To All Kingfisher Members - Please Read This...

On behalf of the committee of Kingfisher Table Tennis Club

Dear Members,

In keeping to our responsibilities to you, we find it necessary to advise you of critical gaps that have occurred in the make up of your committee over the last year. With Chairman/Treasurer Colin Dyke's unfortunate departure to Devon, these crucial positions need to be filled. The club have also had to manage without a General Secretary since the departure of Peter Bradley at the last AGM. A number of other committee roles, perhaps not so crucial but nevertheless important to the running of Kingfisher, have not been filled.

The committee have addressed the issue and will bring some recommendations to the AGM but a number of volunteers will still be needed; not least for Chairman and General Secretary.

We have been very fortunate in the past to enjoy the luxury of experience and dedicated volunteers in particular in filling the role of Chairman/Treasurer. He was supported by a willing team of other volunteers.

A consequence of not being able to fill important roles within the committee may mean being forced to seek hired professionals or to pay out honorariums for extra work, which would impact on the size of membership subscriptions.

We also recognize that progress needs to be made in the very way that we organise the club; new technology, online finances, youth development, child protection and general regulations etc that require a new generation of people to meet Kingfisher standards.

We therefore urge you, if you have any of the skills needed to help your club on the way forward, speak to a committee member and offer your support at the AGM on the 23rd May.

Congratulations to Maria Tsaptsinos, and the rest of the English Women's team for their recent bronze medal winning performance at the CommonWealth Games in Australia.

It was the first time that the women's team had secured a medal at the games, which saw them beat hosts Australia in the bronze medal match 3-1.

Maria not only made an impact on the table, but also with her enthusiastic and passionate encouragement from the bench throughout the tournament.

"It's been brilliant, I'm really happy. We exceeded expectations getting the team bronze, especially against Australia who are ranked one place above us in the team rankings.

I don't think I've ever been so nervous on the bench but the team pulled together really well and everything we'd been practising came on show. It was simple but effective, not going for anything too spectacular and playing a winning game.

The whole experience in the village has been good, it's been very well organised.

It's the biggest achievement of my career, a really good feeling. It makes me hungry for more."

Senior British League

KF2 and KF3 both competed at the same level but in different divisions. The SBL is made up of one Premier, one Championship, two 'A' divisions, four 'B' divisions and six 'C' divisions. KF2 and 3 competed in two of the 'B' divisions.

Playing at Wellingborough, KF2 finished in seventh place of eight teams and are likely to be relegated into the 'C' category for next season. Krasi Ivanov only played over the final weekend but managed to win five of his eight matches playing at number one position. Contributions from Josh Gallen, Yeqin Zeng, Dmitry Khakhamov and Eduard Caliman could not keep the team at this level.

The same could be said of KF3 who played all their matches at Generation 2 in Fareham.

3 of our juniors played in the National Championships On April 29th/29th in Wolverhampton.

In the Cadet singles event, Felix Thomis had a fantastic weekend. Felix topped the group thanks to a tremendous comeback against Jie Fu Tham, finally edging it 3-2 (10-12, 12-14, 11-9, 11-9, 11-7).

In the last 16, Thomis had a real ding-dong with sixth seed Peter Smallcombe, eventually taking him out 4-3 (11-7, 7-11, 8-11, 11-9, 7-11, 11-8, 11-9) before eventually losing to Naphang in the quarter-finals.

In the Doubles, Thomis who was paired with Conner Green had some fantastic wins. The unseeded pair eventually lost in the semi-finals to the No 2 seeds Louis Price and Naphong Boonyaprapa 3-0 but the match scores were very tight (14-16, 10-12 6-11).

Jamie Liu had a great weekend and picked up 3 medals playing in both U15 and U18 events. In the singles event, Jamie battled thru the semi-finals beating Josh Weatherby in the 7th set. Jamie played top seed Amirul Hussain in the final but eventually lost 4-2 and picked up a well deserved Silver.

In the Cadet doubles, the top seeds Jamie Liu & Amirul Hussain took the title against the second seeds 3-1.

In the Junior mixed doubles, Jamie Liu was paired with Ruby Chan and stormed through to the final with a series of brilliant performances. After the relative comfort of a 3-1 win over Gaurav Aravind & Bhavika Mistry, Liu & Chan came from 2-0 down to knock out the top seeds Ethan Walsh & Charlotte Bardsley in the quarter-finals and repeated the feat in the semis against George Hazell & Sarah Menghistab. They took the final to five as well, but just missed out losing the decider 11-8.

Not a bad weekend for Jamie picking up 2 silvers and a Gold.

In the doubles, Anaya who was paired with Darcie Proud were untroubled until the final. Patel/Proud lost to the No 1 seeds Jasmin Wong & Ruby Wong but picked up a Silver Medal for their efforts.

In the Junior Girls Singles, Patel who was seeded 12, topped her group to go through to the last 16 to play the No 2 Seed Mollie Patterson. It was a thrilling match and could have gone either way. Patel lost 4-2 but Mollie won the match by 1 point.

Kingfisher Grand Prix - Volunteers Needed



You may have noticed that there is no mention yet of the Kingfisher Grand Prix on the Table Diary.

We are hoping to run it this summer, but at the moment don't have enough volunteers to run it.

In previous summer seasons, the Kingfisher Grand Prix has been a popular Monday evening competition, with each player having at least two matches on the night with a random draw into the main event, and a consolation event for those knocked out of the main event in their first round.

Players accumulate points over the summer, and there are prizes awarded to the top players at the end of the Grand Prix Series, which normally runs for 12 weeks.

Kingfisher Club Night: Thursdays from 7:30pm

Club Night is back for the summer season, running from Thursday 19 April to the first week in September.

Club Night at Kingfisher gives club members of all levels the chance to meet and play table tennis in a sociable and friendly environment.

- Ideal for new and prospective members to experience the club – guests are welcome, but do need to be signed in by a member.



- Good for league players to keep their hand in during the off season.
- Players are encouraged to mix outside their regular practice group/team.

How it works:

- When you arrive, add your name to the bottom of the list on the whiteboard (near table 5) to indicate that you're waiting to play.
- When your name reaches top of the list and a slot becomes free, remove it and go on to play.
- Have a general knock and then play a 'best of 3'.
- Winner stays on for up to two matches then rotates off.
- When you come off remember to add your name to the bottom of the list again, and let the next person waiting know which table to go onto.

Guests:

- Guests are welcome but must be signed in by a Kingfisher member.
- A guest fee of £5 per guest, per visit, applies after the first visit.
- Guest fees paid during the month in which a member joins are refundable.





40-Minute Session Rule

There are times when practice facilities are at a premium and members are waiting to play. All members are reminded that, whenever the playing hall or individual tables are not prebooked, table use must be limited to sessions of 40 minutes maximum (whether for 1-to-1 coaching, training or practice), if other members are waiting to play. To help manage this a whiteboard has been added near table 4/5. When you arrive and want to play. add your name and the time to the board.





Always Bring Your Key + Fob

Please ensure that if you are the last person to leave the building you check that the building is empty, the emergency exit doors in the playing area are securely shut, the lights are switched off and the front door is closed **and locked** with the mortice key.

Guests

All members are encouraged to attend the Annual General Meeting of the club which takes place this year on Wednesday, 23rd May, 2018 from 7:30pm in the playing hall.

Your support would be greatly appreciated.

Club Etiquette

- 1. Members should treat the Clubhouse, playing area and equipment with respect and apply due care at all times when using it. Fire extinguishers must not be used as doorstops but remain in position ready for use.
- 2. When entering the club please remove outdoor shoes and change into sports shoes before entering the playing courts.
- 3. Use the appropriate changing rooms when getting ready to play.
- 4. Please respect the ladies changing room. Only males with serious disability should use this facility.
- 5. Store sports bags under the chairs in the playing area, the changing room and the Social Area not on them.
- 6. Remember that you are not the only one using the club and keep noise levels to a minimum as it distracts players on other tables, who are either practicing or playing league matches.
- 7. If tables are moved for practice purposes please ensure that you return the playing area to its normal playing format of two match tables and three practice tables after your session.
- 8. If all the practice tables are in use and others are waiting to play, please ensure that you vacate a table after a maximum of 40 minutes use.
- 9. Please use the bins to discard any rubbish such as water bottles, wrappers etc. Do not leave them on the floor, window sills or seats.
- 10. If you use crockery and/or cutlery in the kitchen please ensure that it is washed, dried and put away again after use. It is not the job of the club cleaners to tidy up after you.
- 11. Switch off the lights over the table you have been using when finished.
- 12. When leaving the club please ensure that all the emergency doors are closed, all lights are switched off and, if you are the last to leave, Chubb-lock the main entrance door.
