# $ANNUAL\ GENERAL\ MEETING-Friday\ 14^{th}\ June\ 2019.$

### SECRETARY'S REPORT

### 1. <u>Divisional Structure and Conduct</u>

- 1.1. For the 2018-2019 season, the League had twenty two teams with eleven in each Division. The small decrease was due to Nordwest Postal no longer having a playing venue. Many thanks are due to Paul Kersey for managing the Nordwest teams over the past twenty plus seasons. Paul hopes to re-enter teams next season if he can find a new venue. One of the Karma teams decide to move from the Central league and play in the LBCS League.
- 1.2. The arrangement of the playing area at the Abbey Centre to support four teams was improved by the installation of netting between the tables. This has been well received and does actively cut down the number of interruptions. The benefit is well worth the small extra effort required to install and remove the netting each match night.
  - Many thanks go to Ross Roberts of BTB for his acquisition and installation of the netting.
- 1.3. The Handbook and fixture grids were issued to all Club representatives by email before the season started as well as being available on the website.
- 1.4. By and large the season ran smoothly and all matches were finally completed during the week after the official end of the season.
- 1.5. As ever, the First division had a very wide variety of talents on display.

By midway through the first half of the season, the 'big four' teams had established themselves at the top of the division with Castaways in first place.

Castaways, perhaps sensing that their time had finally arrived, and despite occasional player availability issues, managed to retain the top spot until till the season's end.

The chasing group of Morpeth, Treasury and Natwest, notwithstanding the odd outstanding result, lacked the overall consistency to threaten Castaways' dominance.

Morpeth achieved their highest ever placing to finish in second position narrowly ahead of Treasury.

Somewhat surprisingly, this is Castaways first ever number one spot after twenty five years. Well done Neil and Co.

1.6. The Second division was again more competitive throughout. By the end of the first half of the season, HMRC Outcasts were odds on favourites to bounce straight back to the first division and duly finished in top spot.

The second promotion place was claimed by a HM Treasury team strengthened by the return of Tony Dight after a season's absence.

New boys – Good Karma - had a very successful start to their league career finishing in third position.

1.7. Once again thanks for playing venues are due to Morpeth School, the Abbey Centre and to DEFRA at Nobel House, who allowed their venue to be used by 2 other Clubs.

## 3. <u>League Website</u>

  Secretaries are asked to continuing sending copies of match results to Gerry (as well as the appropriate Divisional Secretary), so that the website details are updated promptly.
- 3.2. Following the irretrievable breakdown in the contract renewal negotiations between Table Tennis England (TTE) and Table Tennis 365 (TT365), it appears that there will be two competing League Management (LM) systems next season. This has resulted in motions at the TTE AGM to alter the annual individual membership fee. All Club Secretaries were supplied with full details of the proposed different new arrangements. The committee sought input from each Club as to which of the three options their respective club preferred. The result of this exercise is as follows:-

On this basis, the league will continue to use the TT365 LM system next season and will vote for the fee split proposition (option 3) at the TTE AGM.

While this is our current position, it is highly possible that matters may change dependant on the result of the votes made at the TTE AGM. The committee will re-assess the league's best way forward shortly after the TTE AGM on the 29<sup>th</sup> of June.
