#### **COMMENTARY**

#### Week 11

Morpeth versus Castaways and in the last bulletin I said a Morpeth team of Do, Bekele and Chambers would prove a handful for Castaways. The actual team on the night was Do, Chambers and Blyuss – still a real challenge. This match was played out of order with Sam Do and Neil LeMilliere both arriving late. I won't review this set by set, building to a crescendo, because much to my astonishment the result was a runaway 9-1 victory for Castaways. Pat Caunt won two, losing to Chambers. Pete Harris won all three, in four sets against Chambers and Blyuss and a mighty battle with Sam Do, coming home 11-4 in the fifth. But the man of the match was Neil LeMilliere who also won three, in three sets against Blyuss, four sets against Chambers and in five sets against Do, coming from 8-4 down in the fifth to win it 11-9. Extraordinary team performance by Castaways and to keep a player of Do's calibre winless is some achievement. That's a huge boost to Castaway's title chances. Sparta versus Outcasts – a relegation battle – was always going to be close but Sparta's chances were much increased with the return of Steve Willmott, a name from the past and a 70% man in this Division. Despite being out of touch, Steve won all three, dropping two ends all evening. Unfortunately for Sparta it ended there with Tokely and Hattrill having a barren night. For Outcasts, Eddie Roullier defied the averages to win two, including a close five-ender with Tokely that he won 11-7 in the fifth. I should name the other two Outcasts' players – Coull and Jameson – as all three get a pat on the back for a good team win. The doubles went Sparta's way – their first doubles win of the season – finishing 11-9 in the fifth to make the match score 6-4. Treasury A were in a mean mood against their B team and emerged 9-1 victors. Winston Wong and Laikram Persaud both won three, conceding 38 and 39 points respectively all evening. John Colgan scored the B team's single success edging out Jeremy Jones 11-8 in the fifth. Commiserations to Bryan Gittens, who fought back from two ends down to Jones, levelled the match, only for the wheels to come off spectacularly in the final end which Jeremy won 11-2. After last week's heroics it was back down to earth with a bang for Insurance against PRO. PRO won 8-2 although there were lots of long close ends. Of the 37 ends played in the evening, an astonishing 11 ended at deuce. Highlights included a near miss for Albert Francis against John Crawford in four ends, three of which were deuce ends. A good win in five ends for Francis over Ian Buchanan. A near miss for Ian Cranstone against Ronnie Turner 11-5 in the fifth. And Crawford and Jon Velinor equalling the longest single end of the season record at 19-17. Insurance won the doubles to make the match result 2-8. I feel that was a little disappointing for Insurance (my prediction was 6-4 to PRO). Nat West versus Comets proved to be the closest match of the week despite

ending 8-2 to Nat West. Four sets required all five ends and there was only one three straight victory. Tony Catt showed his good form winning all three, beating both Fagan and Codrington in four close ends. Chris Herbert also won three but by the narrowest of margins. Highlight of the evening was Chris's comeback from 8-1 down in the fifth against Steve Codrington to win 15-13 in a set that involved 100 points. His set against Steve Fagan was almost as close. It went to the fifth end before Chris won it 11-5. Other close sets include a near miss for Gareth Jones against Fagan 11-8 in the fifth and the night ended with a see-saw doubles where Nat West came from behind to take it 11-8 in the fifth. A very good match that was closer than the outcome suggests.

So Castaways end the first half on top but the gap between them and Treasury A would disappear if Treasury whitewash their last two games. Nat West are not out of it and have won their last seven games, a winning streak only bettered by Castaways. Morpeth's big loss this week probably puts the title out of their reach. A big gap opens up beneath the top four. In the relegation zone there's not much between the bottom six teams. I think the relegation battle will go right to the very end of the season.

Five matches outstanding. I'm hoping they'll get played before the second half.
