








Introduction

Remembering John Creighton

In November we received the very sad news that club member and local league player John Creighton had suddenly passed away. John had been a member at Kingfisher since 1994, was competing in both the Reading and Bracknell leagues this season, and was still on 100% in both

leagues at the time of his final match on Friday 20 November, 2015. He played

in more than 30 seasons in the local leagues.

Prior to joining Kingfisher, John worked at and played for the National Institute of Research in Dairying (NIRD) and I received the following record from Derek Harrison and Robin Lockwood in relation to John's earlier years in the Reading League:

1964/65 NIRD 'A' IN div 2 where he was captain and they finished 9th 1965/66 NIRD 'A' in div 2 captain 6th 1966/67 NIRD 'A' in div 2 captain 5th 1967/68 NIRD 'A' in div 2 captain 2nd average 91%

1968/69 NIRD 'A' div 1 captain finished 10th

1969/70 NIRD 'A' div 1 captain finished 10th

1972/73 NIRD 'A' captain div2 1st average 83% He also won the Div 2 divisional championship.

1973/74 NIRD 'A' captain div 1 finished 12th

1974/75 NIRD 'A' captain div 2 finished 3rd average 79%

1975/76 NIRD 'A' captain div 2 finished 8Th average 86%

1976/77 - took a break from table tennis to concentrate on darts and played at the pub near the Winnersh roundabout.

1977/78 - Wokingham 'A' Division 2 (John only played a few games and the team were relegated to division 3)

1978/79 - NIRD 'A' div 3

1979/80 NIRD 'A' div 3 finished 9Th average 73%.

1979/80 and 1980/81 div4 team Tony Griffin, K Griffin, R . Challinor, J. Creighton

John was also a long time player in the Bracknell league, and Allan Bruton recalls that John played in the Bracknell league prior to Allan starting in 1975.

Remembering John Creighton

John was a determined and spirited player with a good sense of humour. When I first started playing he would often take the time to play a few sets with me during the summer season. In his last match for Kingfisher D it was my own Kingfisher E team that were playing (we were the 'away' team, beaten 9-1 that night) and he and I had a really good 5-setter: 11-7, 7-11, 11-9, 11-13, 11-9).

A service was held for John on Monday 7 December at St Catherine's, Bearwood and Reverend Clifford very kindly sent us a copy of his address, which follows below.

Frederick John Creighton: Funeral at St. Catherine, Bearwood: 7th Dec. 2015

"John was born in 1940 on the Isle of Wight, to Carmel and Frederick Creighton.

Soon they moved to Southampton where his brother, Michael, was born. Then, at the age of 11 or 12 yrs to Mortimer, Berkshire, where his father was a teacher at Wokefield Park School. John remembered it fondly as a time of roaming freely and playing in the woods.

John tended to be something of a sickly child, though at Ashmead School he proved to be a good sportsman. Later he was to play both football for Shinfield (until he broke his leg) and cricket for Shinfield Cricket Club, where he was a fast bowler. It was cricket that brought out his competitive spirit, and told he especially didn't like being run out! He also played table tennis

I'm told he especially didn't like being run out! He also played table tennis for the Reading and Bracknell Leagues over many years. On quieter days he loved fishing.

Although not academic, John was good at maths and very good at practical things. Many of you will have admired his "hands on" approach - making cupboards, pottery, the fine corner cupboard and other pieces which adorn the home today. He took evening classes in plumbing and carpentry at Reading College. It was here that he met Gerry, who was doing a secretarial course. They married in 1963 at the RC Church of Christ the King in Whitley. And it was there that John was confirmed.

Gerry and John lived in Shirley Avenue, Whitley, where both Jason and Elaine were born. With two small children it was time to look for a new place to live. The moment John saw No. 473 Reading Rd. as they passed by, that was it. They moved in in January 1971.

John's practical skills made him the ideal person to be employed by the National Institute of Research in Dairying, as Head of Building Services. Redundancy in 1984 hit John hard, and this led to several months of depression. He then joined Will Tyler where he enjoyed mentoring the younger staff members and being part of a team again and this certainly helped towards his recovery. After this he went on to become a Clerk of Works with Wokingham District Council from where he retired.

In retirement he spent much time in the garden, did many an odd job for neighbours

and, only recently, worked with Adrian on his own kitchen upgrade. I've visited John at home on several occasions but I'd never been in the kitchen – until last week. And what a splendid job the two of them have done! Although John has had his health problems in recent years I was very surprised when he died so suddenly. The last time I saw him he still had that warm welcome and strong handshake, and had in fact helped his Kingfisher Table Tennis Club to a 9-1 victory on the Friday evening, then on the Saturday helped Adrian to put the final touches to the kitchen refurbishment.

John's sudden departure has been a great shock to Gerry, Jason and Elaine. They will need your support and prayers in the days ahead. But today we give thanks for him and in the prayers I will give you space to remember him in your own individual ways, and maybe recall some part of his life that you may have shared.

Of course, John had his frailties, just like the rest of us. I got the impression, from his speaking to me on one occasion, that he took the death of his mother very hard. None of us knows quite how we will respond to life's challenges. But in the midst of the sadness of today let's remember this: the Christian faith speak of a tomorrow. It was won for us through Jesus' death on the cross. The story of John's life, and of yours and mine when we finally pass this way, is not how good or bad we've been, how strong or weak, but how all-embracing is the love of Christ, who looks on us with compassion, understanding and forgiveness. In that reading from John 14, he tells His disciples, and through them he tells us, "I go to prepare a place for you...to take you to myself ...so that where I am you may be also." The sentence which began this service assures us "Neither death nor life can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord". It is some weeks now since I saw John kneel with Gerry for communion at St. Mary's but he would have heard again those words "bring us with all your saints to feast at your table in heaven." That is now his privilege. For us it is yet to come. May he rest in peace and rise in glory."





Coaching at Kingfisher

Kingfisher Table Tennis Club has a long standing ethos of coaching and player development. We are proud of the fact that because we are able to offer excellent practice and training facilities, more of our members have received international recognition than any other UK club of comparable size.

At the highest level table tennis is one of the world's most dynamic and athletic sports. It is a complex sport requiring speed of movement as well as quick mental reactions, fitness, strength and yet a fine touch is also required. This is all needed to reach the highest levels but even to be a good local player requires sporting skills and fitness. Kingfisher aims to create an environment where young and committed players are given the opportunity to reach their full potential in the sport of table tennis. We aim to help our young players develop technical, tactical, physical and mental skills. Also essential is the opportunity to spend the quantity and quality of table time each week, necessary to reach full potential.

Licensed Coaches

At Kingfisher, coaching and training is delivered by the following Table Tennis England Licensed Coaches. Peter Charters, Alison Broe, Graham Outrim and Gwynne Penny. To obtain this licence these people have to hold an English Table Tennis Association or UKCC coaching qualification; have a DBS (formerly CRB) certificate, have attended a First Aid and Safeguarding Children course, all in the last three years plus have attended CPD activity each year. The Coach Licence then provides the coach with insurance cover.









As professional coaches, Alison and Graham offer one to one individual coaching to both juniors and seniors. Paid coaches require a Kingfisher Permit from the club to use the facility for profit. This one to one coaching at Kingfisher is by arrangement at a mutually convenient time and will depend on the availability of a table.

Club members who do not hold a valid Coach Licence, but who offer paid sparring/coaching are not covered by insurance. The licensed coach's insurance does cover paid sparrers/coaching assistants working under their direction whilst they are present. The Club's insurance will not provide cover in these situations.

Also, whilst we encourage young players to use Kingfisher to practice with each other, this should be in the presence of a parent or a responsible adult. Parents must accept responsibility that this is adhered to.

It has been a busy year for Kingfisher Junior, Jamie Liu, pictured here (front row, centre) at Wokingham Borough Council Sports Awards in November:



Jamie was awarded the Woodley Town Council Cup 'Path to Excellence in Sport' Award at Wokingham Borough Council's 2015 Sports Award Evening.

Achievements mentioned included:

- Represented English schools in April, won Gold for the second time at the British Primary School Team Championships, following success in January at Hungary Mini Cadet Open Championships in Budapest taking the U11 title.
- Crowned Doubles Champion at the National Championships in June, held in Sheffield, winning both U12 and U11 titles.
- Came 7th in Eurominis Championships U11 Boys Singles held in France this August which was the best performance by an English boy since 2005.
- National Rankings as of September 2015 of 5th in U15 boys and 1st in U13 and is currently the youngest member of the England Youth Squad.

Jamie has also been shortlisted for Junior Sports Personality of the Year by Get Berkshire Active. The ceremony takes place on Friday 5th February, 2016 at Hilton Hotel in Reading.

At the end of October, I made the long journey to Stockton on Tees to compete in the Stockton 4* Competition.

It was a long drive, in total actual travel time was just over 5 hours. My goal was to play Ruby Chan in Under 12's Girls in the knock out stages, hopefully the final!

I entered all the girls individual events from Under 12's to Under 18's and what an experience the weekend was. I knew it was going to be a tiring weekend playing both Saturday and Sunday.

My next event was the Under 12's Girls. This was my key event and the pressure was on. I won all my group games with ease, however in order to get to the Finals, I had to beat Alana Mansfield from Essex in the Semi-finals. Alana is currently ranked 9 in Under 13's and the better player on paper. I was very nervous and I knew if I had to win this game, I would have to open up strongly and play with a lot of spin – this was my game plan for Alana.

I played well and put Alana under pressure and eventually won the game 3-1. During the match my Dad had to tell me to relax as I was putting a lot of pressure on myself and getting worked up when I lost a few points. Besides the win and getting to the final the other added bonus was I had earned a lot of ranking points. It was also nice to have Ruby Chan watching us play as she would play the eventual winner from this match.

Preparation and Training: Key to Success

The Final was always going to be tough and I had never played Ruby Chan before, only watched her play at the National Finals. I didn't feel pressured at all. The game was very fast and there was no slow play as we both liked to open up. Ruby won the match 3-0 however, I did not fall over easily and managed to win several points in each game. I was awarded Silver but very proud of this achievement as I had achieved what I wanted from this tournament and Ruby was the better player; I played as well as I could have. This was also my first medal at a 4* event and I was over the moon.

The training I had done at Kingfisher for the preparation for this competition had paid off. I have a long season to go but I know what to work on and look forward to playing Ruby Chan again and hopefully next time the result is different. I have learnt that


Never underestimate the over 80's...

What I did not realise was how good they were as Mervin Wood was ranked number 3 in England and he and Terry had represented England on many occasions.

Not being put off by that knowledge, I was determined to show them all that Veterans from Kingfisher are not to be taken lightly. That did not happen. I think I managed to reach 6 points in one game against Mervin but to be honest they were all in a different class to me. Their fitness and movement around the table was astonishing.

The experience certainly brought me down to earth, as I had presumed that any player over 80 would be slow. How wrong I was. Having lost all the games, I then watched Mark Banks playing and felt slightly better as he also lost his match. I have since been told that he reached the final of the plate.

My determination has not been lost as I have decided to enter the Veterans Southern Area Tournament next February and hope that in attending the Wednesday and Friday morning sessions, I will improve and put up a better show next time.

Well done again on a great newsletter which must be one of the best within table tennis clubs in England.




