been conducted in the true sportsmanship we have come to expect from our players. It was particularly pleasing this season to welcome back to our League, Rickmansworth Table Tennis Club, with a team in Division 2.

League Update/Status

Following normal discussions at our Club Secretary's Meeting back in the early summer, our League continued with the three Division structure for the 2018/19 season.

There were 20 teams totalling 109 players. This gave rise to 174 matches in total across the Divisions, of which, only five (3%) matches were conceded.

In Division 1, four of the teams played out an extremely competitive fight for the title (Chalfont A, Hillingdon A, Denham A & Denham B). Denham A ended up pulling away in the last few weeks to take home the honours, and only 8 points separated the next three teams.

In Division 2, the title went to the returning Rickmansworth Table Tennis Club, who romped away from the chasing pack, the three Chalfont teams taking 2nd to 4th places. We look forward to seeing whether Rickmansworth play up next season into Division 1.

Division 3 saw the tightest of all finishes, coming down to the last match. Both Brunel B and Denham Village G ended up tying on the number of points, but Brunel B came first having one more set win. It really could not have been any closer!

Moving from a team performance to an individual lens, many congratulations go to the following players who played more than 60% of the League matches and were in the top 2 player averages:

In summary, this has again been a very successful and enjoyable season with a good standard achieved throughout all the Divisions, providing some very competitive table tennis, and close matches.

Finally, my thanks as always to the Team Captains and Club Secretaries for all their support this season, for keeping all the matches ticking over and for submitting the scorecards in to me on time (97% electronically!) – it has enabled us to keep the League on track without issue.

General Secretary's Report

As mentioned in the Chairman's Report, there were three ongoing aims for us as a Committee to focus on:

- Encourage further participation and enjoyment through new competition formats
- Develop further the League structure with regards the number of teams in each Division, ensuring that each Division maintains a strong competitive edge
- Continue the expansion and development of our Junior League and Junior members, drawing on the support (financial and operational) of both League and County

My belief is that we continued to progress well against these aims. The Closed Championship in March, with its restructured format and timescale were great reminders of how it's possible to mix camaraderie with competition, and extend the Championship out to a wider reach of players.

Similarly, the continuation of the three-tiered divisional structure has maintained the competitive edge; with one Divisional Title (Division 3) being decided by a countback on sets won. The ongoing success of our juniors through the Junior League programme continues to uncover and develop exciting talent. As always, thanks go to all those people who have been involved with promoting these three aims.

I do firmly believe we need to add a 4th aim to the list and that of diversity. I was particularly struck this season by the lack of ladies participating in the League and the Closed Championship, and the resultant cancellation of the Ladies Singles event. It feels right that we should focus further time on identifying and taking actions to redress this position.

We continued this year with the adoption of the ETTA Safeguarding Policy to ensure we have the right focus and good practice in regards the welfare of children and vulnerable members of society, and secondly also obtained specific agreements from Clubs on the provision of personal data (GDPR regulations).

As always, I would like to thank all of my fellow Committee members for their continued support and commitment in attending, and contributing to so many of our monthly meetings. There is always much to discuss, plan and execute, and their commitment ensures the smooth running of the League. Special thanks to Hazel and her husband for hosting us so well every month.

We do have two ongoing vacancies on the Committee - if there are any players or parents of players who can spare a couple of hours every month to support or join

the remaining Committee with regards to managing our publicity or Closed Championships, then you are most welcome...please let any of us know.

Reflecting back on the positive changes that we have made this season:

- Financial management – a small surplus was achieved this year (see Treasurer report)
- Closed Championship reformat – great feedback received (see report)
- Continued transparency – all Committee minutes published
- Continued focus on Junior development
 - Via the Junior League (see report)
- Continued participation in the Inter-League Tournament over in Aylesbury
- Continued investment in digital platforms:
 - Facebook page for our Table Tennis League

Next season we will also explore self-entry of score cards in to the league management platform depending on the outcome of Table Tennis England discussions on TT365 or its alternative. This will significantly reduce the burden on the Match Secretary!

I am sure the above list is not exhaustive, but does demonstrate how our league continues to move forward across all areas of playing, management and administration.

As per the league rules the Executive Committee continued to meet regularly during the playing season to administer the affairs of the league, and govern the league subject to the annual General Meeting.

This administration covers liaising with Table Tennis England and Bucks County Table Tennis Association; ensuring the health of our finances; structuring the playing schedule of the three divisions; administering TT365 with all match results, rules, forms, minutes; organising the tournaments; supporting the development of players and clubs; and driving the right culture within the league, such that playing is enjoyable, sociable, competitive, and undertaken in the right spirit.

As always, many thanks to all players, Club Secretaries and Team Captains for their great support to the Chalfonts and District league during the season.

Development Officer's Report

I have been happy taking on this role as league development officer since I was asked back in 2012 by our dear old friend and chairman Bob Baines, I have also I've also agreed to carry on next season but I think I will hand over to somebody else after that.

As well as running the Denham village table tennis club and coaching the kids there, a lot of extra time has been spent this last season in organising a brand new St Joseph's team and also assisting with the Brunel club and teams. It was a shame that at the end of the previous season the St Joseph's players decided to hang up their bats, so rather than lose that venue and club identity I shuffled some Denham juniors over to St Joseph's and after a bit of arm twisting, one of our dads Gerald McGrath bravely took on the captain's role there - thanks Gerald and good job ! It was also great to welcome one of our old juniors back, Giles Young, now a young Dad, who started as a lad with us many years ago.

So what with organising league clubs, teams and running the junior league I'm sorry to say there's not been much time for 'league development' as such. I have tried to make strides over the last few years to identify any possible new clubs we could attract into our league, there have been some pockets of interest but these have generally been people who 'play for fun' and once I mention individual membership / team registration / home venue / weekly league matches they often get put off. However individual players are often identified and always made welcome to the league and slotted into teams where appropriate.

We held a couple more adult coaching sessions with super guest coach Eli Baraty which went very well, apart from where we all tried to return Eli's serves ! I plan to run another of those sessions before next season, details to be announced.



Our junior league sessions went very well (more details in this Top Spin Attack) but two pieces of bad news - first the 'Reach TT Club' did not enter as their coach Roger Close was unable to carry on running their junior club, and then we were sad to hear that Steve Keyes had left the Hillingdon club and so they were unable to attend our last session.

We have recently heard of great strides forward in English table tennis, one of them being Liam Pitchford currently ranked at World number 15, but even that doesn't seem to help the dwindling numbers in local leagues up-and-down the country. I'm sure those of us of a certain age (!) will remember many leagues having 12 or so divisions, I don't think there is an easy fix as such but I am glad that our Chalfonts league is going strong and I'm sure if we all keep up our enthusiasm levels up we can make it even stronger over the next few years. So please do spread the word and put any interested parties in touch with us, and as always let me know if you'd be keen to offer some help in the smooth running of our table tennis league.

The group members have now been appointed, covering a range of interests e.g. Counties, Clubs, Education, Gender etc.

To try to enhance involvement/democracy in the sport there are discussions currently about altering Voting rights to include more people/clubs. Watch this space!

NB Leagues are still seen as the backbone of table tennis in this country.
