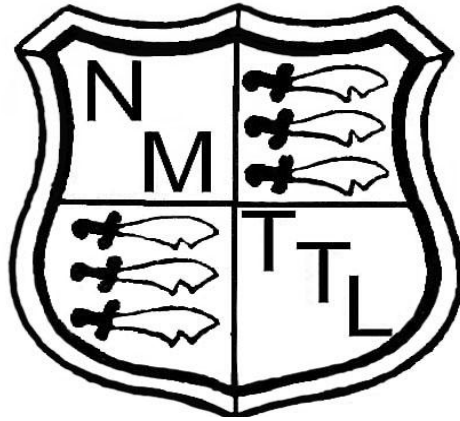

The end of the season is upon us Mayfield 4 proved uncatchable, leading the division from week 1. The team only suffered one loss, at the hands of Ellenborough 3. Admittedly, it was only a 5-4 defeat but Ellenborough 3 had a player playing up from Div 3 for them so Bruce Wang and Tumay Ekrem pulled out a stellar performance to snatch the win. All of Tumay's games went to 5 and 2 of Bruce's did too yet again proving how close the match was and backing up their positions at the top of the averages. Back to Mayfield 4 and, whilst I reported in the first half that all 3 of their players were around the 75% mark in the averages, only Mitesh Dhanani and Jack Bender have remained consistent. Dave Middleton had a little drop off in the second half of the season but still managed a very respectable 58%.

Congratulations the runners up Winchmore Hill 1, the title battle I predicted never developed. After a 9-0 shocking loss against Ellenborough 4, where the team were thoroughly trounced (none of the games were even close) I thought it was all over for them. However, the following week Heathcote were unable to field a team at short notice and a walkover was awarded to Winchmore Hill, giving them a lifeline. Unfortunately, despite a 7 – 2 victory the next week, the last 4 matches of the season were all a little mediocre and the team were unable to win any more.

Ellenborough 4 played a brilliant second half of the season compared to the first. In the first they only won 2/8 games and in the second they won 7/8 rising from 5th in the table to 3rd. Despite beating Winchmore Hill 1 9-0 they were unable to close the 20 point deficit they had amassed in the first half of the season. They did only finish 4 points behind in the end so it was still very good.

Of the remaining teams, apart from Tottenham2 and Coolhurst 1 everyone gained more points in the second half of the season compared to the first. These were mostly secured against Tottenham 2 and Winchmore Hill 1. Tottenham 2 got around 25% fewer points in the second half of the season. Coolhurst 1 did not see a change in performance or luck and gained exactly the same number of points as they did in the first half. Mid table remained very close and 5 teams were separated by just 8 points.

Many thanks everyone for getting your results in quickly, I have to say it has been a very smooth season this year.

Have a great break over the summer; I look forward to seeing some of you next season.

Arriving at the end of season 2017-18, we should not be surprised to see Bush Hill Park (who were relegated from Division 3) as winners of Division 4 on 122 points and SPS2 in 2nd place on 110 points, as that is the position they were holding at the half-way stage. However, the 3rd place position has changed since December and Ellenborough 6 overtook Ellenborough 7 to finish ahead on 94 points. Unfortunately, Ellenborough 7 had to give a walkover to SPS2 on 19 March as they were unable to raise a team but I'm sure they were not too upset at being passed by their higher team.

The result of the last outstanding match from February was recorded today, 25 April, with WH5 giving Tottenham 5 a walkover. Both sides were unable to raise a team at various stages and this walkover resulted in pushing Tottenham 5 above the WH4 team who had been holding 6th place position on 62 points.

There were a number of close 5-4 games in the second half indicating a competitive and determined spirit in this division (winners shown first):

WH4 v WH5; Mayfield 8 v Ellen 7; Ellen 7 v BHPk; Ellen 7 v Tott 5; WH4 v Ellen 6; Mayfield 8 v WH4; Mayfield 8 v Ellen 6 and BHPk v Mayfield 8.

There was a great improvement this season on the number of matches played with only 2 players, so well done to team captains for fielding full teams.

Trevor, from Ellenborough 6 sent in some comments about the match against their lower team (7) saying what a hard fought and enjoyable match it was. There had been some close games with a few going either way with long and exciting attacking rallies. "Kyle Kam is improving, watch out for him next year".

# **NMTTL TOURNAMENT REPORT 2018**

## **Saturday 17th March**

**Division 3-4 Singles:** Semi-Finals: Grace Stair beat Angelica Landry 11-3, 11-4, 11-8 and Elman Rustamov beat Dennis Tossell 11-5, 11-2, 11-8. Final: In a very competitive final Grace Stair fought back to beat Elman Rustamov 7-11, 11-8, 5-11, 11-9, 11-9.

**Open to all Paired Handicap Doubles:** In our new event, which replaced the hard bat doubles from last year, there were a number of non-league players taking part. It proved to be a fun event for all. Semi-Finals: Steve Codrington & Elman Rustamov beat Joan Bayman & Laikram Persaud 20-22, 21-11, 21-19. Gouda Abdelrazek & Peter Bayman beat Janice & Hower 16-21, 21-7, 21-9. Final: It was clear that Steve Codrington was struggling with an injury but he fought on with his partner Elman Rustamov in a competitive match to beat Gouda Abdelrazek & Peter Bayman 21-17, 14-21, 21-15.

**Open to all Handicap Singles:** Semi Finals: Steve Codrington fought his way through to the final giving points away to beat Peter Bayman 21-16, 22-20. In the other semi-final we saw a close match between Nana Ansah and Sal Ahmed. Nana won 21-12, 19-21, 21-11. Final: Nana Ansah, who was playing extremely well, beat Steve Codrington 21-12, 21-14.

**Hard Bat Singles:** Semi Finals: Laikram Persaud beat Steve Codrington 11-6, 11-7 and Gary List beat Ian Herriot 11-8 11-9. The final produced probably the best hard bat final for many years. Before the start it was difficult to see how the match would be played out with both players being very good at returning the ball. As it turned out Laikram took on the role of the attacker while Gary sat back and kept returning the ball while waiting for the right ball to put away. Many of the rallies were 30-40 strokes and more, being finished off with one of the players having to hit through the other. At 2 games all, Laikram kept his game together in the 5th, with Gary just losing his edge enough for Laikram to take advantage and win 11-7, 9-11, 11-8, 12-14, 11-6.

## **Sunday 18th March**

**Division 2, 3, & 4 Handicap Singles:** Semi Finals: Gill Toumbas beat Derek Chung from a 0-5 start, 21-14, 21-16. In the other Semi-Final an engrossing match took place. Grace Stair had an 11-0 point start over Richard Bond. Grace took control of the first game to win it 21-12. As expected, the highly talented attacking play of Richard got him back the handicap to win the second game 21-19. The third and final game looked to be going the same way until, at 18 all, Grace produced some inspired play to win the next three points to get over the line and win 21-12, 19-21, 21-18. Final: In the final, two tired players fought it out. Grace, who had a 7 point start, proved too much for Gill to win 21-15, 21-4.

**Over 50s Singles:** Semi Finals: Laikram Persaud beat Bruce Yang 9-11, 11-2, 11-2, 11-2. Semi Idowu came back from 2-0 down to beat Sal Ahmed in an absorbing match 9-11, 8-11, 11-6, 11-6, 11-3. The final was played quite late in the evening with both players running close to empty. Laikram Persaud beat Semi Idowu 11-6, 11-8, 11-6.

**Open Doubles:** Semi Final: Sal Ahmed & Laikram Persaud beat Ashutosh Pant & Bruce Yang 11-2, 11-4, 11-1. Semi Idowu & Nana Ansah beat Kevin Fang & Klodian Shaqiri 11-3, 4-11, 11-1, 11-4. Final: Nana played well above his league form with his partner Semi to get through to the semi-final. The question now was, could he keep it up in the final. Semi & Nana took a two game lead before their opponents struck back. They then rallied to win the 4th game and match, beating Sal Ahmed & Laikram Persaud 11-8, 11-4, 12-14, 11-9.



**Ladies Singles:** the 5 player group included two division 2 players - Tumay Ekrem of Ellenborough 3 and Gill Toumbas of Ellenborough 4, Grace Stair of Tottenham 3 (division 3), and two division 4 players – Rosetta Delisle of Ellenborough 6 and Jenny Barton of Tottenham 5. It was expected that the last match, played by Tumay and Gill would be the decider and so it proved. Tumay had to fight hard to overcome a determined Gill in a very close match: 8-11, 11-7, 11-8, 12-14, 11-7.

**Open Singles:** In the final event Huseyin Cakir had a tough journey through the rounds. In his quarter-final match against Ashutosh Pant it started with Huseyin winning the first game, only to see Ashutosh upping his game with much skill and determination to win the next two games. At that point it looked all over for Huseyin but he too went into another gear to fight his way to level at 2-2. The final game was more of the same with both players playing at the top of their game, both attacking every weak return of the other and defending equally well. However, it was Huseyin who came through a very tight and exciting to watch match to win 11-9, 8-11, 7-11, 11-7, 11-9.

In the Semi-Finals; Huseyin beat last year's runner-up Kevin Fang 11-5, 15-13, 11-9. Laikram Persaud beat Semi Idowu 5-11, 11-8, 11-7, 11-3.

Final: This was Laikram and Huseyin's first time playing each other. Laikram took a two-game lead and looked to be running out an easy winner. However, Huseyin again showed his class by looping and smashing his way through Laikram's defences to win the next two game dropping only five points. Could he maintain this amazing form in the 5th? The game changed again with now both players having something to protect. Huseyin came very close to winning but could not get into match point position. Laikram's solid game returned to get him over the line in a truly excellent and competitive final 11-9, 11-7, 4-11, 1-11, 13-11.

**Under 13 Junior Singles:** In round 1 there were 9 entrants who were drawn into three groups of 3 players with the winners & runners up going through into round 2, to play in two further groups of 3. The winners & runners up from round 2 would go through to the semi-finals.

The younger Rayan put up a great effort in his match against the older and more experienced Charlie. Rayan surprised Charlie by winning the first game 11-7. Charlie then upped his game with more outright attacking shots to win 7-11, 13-11, 11-7, 11-6. The Final saw Charlie play Victor. It was a tremendous match, which saw Victor containing Charlie with good defence to level at 2-2. However, it was Charlie who used all of his experience and patience to win the Final 13-11, 6-11, 11-9, 8-11, 11-9.
