COMMENTARY

Week 26

Begins with a 7-3 victory for Joola over close rivals Treasury A. Samson Bekele was the game changer, winning all three, each time involving five ends. Good back up from Rob Chambers and Oleg Blyuss meant Treasury never really got a look-in and Joola's 7-3 loss to Treasury in the first half was completely reversed. That win caused Joola to leapfrog Treasury into fourth place in the final table. Next result saw a two-man Outcasts team whitewashed by Credex. Bob Coull put up a good fight, taking an end off both Perry and Django Fung. Simon Jameson also took an end off Giles Soullier but that was as far as it went. Castaways went into their match with Employment knowing a 7-3 result would give them second place over Nat West. In the event, Castaways posted an emphatic 10-0 scoreline in what looked like a one-sided contest. A bit like Outcasts against Credex, Employment's successes were restricted to four sets where they won an end but there were no close finishes. Nat West completed their season with a 8-2 win over Comets. No Steve Fagan for Comets who had two players. As has been the case so often this season, Samuels and Herbert were unbeaten and looked untroubled. Comets won two sets, both against a ring-rusty Gareth Jones appearing in only his third match since Christmas. Closest set was Rishi Sinarain beating Gareth 12-10 in the fifth after a long contest.

Postponed matches

Two postponed matches this half. First match saw Employment end the season on a winning note beating Treasury B 6-4. For Treasury, Tony Dight won all three and looked untroubled. The best set was the contest between Frank Dos Santos and Jeremy Okai that Frank won 12-10 in the fifth. Frank had previously lost narrowly to Bryan Gittins. The final match of the 2015-16 season saw champions Credex face PRO. The result was 7-3 to Credex but PRO's three wins were by default as Credex only had two players. Laikram Persaud and Perry Fung won their sets comfortably. Both dropped an end to PRO's Marco Yu but otherwise it was one-way traffic.

Most appearances: Multi-way tie. 16 out of 20 matches played by Pete Harris, Les Samuels, Perry Fung, Steve

Fagan, and Jeremy Jones

Biggest squad: Comets with eight players Smallest squad: Treasury B with five players

Best team performance: Nat West for beating Credex 6-4 in the first half, breaking their 20 match winning streak, due to that extraordinary Les Samuels' maximum, and for beating Castaways 9-1 in the second half (including another Samuels' maximum) which blew open the race for second place. That was the closet match of the season.

Seven sets required a fifth end and Nat West won every one of them!

Longest single end: Les Samuels beating John Crawford 20-18

Longest set: Rob Chambers losing narrowly to Pat Caunt in a set that involved 112 points (that's equivalent to five ends each finishing 12-10!)

The full house award: to Steve Fagan for his hard-fought maximum against Castaways – three sets, 15 ends and 291 points played in one evening

Fewest points played in a five-ender: Jeremy Jones beating Tony Dight with just 84 points played in five ends Most points played in a single night: Tony Dight for playing a record breaking 308 points in one evening against PRO

Most improved average compared to the 2014-15 season: intriguingly, almost every player in the 2015-16 averages had a better average in 2014-15. Only two players did significantly better in 2015-16 than in 2014-15: Chris Herbert (going from 73% to 82%) and David Shore (going from 32% to 49%)
