I refer to four young lads from the 'Vics' who entered the fifth division this year with no competitive experience what-so-ever, quite prepared to count the number of games they might win rather than points obtained, but so keen to 'have a go'.

To are Keith Steele, aged 13; Martin Mitchell, aged 13; Mark Wray, aged 14. and Tim Axford aged 16.

Their general behaviour and sportsmanship has been a joy to watch and any nets or edges not in their favour, has generally been accepted with a 'boyish grin'. They are such good rals, encouraging each other in their matches and agreeing to step down in turn from league encounters irrespective of individual results. Their results to are a credit to them. After a naturally nervous start, they managed six points in the first half of the season, but after only seven games in the second half have a total of 15 points. One boy in particular, Martin Mitchell, (Freddie Mitchell's lad) has made his presence felt in the second half after winning only four games in the first. To-date he has played 18 games in the second half of the season and won 16 of them. Some improvement: As the weeks go by their general rlay seems to improve, partly due perhaps to experience, but mainly I feel, from the weekly coach course they attend enthusiastically at Newport organised by Mr. I. Smith.

May this, their sportsmanship, pleasure in competing and general good behavi continue, then their table tennis future could be quite bright.

From the Archives

The English Table Tennis Association's Table Tennis News only published two editions in the latter part of 1985 and these were short of Isle of Wight news, except that relating to Carl Prean. As John Prean was no longer writing for the publication, the detailed and interesting reports on Island table tennis were missing.

In the November edition John Prean had a letter published where he expressed his thanks for support he had received, and mentioned the problems with English table tennis.

I shall not write for this magazine in the foreseeable future. Readers have given me a great deal of support both publicly and privately. May I thank them all, particularly those who have not always agreed with me, but felt that I (and everybody else) had every right to express my views, to stimulate debate and change.

My county has just elected me as its National Councillor and my voice will continue to be heard, particularly when there is injustice and incompetence or anything else that denies English table tennis a place in the sun. We have fallen behind other countries and other sports and we are losing members rapidly – 8% last season alone. Never was there such a time for a united effort, a fresh start.


Unfortunately the only other Island news was in relation to us needing help with our schools' table tennis:
