COMMENTARY

Week 24 (Missing commentary)

I failed to comment on Treasury B's match against Sedcopians. This was a relegation battle but there was only one winner and that was Treasury B. The margin of the victory surprised me – it was 10-0. David Shore won all his sets three straight. Tony Dight did the same, conceding a stingy 37 points all evening. Life was a bit tougher for John Colgan and he was pushed all the way by Rod Fitzgerald before eventually winning11-4 in the fifth. The doubles was the best set of the night. A real seesaw battle that Seds narrowly lost 11-5 in the fifth. This was the first time Treasury B have won a match 10-0 in this Division for some years. In a trip down memory lane, the last time it happened was 10 February 2010 when a Treasury B team of Jeremy Jones, Petko Guimichev and Ian Buchanan whitewashed Bank, who fielded Mike Goldby, Rick (?) Salmon and Les(?) Samuels (in those days, results came in on paper and no Bank Christian names were shown on the card).

Week 26

The week opens with a potentially cracking match between Nat West and Morpeth – the battle for fourth spot. In fact it turned out to be a runaway victory for Morpeth. First set of the night was always going to be close as Sammy Bekele is just three places above Tony Catt in the Men's National rankings. Tony took a two ends to one lead but Sammy won the fourth end to keep himself in the set. The final end was also close but it was Tony who defied the averages and won the set 11-7 in the fifth. Looking back on this fixture it was really all about team selection with Morpeth fielding their best team, which Nat West wasn't able to do. Morpeth ran off a string of wins interrupted only by success for Catt over Blyuss and Chambers (both highly competitive sets). The night ended with a bang in a very long and incredibly close doubles, which probably should have been declared a draw, but Morpeth won 12-10 in the fifth after 115 points had been played (that's closer than all five ends ending 12-10!). That set an all-time Divisional record for the most points played in a single set. So, 7-3 to Morpeth but I admit to some sympathy for Nat West if they went home feeling a bit hard done by. Treasury B all but escaped the fears of relegation with a 9-1 win over BTB. No sets required a fifth end but five sets ended at the fourth end. Geoff Waterhouse took an end of Tony Dight, Ross Roberts did the same with Shore and Dight, but Flavinda Xavier was BTB's star taking an end off Dight and beating John Colgan. A closer match than the score suggests. Credex continued their relentless march towards the title with a 10-0 win over PRO. Not much to say about this match as it was all one-way traffic. Jai Persaud took an end off Perry Fung and Persaud and Turner both took an end off Gilles Soulier, but that was as good as it got for PRO. Castaways were always going to have trouble with Comets and their match started in the worst possible manner for them with Steve Fagan beating Pete Harris. That reversed the result in the first half when Pete won in four ends. On paper, the scores suggest Steve was playing very well. Things looked even worse in the second set when Steve Codrington was two ends to one up on Keld Jaksland. The fourth end was close but Keld just shaded it 11-9. That seemed to turn the match as Keld won the final end comfortably by 11-4. Fagan then inflicted another blow on Castaways' title hopes beating Jaksland three straight. It was Andy Nash who came to Castaways rescue, raising his game to defeat Fagan three straight. That was a good performance as Fagan had won their first half contest comfortably. Steve Codrington lost all three but put up a good fight on each occasion. So, an 8-2 win for Castaways. In the final match of the week Sedcopians conceded to Treasury A. The match could not be played because of the lockdown in London that night and Sedcopians decided not to rearrange the match.

Two weeks to go and the top two teams now have identical points totals. In the coming week, Credex play Seds and another 10-0 looks certain. Castaways take on PRO. In the first half the outcome was 9-1 to Castaways. Last season the outcomes were 10-0 and 5-5, the latter due to an inspired night from Turner and Crawford. A win looks likely for Castaways but a whitewash is a much harder challenge. This is going to be a nail biter! The week also includes another potentially fascinating contest as Morpeth take on Treasury A. The first half match was won 6-4 by Morpeth but it was one of the closest matches of the season with five sets going the full distance. Should be a good one!
