Kingfisher has three teams in the Senior British League; one in the Women's British League (WBL) and one in the Junior British League (JBL). All players involved have to be members of Kingfisher.

Kingfisher have been staging the matches in the division in which our 2nd team are playing this season. The matches on 11th December were at the half way point of the season.

Kingfisher I in the Championship Division, have played their first two weekends at Cippenham and are in a mid-table position, comprising Marcus Giles, Dave Barr, Daniel Basterfield and Maria Tsaptsinos. Either Hari Gehlot or Elson Costa have filled in at number four in the team on a couple of occasions.

The first team will now play at BATTS in Harlow for the rest of the season. Kingfisher III will continue to play at Cippenham.

After the first of two weekends of JBL in Derby, the Kingfisher youngsters are in a good position for promotion to Division One. Jamie Liu had a 100% record, followed by Reece Chamdal on 75%, Josh Gallen and Sam Liu on 50%. The second weekend is in January.

Cippenham then clawed the match back to 3-3 before a second win from Maria clinched the draw and a win in the final match gave us a very close 5-3 victory and a much needed further 2 points.

With the men all winning one match each and Maria taking her two she saved the day for us. Probably a good thing Maria has now gone back up to Nottingham as no doubt she would have been unbearable at training the following Thursday!

So we end up having played four : won 2 and lost 2. Everyone put in maximum effort and were all a credit to the club.

The Kingfisher Junior Boys team played their first of two weekends of the Junior British League at Derby Arena on 20th and 21st October. On the first day, all four players (Josh Gallen, Jamie Liu, Reece Chamdal and Sam Liu) contributed to an excellent start with a dominant display of attacking table-tennis to leave the team with a 6-0 and 5-1 win over Ulster and Lillington respectively to put Kingfisher top of their league after two rounds in the third tier of JBL.

The team's ambitions were dented by Halton where Kingfisher went down with a 4-2 defeat but Reece Chamdal took two and held on for his brace against Kier Morton and Harry Watson. At the start of day 2, Coach Dan Basterfield gave Kingfisher the team talk that it needed ahead of a tough encounter against the Irish Boys. It worked. Josh and Jamie both took two together with one from Reece to seal a comfortable 5-1 victory.

Unfortunately Reece could not convert that advantage and was narrowly edged out by Dylan Curry in the fifth and Kingfisher had to share the spoils 3-3 with Market Rasen. That left Kingfisher in third place of six, but within two points from the league leaders Halton.

The objective for the team at the final weekend is clear: to win promotion by winning the league. It will be tough but the team is ready for the challenge.

Remembering Mike Harris

Last month, we received the sad news that former Kingfisher member, Mike Harris, sadly passed away at home, peacefully with his family on Friday 21st October. A celebration of his life was held at Canford Cemetery & Crematorium in Bristol on Monday 7th November, 2016. Mike served as Treasurer and General Secretary of Woodley Club before it merged with Omega to form Kingfisher 30 odd years ago and also played many seasons for Berkshire Vets teams. In recent years Mike



and family moved away to the Bristol area and he played in the local league there for some while.

"Mike was in my YMCA Vets British League team for many years playing alongside Bob Davis, Dave Streak and myself. We played in the inaugural weekend of the VBL. His company, Tokyu World Transport, sponsored our team with a team kit. I also played in the Swindon league with Mike and he sometimes picked my up in an armour-plated, bullet proof windowed company car!"

"Mike was for many years a regular veteran player for the Berkshire veteran teams, he and Coral moved down to the Bristol area a few years ago but he continued to support the county teams and play as and when he could. There came time however when poor health made it difficult for him to continue and so his Berkshire county career came to an end. I did call in to visit in 2013 and he was visibly better at that time than he had been and I believe he was then starting to play again in his home area. Mike played in 147 count matches for Berkshire with just short of 50 percent success rate. The team upstairs has another star in it's side."

"Mike Harris, who, for a very long time, was a member of the R&DTTA in general and the Kingfisher TTC in particular, has, sadly, passed away. Not only was Mike a stalwart member of Kingfisher but, in the days of membership numbers, he held the enviable number 007! Mike moved to the Bristol area quite a few years ago."

Bristol Table Tennis League, 27th October:

The following notice is taken from the Bristol Table Tennis League news feed, written by Dave Grounsell: "It is with great sadness that I have to inform you of the death of my very good frien Mike Harris. Mike played for Portishead TTC for a number of years after moving from Reading. He had played table tennis in Reading for many years. Mike was a great player, super team mate and had a wonderful sense of humour. I shall miss his smile and company."

Remembering Mike Harris

1993 – Grouping Tournament prior to the 93/94 season (By Roger Woolven-Allen) from the newsletter archive:

"Mike Harris emerged the winner of the four-player Group 6, beating his Berkshire "Zimmer-frame" colleague, John Morris in a deciding third game. " "In group 2, Bela Hegedus lost an exciting three-game set to the ever-improving Hari Gehlot while sidespin maestro Trevor Organ, a last-minute substitute for Mike Harris (who dared to arrive four minutes late and was consequently and rightly booted out of the tournament) took third spot."

From Roger's Ramblings, Newsletter Archive:

"Mike Harris, Geoff Davis and I had a little knock the other day. Mike and Geoff were actually playing when the ball struck Mike's bat and fell with a 'plop' to the floor. "It hit my floppy bit," explained Mike, "part of the pimpled rubber is lifting." "In other words," quoth Geoff, "you've got pimples on your floppy bit." "That's right," agreed Mike.

Veteran singles

There were initially 17 entries with 2 dropping out on the day due to health issues so the remaining 15 took to the tables with a fairly wide range of abilities in groups which ensured that all players got more than a single game for their entry fee.

The anticipated top 8 players fought their way to the quarter finals with Messrs. Adams, Cole, Baker and Gehlot then proceeding to the semi's. Both semi's were hard fought but the top 2 seeds Martin Adams and Hari Gehlot won through to contest the final. This was a very entertaining final and a



1-0 1-1 2-1 2-2 through to the fifth and final game match where Hari Gehlot managed to seal the last leg by the minimum 2 points necessary, a good advert for any age group of table tennis.

Under 21 singles

There was a disappointing 6 entries for this competition, so 2 groups of 3 where the the top 2 from each group went through to the semi-finals. Yonatan Slobodskoy and Joe Barraclough in one and in the other Sam Ricks and Johnson Xu. The final was contested between Yonatan and Sam with Sam coming out a comfortable winner in 3 sets.



Mens singles

With the same number on entries (17) as the veterans not a well-supported category but once again , at least, a smattering of lower division standard players who I am pleased to say did at least enjoy their matches. Again we saw the anticipated top 8 players contesting the quarter finals where the first shock took place, the number 3 seed Hari Gehlot taken out by Sam Ricks in 4 sets. The semi finals were contested between Daniel Moses and Sam Ricks and Ian Cole with Martin Adams the top 2 seeds. The final produced some very good table tennis even though it was a



straight sets victory to Daniel Moses but another superb example of quality Table tennis in our local area.

Graded Singles

A smaller entry than the previous year and with 2 dropping out on the day it didn't help matters, nevertheless the remaining 10 entrants did battle to reach the semi-finals, there were some well fought matches in these early group stages with some 5 setters and others over 4 sets so some well contested matches. The semi's saw Celia Hooker take on Zoltan Kelemen and Tamir Slobodskoy face Wendy Porter. The Hooker / Kelemen semi was a nip and tuck affair through to the fifth game when suddenly Zoltan surged ahead to take himself to the final where he faced Wendy



Porter who had a straight sets victory over Tamir. The final was a good match but Wendy proved to be just too strong for Zoltan.

Ladies Singles

With an initial 8 entries only, we started with 2 groups of 4 but with one dropping out at the start. The top 2 in each group went through to contest the semi's with Liz Bookman facing Celia Hooker and Sue Purton facing Wendy Porter. Liz and Sue came through to the final which was a straight sets victory to Liz Bookman but not without some opposition from Sue.



Mens Doubles

There were 3 groups of 3 pairs in this competition, small in numbers but not in ability. As there was only 3 groups the final was contested as a group with the 3 group winners going through. Most of the first round group matches went to 4 legs so there were no real easy matches for any pair but the winners were Martin Adams and Ian Cole, Steve Miller and Antony Baker and Hari Gehlot and Mark Banks. In the final group the Gehlot / Banks pairing proved to be too strong for both other pairs and were the overall winners with Adams / Cole in second place.



Mixed Doubles

This final event saw 8 pairs from an original entry of nine take to the battlefield in 3 groups but as with the men's doubles the 3 group winners would contest a final group of 3. This event is usually a great leveller and in this case was indeed so. There were a few , but only a few, one sided matches but in the main it was a well contested event. The final three pairs were Wendy Porter/Daniel Moses, Gwynne Penny/Martin Adams and Liz Bookman/ Hari Gehlot. 

The surface can be made of any continuous material, as long as the table yields a uniform bounce of about 23 cm (9.1in) when a standard ball is dropped onto it from a height of 30 cm (11.8 in)



Club Etiquette

- 1. Members should treat the Clubhouse, playing area and equipment with respect and apply due care at all times when using it. Fire extinguishers must not be used as doorstops but remain in position ready for use.
- 2. When entering the club please remove outdoor shoes and change into sports shoes before entering the playing courts.
- 3. Use the appropriate changing rooms when getting ready to play.
- 4. Please respect the ladies changing room. Only males with serious disability should use this facility.
- 5. Store sports bags under the chairs in the playing area, the changing room and the Social Area not on them.
- 6. Remember that you are not the only one using the club and keep noise levels to a minimum as it distracts players on other tables, who are either practicing or playing league matches.

- 12. When leaving the club please ensure that all the emergency doors are closed, all lights are switched off and, if you are the last to leave, Chubb-lock the main entrance door.
