#### Match Postponements

#### A wake-up call from the RDTTA Committee

Please refer to Rules 12.11.1 to 12.11.5.

- 1. RDTTA rules were changed a few years ago and team captains are no longer allowed to postpone matches, unless rule 12.11.2 applies.
- 2. Team captains should make use of the other players registered for their Club in lower Divisions. (unavailability of the star player is not a valid reason for re-arranging a match)
- 3. If a match needs to be re-arranged for a later date, this can be only be done with prior approval of the relevant DFS,.

Many team captains are aware of 1 and already do 2 and 3, but it has come to the attention of the Committee that some teams are not playing fair, but are "postponing" matches just because they cannot field their strongest team and are doing so without first getting approval of their DFS.

We want to encourage people to play their matches wherever possible, and each DFS does have some leeway to allow this to happen, but it is unfair to those teams who do follow the rules and field "weakened" teams if others are allowed to re-arrange their fixtures to ensure their best players are available.

This season especially, with a full complement of teams in each Division and a limited number of "free" weeks, it is important that the number of re-arranged matches is kept to a minimum.

Team captains are reminded that the rules of the Association are printed in the RDTTA Handbook each season and they should familiarise themselves with them, if they haven't already.

## Lower Divisions Cup by Duncan Abbott

#### Introduction

This tournament follows last season's format, with all 9 sets in each match being doubles games featuring three players on each side. Please note that each set will be best of 3 (not 5) with games being up to 11 points as in league games.

The draw for the Lower Divisions Cup has been made. There is a record 20 teams entered this year, so as a result there will be an extra round in this year's competition.

There are five groups of 4 teams, the group winners progress to the quarter finals as will the best three runners-up (ie the teams with the best record of sets won less sets lost for matches actually played). After then it will be sudden death.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the format, it is a doubles competition where each set is the best of 3 games up to 11 points. Each set won gains a league point, so if you win 6-3 you get 6 league points.



s 2013 draws to a close I would like to take this opportunity to wish all my readers and your families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and Prosperous New Year.

After the fantastic highs of last year's Olympics and other marvellous British sporting triumphs, it was very sobering that Andy Murray won the BBC Sports Personality of the Year with no real competition. Lucky he didn't win Wimbledon in 2012 – it

would have been embarrassing for the poor lad!

Closer to home, the Division One league table is taking a predictable shape. As reported previously, OLOP 'A' drew first blood against their old foe Kingfisher 'A', but Kingfisher are breathing heavily down the necks of OLOP having dropped no other points so far this term. Once again the return fixture is going to be a mouth watering prospect. Make a mental note in your diaries now: Monday 27th January 2014 at Kingfisher (unless the game gets postponed for any reason).

Similar to last season, there is a glut of mid table teams not quite good enough to challenge the leaders but far too good for the teams at the bottom.

And the teams at the "bottom" are once again engaged in a relegation dogfight. Curzon 'A' and Sonning Common and Peppard 'B' already look doomed but Sonning 'A' are far from safe. The teams above these 3 already probably have too many points in their respective bags to get drawn into the fight for survival.

Let's take a closer look at some of the team and individual performances but always bear in mind if you want much more detail about the players and teams in our top division, just visit our fabulous website which has reams of statistics to look at.

At the time of writing, Kingfisher 'A's most recent result

was a tight 6 - 4 win over OLOP 'B'. To be fair this match did include the concession by Mark Banks of his set against Daniel McTiernan but even so there were some tight looking games that night. For example Sean

Pickin had two 5-game sets – beating the in-form Mark Banks 11-7 in the 5th and losing to Tony Reynolds 6-11 in the 5th.

Incidentally, if the scorecard states "walkover" or "conceded" for any particular set, the system

requires scores to be entered so for the time being, this will erroneously affect players' averages. A system fix has been logged for this.

A Mosesless **OLOP 'A'** showed enough strength in depth to overcome YMCA in their most recent fixture. Ian Cole, Trung Tran and Krasimir Ivanov easily overcame a YMCA team which included the talented Neil Hurford. Neil put up the most resistance for YM with a good win over Trung and two close defeats to Ian and Krasi both 11-4 in the 5th. Following their earlier 6 - 4 defeat of Kingfisher 'A', OLOP 'A' have followed this up with 6 - 4

defeats of Kingfishers 'B' & 'D' so we can see its not all plain sailing for OLOP 'A' and team selection will prove critical in their remaining campaign.

Kingfisher 'B' – or Old Polish as I prefer to call them - are having a similar season to last year. In Martin Adams and Steve Dobbins they have players right out of the top left hand drawer. Martin and Steve have played against the top two teams where Old Polish lost 4 - 6 to OLOP 'A' and 3 - 7 to Kingfisher 'A'. In the game against OLOP 'A', Martin lost to Krasi Ivanov but then defeated Daniel Moses and Steve did vice versa - defeating the classy Krasi 11-5 in the 5th but losing to Moses in 3. Kingfisher 'A' showed Old Polish a hell of a lot of respect by fielding their strongest team in Mark Banks, Hari Gehlot and Federico Viterbo which proved too strong for Old Polish who couldn't make "home advantage " count. The result was a 7-3 win for the A team.

**Tidmarsh 'A'** have some good strength in depth with 5 players sitting on averages better than 40% including the cultured Sander De Reimer who has only lost twice so far this season: to Hari Gehlot and Danny Ricks of OLOP 'B'. Their match against Kingfisher 'A' was interesting. Whereas Tidmarsh revealed their hand with their strongest team which included Ian Packford, Sander and Peter Matthews, Kingfisher fielded a slightly weaker team consisting Tony Reynolds, Hari Gehlot and Stuart Williams. Ian lost very narrowly to Tony first set of the evening: 10-12 7-11 10-12. Sander then also lost by a fine margin to Hari: 14-16 8-11 8-11. Bearing in mind Kingfisher ran out 6 - 4 winners, I think we can conclude they got away with it and Tidmarsh just



came up (surprisingly to me but what do I know?) short.

**OLOP 'B'** are benefiting from the emergence of Daniel McTiernan who is firmly established as a top ten player in Division One. Maybe Daniel isn't getting enough support from his team mates to enable OLOP 'B' to climb the table? For example, their 5 - 5 draw against Kingfisher 'C saw Daniel win a tidy maximum and inspire a good doubles win. But the only other contribution was Neil Birds' defeat of Andrew Parker 11-9 in the 5th in the very first set which effectively earned OLOP 'B' their point and denied Kingfisher what would have been a fantastic team win. One factor which is startling in its incongruousness is the form of Danny

Ricks. At the time of writing, his average is 43%, having won 9 out of 21 sets played. Yet of his 9 wins, 2

of them included wins over Sander De Reimer and Marin Adams! Danny is clearly capable of raising his game against the very best players but maybe needs to learn how to achieve a bit more consistency against the more bread and butter type of player which abounds in our division.

Kingfisher 'D' consists of three players riding high in the averages; the incredibly polite and pleasant young men Eduard Caliman, Leo Long and Joshua Gallen. All these lads have won far more games than they have lost, so fair play to them and very well done boys. "Boys" is not a term I can use to describe their team mates (well maybe I could have done 40 years ago!) nevertheless the evergreens Trevor Organ and Richard Fifield are generally backing up the boys very well by picking up the odd vital win each week. A good example of their team ethic was their 6 - 4 defeat of Kingfisher 'C' where Eduard recorded a fine maximum including a 13-11 set 4 win against the difficult to beat Steve Murgatroyd. This was backed up by Josh Gallen beating Andrew Parker and Trevor's 11-7 in the 5th defeat of Lisa Williams.

**Tidmarsh** have had a shuffle round to form one strong team and one good mid table team which is **Tidmarsh 'B'**. A fairly large squad and a very mixed

bag of results so far this season sees them comfortably sitting in mid table. There was a close encounter of the Tidmarsh kind during this segment of the season when A & B faced each other across the darkened net. The A team were without their numero uno (Sander) and interestingly although the result was a close looking 6 - 4 to the B Team no fewer than 7 out of ten sets were decided in 3 ends. In fact the only sets not decided in 3 involved Sam Ricks who defeated Peter Matthews 11-7 in the 5th, John Barclay 11-3 in the 4th and Duncan Groves 11-8 11-9 11-6. Antony Baker weighed in with wins over Duncan and John and Andy Stephens

So far I haven't said anything about how crucial the doubles can be in deciding the result of a match. The doubles is very important in deciding the result! However, a quick squint at the doubles averages doesn't really shout out any strong messages apart from, as one would expect, the higher teams tend to win more than the lower teams. As things stand Richard Rosinski and Steve Dobbins from Old Polish look like the pair to beat having won 4 out of 4 so far this season.

helped secure the two points with a win against John.

In their second season on the top flight it's obvious that **Kingfisher 'C**' are finding their feet. But for a back injury to Niall McGrane I'm sure they would be higher up the table. Having said that all 4 players seem to have raised their games. Steve Murgatroyd especially is showing what a good player he is this season - currently sitting in a very creditable average of 70%. Andrew Parker hits a table tennis ball nearly as hard as a golf ball. And trust me; Andrew hits a golf ball very hard indeed. At 50% Andrew is also hitting good form this season. Lisa Williams had a great win over Danny Ricks recently and also looks to be improving her game - from my observations much more aggressive in her play. Having secured a point in their 5 - 5 draw to Old Polish earlier in the season, Kingfisher 'C' followed this up with another point against an OLOP 'B' team which included Daniel McTiernan. A great team performance in which Andrew Steve and Lisa all beat Danny Ricks and Steve and Lisa both beat Neil Bird – in Lisa's case a nail biting 11-9 in the 5th to help secure the point. OLOP 'B' won the doubles in this one to help stave off defeat - crucial that doubles!

Having started banging on about the doubles I just can't stop now! Look at YMCA's match versus Kingfisher 'C'. YM ran out 6 - 4 winners. Why? Because Keith Winter and Neil Hurford beat Steve Murgatroyd and Andrew Parker 11-7 in the 5th in that vital 7th set. A very slightly more comfortable looking win for YM v Tidmarsh 'B' was nevertheless described as a "tough match" by Peter Bradley. In his words "the doubles were crucial" in what sounded like an exceptionally exciting doubles encounter.

By all accounts Keith Winter had more than his fair share of nets and edges in his win over Sam Ricks and the 7 - 3 scoreline was sportingly described by Peter as "a little unfair on Tidmarsh"

The good news is that Sonning Common and Peppard 'A' have caught up on their fixtures! Keith Swain and Jason Roberts are showing flashes of brilliant form but so far results have proved evasive. Keith scored a fantastic maximum against Tidmarsh 'B' defeating Antony Baker, Steve Rollason and Andy Stephens. Jason managed to beat Andy 11-9 in the 5th but it was that crucial doubles (oh give it a rest

Malcolm!) which cost Sonning an albeit unexpected point following another 11-9 defeat in the 5th. We wuz robbed!

Curzon Club, complete with their wonderful glitter ball three and a half feet above the table, look to be struggling



a bit. They have suffered a few heavy defeats (as have all in the bottom 3) and it can be difficult to keep motivated and positive when you're on a losing streak. I'm speaking from experience here!! Their solitary win so far came against the bottom team Sonning Common and Peppard 'B'. This win was better than it looked as well because for the only time so far this season, Sonning fielded the tricky Simon Berry. Simon beat John Willcocks and the improving Jon Willis. This match featured a very good maximum from Andy Fakeerjan and it was his win in game 5 against Nigel Maltby which proved even more crucial than the doubles. Andy ran out a winner 13-15 12-10 11-3 12-14 11-7. By the way Curzon did win the doubles which helped them on their way to a 7 -3 win which got them some points on the board.

Sonning Common and Peppard 'B' are probably guilty of sacrificing their true playing standard by stepping up to division one again, having been relegated last year. In anticipation of just having one team in Div One Sonning also had an internal reshuffle which saw Jason Roberts move across to the new looking A team. But this has weakened the B team and they are suffering as a

result. Having said all that, Jeremy Willis has proved a bit of a revelation having won 38% of his matches so far. Talk about step up to the plate! Another plus factor has been Nigel Maltby's rejuvenation. I guess the most telling fixture to report is the match between Sonning 'A' and Sonning 'B'. Jeremy Willis scored a very well earned maximum defeating Keith, Jason and Malcolm plus Paul Jarvis played exceptionally well to defeat his old playing partner Jason Roberts. But those 4 wins were all that could be mustered;however, it has to be said Paul and Jeremy were extremely unlucky to lose the doubles 13-11 in the 5th. Have I mentioned how crucial the doubles can be?!!

Daniel Knott can hold his head high despite his team's position, with just under 40%, whilst Jack Hopkins and Lukas Dahmann have struggled to pick up points. Like all the other players that have been in similar difficulties, they will no doubt have improved since the start of the season, and as we all know it's a steep learning curve to becoming top table tennis players, which many of these youngsters have the potential to become.
