Key Facts from the RDTTA Secretary

- 1. Individual Handicap Competition This season's event will take place on Sunday 5th January 2014 at the Kingfisher Club. Entry forms were issued to Club Secretaries for distribution at the start of the season and they are also available on the website or from Nigel Maltby. Entries should be sent to Duncan Abbott by the closing date of Friday 27th December.
- 2. Reading Closed Championships Entry forms should be available shortly. The championships will be staged over two weekends at the Kingfisher club Sat/Sun 8th/9th Feb 2014: Senior & Veteran events and Sat/Sun 15/16 Feb 2014: Junior events. Please do try to support this worthwhile event. Entry is free, so do please try and enter. Andrew Parker and Eric Van Looy have agreed to run the events this season.
- **3. IMPACT Challenge Shield** This competition is by invitation only from teams competing in Divisions 1 or 2. The draw for the 1st Round has been made; matches are due to be played by Friday 29th November. The draw for the 1st Round (Quarter Finals) is:

Tie of the round is Tidmarsh 'A' v Kingfisher 'A'. Kingfisher 'D's youngsters may push OLOP 'A'. YMCA v Tidmarsh 'B' is a close one to call while the lone Division 2 entrants, Tidmarsh 'C', will be looking to upset the odds and beat OLOP 'B'.

Finally I hope everyone is enjoying their table tennis this year. As you will have noticed we had an exact number of 60 team entries this year which has meant that we have been able to go down to 5 divisions, each with a maximum 12 teams. This is 'good news' as it means everyone has a full quota of league matches. It has meant a number of teams (my own in Division 1 included) have been elevated to higher divisions. I know some may struggle this season but I think the vast majority will find life fairly comfortable in their new surroundings. The bad news is that team numbers have again continued a trend of slow decline.

Things may be different next season should we get more than 60 team entries. The RDTTA committee will need to decide what to do if and when that occurs.

Of course we must not forget all the other volunteers that dedicate their time to keeping our well oiled machine ticking over.

For those of you at the last AGM, Nigel Maltby stood down as Chairman without any volunteers for the post. At the AGM I was asked by a number of fellow committee members to take on the role.





The two semi finals featured Sam Liu against Josh Gallen; and Liam McTiernan against Daniel Moses.




Team Handicap Competition 2013-14


each. I get the feeling its

Jason and Keith played well to earn 2 and 1 respectively which means that yours truly needs to write out 100 times "I must do better" but I won't do it here as it could be a trifle boring. Incidentally,

the DFS has written to the Sonning 'A' captain to express his concern about the lack of games played. The Sonning 'A' captain has apologised to the DFS and given a full explanation for the postponements, which the DFS has accepted. In fact the DFS has nothing but good things to say about the Sonning 'A' captain who he thinks is a very nice chap.

Sonning 'B' are pointless after 4 matches and as mentioned earlier the dramatic improvement in Nigel Maltby's performances is the most notable thing to report. Nigel has beaten the Kingfisher trio of Lisa and Stuart Williams and Andrew Parker and his other results show a competitive edge which was not there last year. Sonning 'B' are

Promoted club **Curzon** 'A' have also found a comfortable spot at the bottom of the table. Some consolation can be gained from the fact that alphabetically, they are always going to be top of Division One! Well done for that boys!! But seriously, it's a little too early to tell how they will fare this year. Three 8 - 2 defeats to OLOP 'B', Kingfisher 'D' and YMCA suggests they may struggle a little. However, in Andy Fakeerjan they have a player who looks capable of gaining some good wins for them. The



five gamer against Keith Winter of YMCA looked like a tight win: 11-9 7-11 5-11 11-5 11-7. This was followed by a defeat at the hands of Peter Bradley 13-15 11-9 5-11 11-7 12-10 in the same match so I think we can say Andy got his moneys worth that evening!! Jon Willcocks and Jon Willis are two strong Division 2 players who could well find their feet in Division 1. Nevertheless, I suspect Curzon will get entangled in the relegation dog fight which will no doubt involve the teams that already feature at the wrong end of the current league table, early as it is in the season.

Reading YMCA have not had the best start to a season



they have ever had. One win from 4 outings is disappointing for such a talented team. Their win came against Curzon - an 8 - 2 victory which featured a sparkling maximum from Sir Peter of Bradley. His vast experience obviously came into play against Andy Fakeerjan when he ran out the winner 13-15 11-9 5-11 11-7 12-10. At 4 - 2 up against Tidmarsh, YM must have thought they were up for a famous victory but Tidmarsh 'A' came back to record a fine 6 - 4 win and by all accounts Duncan Groves overcame a string of nets and edges against him to defeat Keith Winter in game 10 to secure that extra point. YMCA were a solid mid table team last year and I expect them to continue in that vein this term.

Kingfisher 'C' also feature the same line-up as last year but already look stronger. They were unlucky against Tidmarsh 'B' where they also lost 6 - 4. Steve Murgatroyd recorded a great maximum against Andy Stephens, Anthony Baker and an in-form Sam Ricks. Despite also helping Niall McGrane to a good doubles win, defeat still beckoned because neither Niall nor Lisa Williams could muster another win or two which would have secured a point or two. Mind you, Lisa could not have come closer with a 12-14 4th game loss to Andy Stephens and another 4th game loss 13-15 to

Anthony Squirrel Baker. Murgs also had an easy looking maximum against Sonning 'B' when he only dropped one game all night. Similar to YMCA I expect to see Niall's team feature in mid table through the season. Equally, if Niall and Murgs were to both hit a purple patch on the same evening, watch out some of you higher teams.

And now for a little drive down the A340, just past The Greyhound pub in that sleepy little village they call Tidmarsh. I always enjoy a trip down there. Nice people – cup of tea at half time with chocolate biscuits - lovely. Old John Harland usually pops in to watch for a while and we discuss how the Prudential has gone downhill since we both left! This year we have the pleasure of two Tidmarsh teams – the 'B' team having been promoted last year. Surprisingly (to me anyway) both 'A' and 'B' teams reside 6th and 7th in the table currently. Having said that Sam Ricks has made a fantastic start to his season for Tidmarsh 'B', having won 7 out of 9 of his outings so far. This includes a startling win against the excellent Hari Gehlot with a score that reads 11-8 14-12 5-11 11-8. Sam's 2 losses were on the same evening against Kingfisher 'A' to Mark Banks and Steve Murgatroyd. Ever present Anthony Baker is picking up regular 1s and 2s as is Andy Stephens so maybe there won't be so much difference between

Tidmarsh 'B' and Tidmarsh 'A'? I can imagine there might be a side bet or two between these two teams to see who finishes higher?!! Having said that, any team containing a player in the class of Sander de Reimer is going to do well. Tidmarsh 'A' had a tight match against Kingfisher 'A' where they lost 6 - 4. Sanders' defeat to Hari 9-11 11-7 6-11 6-11 proved critical. Sander beat Tony

Reynolds and Stuart Williams and teamed up with lan Packford to take the doubles with a comfortable looking 11-5 11-8 11-4 win. Ian beat Stuart 11-7 11-4 11-6 and in hindsight it was probably the match between Peter Matthews and Tony Reynolds which sealed the deal for Kingfisher. Tony running out 8-11 11-5 8-11 11-7 11-5. But the closeness of this match suggests if Ian can back up Sander in the



big matches, they could cause a few upsets this season.

OLOP 'B' had a cracking match at home to Tidmarsh 'A'. A noble draw was the result with Daniel McTiernan featuring in two 5 game contests. A defeat by Sander 11-4 13-11 8-11 4-11 8-11 then a tight win against Peter Matthew's 11-4 11-9 8-11 8-11 9-11. This together with Gus Thomis's win in 3 over John Barclay and Danny Ricks' win against John also in 3. But the performance of the evening must have been Danny's' victory over Sander in three straight games which must go to show the progress Danny has made since last season. A fabulous win but no supper for Danny after his match against the Tidmarsh B' team. Not only did OLOP 'B' defeat Tidmarsh 'B' comfortably 8 - 2, but the match featured a father versus son encounter when dad Steve Ricks was treated to a 11-3 11-7 11-6 defeat at the hands of his son Danny. Knowing proud dad Steve, I'm sure he didn't mind too much. His lads are certainly doing him proud so far this year.

OLOP 'A' are down in 4th place in the table at the time of writing. They have unfortunately had postponements against both of the Sonning teams. Some might say that's as good as 4 points on the board but I beg to differ. I fancy my chances against Moses this year. If he plays left handed. Anyway, more to the point, one of OLOP 'A's wins early doors has come against Kingfisher 'A'. They also beat Kingfisher 'C' 10 - 0 and OLOP 'B' 7 - 3 but lets have a closer look at the Kingfisher 'A' game as I suspect



new season is once again upon us and with it comes a change in the league's format. Gone is Division 6 as the number of teams competing has now reduced to the landmark number of 60. Therefore this season's Division 5 is made up effectively of teams from last season's Division 6 plus some useful additions.

On first observing the make up of teams I quickly came to the conclusion that **Polish** 'C' would probably be a bit too strong for this

division. Captain Krys Szczygiel was an above average Div 5 player last season and has experience of playing Div 4. From experience I know Luca Bianchi to be a very useful player indeed, because although I did just beat him it was probably the toughest set I played in all season. Zdzislaw Jerzmanski and Ania Pytka were both unknown quantities although the former has settled in very well winning all his six sets including an impressive win over OLOP 'G's star player Nigel Antell.

Home wins have come against Sonning Sports 'B' (9 - 1) and Springfield 'D' (8 - 2) whilst on their travels they have accounted for OLOP 'G' (9 - 1), Tilehurst Meths 'D' (7 - 3) and Kingfisher 'K' (6 - 4). Individually Zdzislaw is unbeaten in two fixtures, Luca has won 11 out of 12 sets losing only to OLOP 'G's Nigel Antell whilst Krys has won 13 out of 15 sets losing quite surprisingly (given his

opponents' averages) to Kingfisher 'K's Gwynne Penny and Tilehurst Meths 'D's veteran Dave Jones. Ania has won 4 out of 12 sets including a brace against Sonning Sports 'B'.

I'm not sure how team rankings are worked out in Twyford but **Springfield 'E'** are the lowest of three in this division and they are clearly faring the best. Wins against

BBC Club (8 - 2), and Birch Copse 'B', Milestone 'D' and SC&P 'G' (all 6 - 4) have put them on the coat tails of the leaders. Their only hiccup to date has been a draw against club rivals Springfield 'C'.

Ashley Jones has won 14 of 15 sets losing only to the prolific Roy Hull of Birch Copse 'B'. Captain Colin Jones has been consistent winning two games in four of the five matches he has played in for a 60% average. Both Tom Berryman and newcomer Matthew Widdup have each

won 2 sets to date.

OLOP 'G' have picked up very well after a shock 1 - 9 trouncing by leaders Polish 'C' in the opening week. Victories since then have come against BBC Club and Birch Copse 'B' (both 8 - 2) and against SC&P 'G' and Milestone 'D' (both 7 - 3).

Nigel Antell achieved a near 90% average in Div

5 last season but could do nothing to stop Zdzislaw and Krys inflicting on him rare defeats on the way to a 9 - 1 win for Polish 'C'. Nigel has won all six of his sets since then. Indeed that opening defeat must have given captain and ex-Polish player Jan Polnik nightmares but Jan has turned things around since then, hitting form with 8 wins from his next 9 sets. Chris Bunn also played in that opening day mauling but 10 wins from 12 sets since then has no doubt boosted his confidence. New boy Rob Pelley has weighed in with 3 wins from 9 sets scoring a single in each match he's played in.

Springfield 'C' opened up with wins over SC&P 'G' and Birch Copse 'B' (both 6 - 4) before losing to BBC Club by the same margin. A 7 - 3 win over Tilehurst Meths 'D' and a draw against Springfield 'E' puts them in a respectable fourth place.

Chris Speight was expected to be a big fish in this pond

having performed well in his team's promotion from Div 5 last season, and he has not disappointed with 10 wins from 12 sets, losing only to Thomas Perkins and Phil Turton of SC&P 'G' in the opening fixture. Adam Sheen has also performed well with 8 wins from 9 sets losing only to club mate Ashley Jones. Alan Goold has played in all five fixtures winning on aver-

age 1 in 3, Jason Ren scored a brace in his only appearance against Springfield 'C' whilst captain Bob Sibun has failed to trouble the scorers in his two appearances to date.

It appeared as though the tide had turned with Wat winning the crucial points in game four,



years old, Daniel and Gus have been playing at the OLOP Club for seven years now and are the product of the excellent youth development set up at the Earley based Club.


