








Introduction

Junior British League Team Win Promotion

Kingfisher Junior Boys Promoted

The Kingfisher Juniors Boys team in the Junior British League, travelled to the Derby Arena over the weekend of the 6th and 7th February with a

chance of promotion to Division Two. This was the second of the two weekends for the

season and Kingfisher were in second place behind Wensum on games difference only.

The Kingfisher team was Josh Gallen at one, Gus Thomis two, Sam Liu three and Reece Chamdal at four. Jamie Liu, who achieved 100% playing at number three over the first weekend, was away in Hungary taking part in a mini-cadet tournament. Josh and Gus did not play in the first half of matches in October.

The 3 v 3 format, with each player performing twice, means that the number one in the team plays the opposition one and

two. Against Greenhouse in the first match, Reece sat out but the result was a comfortable 5-1 win for Kingfisher, Josh and Gus remaining unbeaten.

Sam was rested for the second match against Blades which ended in another 5-1 victory. Josh and Reece won their two in this match the latter starting his run to remain unbeaten over the whole weekend. Another 5-1 triumph for the Kingfisher boys over St Neots completed the Saturday fixtures, Sam dropping the one.

First thing on Sunday morning, Kingfisher took on the team in second place, Horsham Spinners. Josh and Gus both lost out to the Horsham number one but contributed one each and with two from Reece a crucial 4-2 win guaranteed Kingfisher of top spot. Josh was rested for the final match against Wensum which resulted in a three all draw; Reece keeping his 100% and Gus adding one.

Kingfisher finished on 17 points with Horsham and Wensum both on 13; such was the gap between Kingfisher and their nearest rivals.

The target for next season is promotion again.

Kingfisher Closed Championships 2016

Despite the very poor entries for all of the competitions this season there have been some very good matches to watch and especially in the Handicap, some close ones too.

Men's singles:

With only 8 of an original field of 10 actually arriving to take part we had 4 players from Reading div 1 and 4 from various other divisions and no surprise that the 4 "big guns" prevailed to reach the semi finals. While the 2 seeds Hari Gehlot and Martin Gunn reached the final there were hard fought matches to get to that point. Martin Gunn was the eventual winner.

Handicap singles:

Of an original entry of 18, 16 players started this competition with handicaps for all but 2 players directly from the Reading league averages from the 15/16 season. There were two main highly handicapped players Hari Gehlot and Ian Cole who both found their handicaps too much to get past round two. It has to be said at this point that all groups were settled on a count back basis. Round two gave 4 super matches all going to the final leg. The 4 semi finalists, Peter Bennett, Mick Mitcham, Jeff Huggins and Gwynne Penny provided some great table tennis with Mick and Gwynne prevailing, the final was no exception with Gwynne the eventual winner also in the final leg. A very good and hard fought competition.

Veterans singles:

An entry of 12 only with one no show on the night, but with the organiser joining in we started with 4 groups of three and in many cases good, tight and hard fought games ensued with one match in group three going to expedite in the second leg. Following the first round of groups a second round of groups was fitted in to ensure all got a minimum of 4 games. This was again a competitive round with some good performances. The quarter finals included all the expected seeds and the semi's followed suit with the 4 best players on the night. The final was another Gehlot/Gunn showdown with Martin Gunn taking the honours. A good if poorly attended competition which was enjoyed by all the participants.

Senior doubles:

This competition had an original entry of five pairs offering only a group of five all play all, however we lost one pair over the weekend before the competition and then one pair failed to show on the night, fortunately there were two players at the club on the night who agreed to make up a doubles pair so we had a group of four in a round robin. The overall winners were Martin Gunn and Mark Banks and the runners up lan Cole and Ivor Hardman. Again all the players enjoyed what matches they had.

Restricted handicap singles:

A new competition put in to encourage our lower standard players to participate, a competition where the "stars" were banned from entering a competition where the trophy, or in this season's case, the prize money, would go further down the playing order. It didn't work, perhaps it was not advertised enough!! However with a starting entry of 7 and the almost obligatory non attendance of 1 we started with a 6 strong entry.

All the above having been said the competition proved to be enjoyable for those who entered with the Reading league handicap system again proving to be spot on, there were some close games with only the odd leg or occasional match falling short. The two semi finals between Joe Barraclough and Krys Szczygiel and Gwynne Penny and Gill Bennett were both won by a 2 to 1 victory, the final however saw this seasons Queen of the handicap overcome the spirited Joe in the final with some ease.

Ladies singles:

There were 5 ladies who entered this event, a good percentage of playing lady members in the club. Not enough for more than a round robin group of 5 but this did include 2 ladies from our Tuesday morning session which is encouraging and they enjoyed themselves which is even more important. There were some well fought games and not many easy ones.

The last game on the sheet actually had the 2 ladies who had won their 3 other games so a fitting end, almost like a final, with Jenny Tanner taking on our Gwynne and it was indeed Gwynne Penny who came out with a deserved win in 3 straight sets.


Drawn doubles:

How it works:

- When you arrive, add your name to the bottom of the list on the whiteboard (near table 5) to indicate that you're waiting to play.
- When your name reaches top of the list and a slot becomes free, remove it and go on to play.
- Have a general knock and then play a 'best of 3'.
- · Winner stays on for up to two matches then rotates off.
- When you come off remember to add your name to the bottom of the list again, and let the next person waiting know which table to go onto.

Guests:

- Guests are welcome but must be signed in by a Kingfisher member.
- A guest fee of £5 per guest, per visit, applies after the first visit.
- · Guest fees paid during the month in which a member joins are refundable.

On the Road to Doha

Most twelve year olds would relish a week-long holiday in Luxembourg over Easter but Jamie Liu had a different mission during that time at the Institut National des Sports on Rue de Trèves, just 20

minutes walk from the city centre.

He was attending a Eurotalents Hopes Selection Camp and was competing for one of three European boys' nominations to join the total of 16 boys and 16 girls at the 2016 ITTF World Hopes Week and Challenge in Doha, Qatar starting on 29 May.



This year's Challenge will be staged at the state-of-the-art Aspire Academy in Doha.

17 boys and 13 girls from 14 national governing associations were put through their paces during a week of intensive training and competitions with the help of Chinese sparring partners and lead coaches from the China Table Tennis College, including the former Chinese national coach Li Xiaodong and former World silver medallist in mixed doubles Feng Zhe.

All participants were assessed against selection criteria set by the ETTU, including speed, timing, anticipation, service and return, and training. Their final hurdle took the form of a full match-play tournament against each other.

Jamie will join Simon Belik (CZE, winner of the 2015 Eurominis in France), Eric Huzsvar (HUN), Daria Vasilenka (BLR) and Hana Arapovic (CRO) to represent Europe in the world event in Doha.

Describing his experience of the selection camp, Jamie said, "It was a lot tougher than I thought it would, both physically and mentally. I am so happy that I made the cut but, more importantly, I've now earned an amazing opportunity to play against the best from around the world."

Coaching at Kingfisher

Kingfisher Table Tennis Club has a long standing ethos of coaching and player development. We are proud of the fact that because we are able to offer excellent practice and training facilities, more of our members have received international recognition than any other UK club of comparable size.

At the highest level table tennis is one of the world's most dynamic and athletic sports. It is a complex sport requiring speed of movement as well as quick mental reactions, fitness, strength and yet a fine touch is also required. This is all needed to reach the highest levels but even to be a good local player requires sporting skills and fitness. Kingfisher aims to create an environment where young and committed players are given the opportunity to reach their full potential in the sport of table tennis. We aim to help our young players develop technical, tactical, physical and mental skills. Also essential is the opportunity to spend the quantity and quality of table time each week, necessary to reach full potential.

Licensed Coaches

At Kingfisher, coaching and training is delivered by the following Table Tennis England Licensed Coaches. Peter Charters, Alison Broe, Graham Outrim, Gwynne Penny and Tom Maynard. To obtain this licence these people have to hold an English Table Tennis Association or UKCC coaching qualification; have a DBS (formerly CRB) certificate, have attended a First Aid and Safeguarding Children course, all in the last three years plus have attended CPD activity each year. The Coach Licence then provides the coach with insurance cover.











As professional coaches, Alison and Graham offer one to one individual coaching to both juniors and seniors. Paid coaches require a Kingfisher Permit from the club to use the facility for profit. This one to one coaching at Kingfisher is by arrangement at a mutually convenient time and will depend on the availability of a table.

Club members who do not hold a valid Coach Licence, but who offer paid sparring/coaching are not covered by insurance. The licensed coach's insurance does cover paid sparrers/coaching assistants working under their direction whilst they are present. The Club's insurance will not provide cover in these situations.

Also, whilst we encourage young players to use Kingfisher to practice with each other, this should be in the presence of a parent or a responsible adult. Parents must accept responsibility that this is adhered to.

Table Tennis Coaching Day: Sunday 8th May

Tom Maynard and Dan Ives are running another coaching day at Kingfisher TTC on Sunday, 8th May. The day will consist of two 4 hour sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon and the cost is £40 per person for a 4 hour session.

Places are firstly being offered to Kingfisher members and will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Help Wanted: Cleaning

Please contact a member of the committee if you can recommend a reliable cleaning firm or independent cleaner to take on the job of keeping our club in tip-top condition.

40-Minute Session Rule

There are times when practice facilities are at a premium and members are waiting to play. All members are reminded that, whenever the playing hall or individual tables are not prebooked, table use must be limited to sessions of 40 minutes maximum (whether for 1-to-1 coaching, training or practice), if other members are waiting to play. To help manage this a whiteboard has been added near table 4/5. When you arrive and want to play, add your name and the time to the board.





Always Bring Your Key + Fob

Please ensure that if you are the last person to leave the building you check that the building is empty, the emergency exit doors in the playing area are securely shut, the lights are switched off and the front door is closed **and locked** with the mortice key.

Social Area

The committee would like to remind members to keep the chairs in the social area clear for people to sit. Bags and clothes should be left either in the changing rooms, or stowed underneath the chairs in the playing area.

Non-Marking Playing Shoes

To reduce the amount of dirt being brought into the playing area, members are reminded to change into clean, non-marking playing shoes before entering the playing area.

Reminder: Guests

Members may sign in up to 2 guests at a time – **the member must be present** at the club while their guests are at the club.

A guest may visit up to 4 times before they need to decide whether to apply for membership.

The first visit is free, but the subsequent visits are chargeable at £5 per guest, per visit.

Payment of Guest Fees:

The member signing in the guests is responsible for ensuring that the guest fees are paid to the treasurer (Colin Dyke).

Guests must be signed into the guest book (located near the front door)
BEFORE they enter the playing area.

First Aid

There is a First Aid kit and AED/Defibrillator inside the playing area near the main door. The accident record book is stored in the social area at the far end on/in one of the green cupboards at the far end. All accidents must be recorded in the book, and if any first aid supplies are used, please remember to inform a member of the committee so that they may be replenished.





Emergency Exits

Please ensure that the emergency exits are left clear at all times with no chairs, scoreboards, bags or rubbish bins blocking the way to the exit.

April Fool?

One of the better April Fool pranks that I saw on the internet this year was from our very own hardbat maestro, Martin Gunn:



Have just been informed by TTE that the hardbat rubbers I've been playing with were not ITTF approved this year! And all my results are null and void!

Certainly had me fooled for a few moments, but then it also made me think – when's the last time that I checked the list to make sure that the rubbers I'm using are still approved?

So I headed over to the ITTF website (ITTF.com) and downloaded the latest 'LARC' (List of Authorised Racket Coverings) list which was published on 1st April, 2016.

The list is refreshed twice a year, on 1st April and 1st October. It shows all the approved rubbers by manufacturer.

It also shows a list of racket coverings that are withdrawn (in the current period these are valid until 30 June, 2016).

Whilst it is extremely unlikely that anyone from Table Tennis England is going to contact you to check what rubbers you are using, you could be challenged by your opponent, umpire or a tournament referee at any time, so it's good to know how to find out if your rubbers are still valid.

Having an authorized racket covering on the LARC list is only one aspect of racket legality though.

If you've watched table tennis at the Olympics or Commonwealth games, for example, you may have noticed that the players' rackets arrive at the table boxed or wrapped. This is because they have been tested in Racket Control prior to the match to ensure compliance with the laws of table tennis and the competition regulations.

Tests include Thickness and Flatness (electronic devices are used to take measurements for detailed results). The racket covering must extend to the limit permitted and the condition of the rubber is checked to ensure a consistent playing surface. There is also a test to ensure that no illegal glue or 'Volatile Organic Compound' has been used (VOC test).



Examples of what to look out for when checking a rubber against the LARC list – the two main pieces of information that you are looking for are the manufacturer and brand to help you identify the rubber on the LARC list – remember: the ITTF logo doesn't guarantee that the rubber is still legal, it must be on the current LARC list.

Incidentally, my racket coverings all appeared on the LARC list, so I won't be switching from my short pimpled rubber any time soon ©

However, I did discover that one of my coaching blades (that I use for Multi-ball) has a rubber that will be taken off the list on 30th June.

A copy of the latest LARC list has been added to the 'Important Information' folder in the social area at the club.

And Finally....

It's been a very busy time for your newsletter editor. In November I started work on UKCC Level 2 table tennis coaching qualification and I'm delighted to confirm that in February I passed my final assessments. I've also taken my first steps into County table tennis, playing for the Berkshire Vets team. And I managed to get my paws on the Bronze Medal that Paul Drinkhall brought back from the World Championships! (momentarily, at least!). I'm looking forward to a summer of table tennis practice, coaching and preparing for next season!

I hope you're enjoying our fantastic club and I hope to see you there soon!
