For the visit of Tidmarsh 'E', Meriel Low made her most recent appearance and beat John Harland in the 8th set to save the whitewash, Gill losing 5 of her 10 singles games by the minimum 2 points. In fact Kingfisher lost all 10 games that went to the wire ! Despite the 1 - 9 scoreline, it was a competitive septuagenarian (and over) match, and Tidmarsh had to work hard for their victory. The following week Kingfisher travelled to play Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' and Miguel Caballero was the third man, losing out to Anthony Reeve in the 10th Set, which determined who would end the night undefeated, Miguel having earlier beaten Arran Reeve 12-10 14-12 11-7 and David Pearson 7-11 11-0 10-12 11-8 11-8. Anthony's victory meant that Kingfisher lost the match 7 - 3, with Gill beating David Pearson 11-9 11-9 5-11 11-9 to earn an additional point. The next match, against Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', was Sandeep's debut, Gill getting Kingfisher off to a good start, when she defeated Jamie Li-Telford in straight sets, but the team then lost the next four sets, before Sandeep got the better of Russell Moores. Sandeep partnered Gill in the Doubles, losing in 5 games, and then had a close match against Jamie Li-Telford, eventually losing 9-11 11-8 12-14 11-13. Kingfisher could only muster two players against Springfield 'E' as their third player was delayed abroad and, despite their valiant efforts, Gill and Derek ended up losing 10 - 0, Paul Martin beating Gill 11-9 5-11 12-10 11-8, Julian Lancaster beating Derek 11-3 9-21 14-12 11-4 and Gill & Derek losing the Doubles 9-11 6-11 10-12. Sandeep made his second appearance, against Milestone 'C', picking up a win over Tony Hayden and coming close to beating John Evans, before losing 16-14 8-11 12-14 9-11. Gill & Sandeep won the Doubles 12-10 9-11 11-8 4-11 11-5, beating Carl Edlind & John, which meant the final result was 2 - 8. However, in their final match before Christmas, a late injury to their third player meant that they arrived at Tilehurst Methodists 'C' with only two players and proceeded to lose 10 - 0.

Miguel Caballero leads Kingfisher's averages, with 75%, followed by Meriel Low on 53%. If they are able to play together more often, Kingfisher would have more opportunities to avoid the wooden spoon. Gill has been ever present in the Doubles pairings, winning one and losing one with Sandeep Burande, which means they top the Kingfisher averages.

Milestone '**C**' are in 6th place, although having played one less match they could climb as high as 4th, which is where they were positioned when the last Newsletter was published. Since then, from their match results, they have won two, drawn one and lost two. They started off with 5 - 5 draw, away at Sonning Sports 'C', thanks to a John Evans hat trick, John ensuring his maximum when he defeated John Scott 11-9 15-13 6-11 11-9, and a double from Michal Pszczolka, Michal losing to John Scott 6-11 6-11 11-8 12-14, before winning the final set, against Michael Byrne, to ensure the

draw. The following week, Milestone welcomed Springfield 'D' who, due to illness, were only able to field two players, which meant that Milestone eventually ran out 9 - 1 winners, Ollie Bonser and Carl Edlind remaining undefeated, Carl beating Chris Speight 11-7 12-14 8-11 11-6 11-7, while Colin Phillips beat Dave Parkin but lost to Chris. For Week 9, Milestone travelled to leaders Our Lady of Peace 'E', who fielded a very strong team, with Carl and John both beating Jan Polnik, Carl winning 13-11 11-2 11-5 and John winning 9-11 11-9 11-7 13-11, Tony Hayden having no joy all night. In Week 11, despite Ollie Bonser recording another maximum, Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' won all the other games and left as 3 - 7 winners. Milestone then travelled to Kingfisher 'I', where John Evans and Carl Edlind both recorded trebles, while Tony Hayden was beaten by Sandeep Burande, thus ending the evening with two wins and a match score of 8 - 2.

Amongst a strong squad with a number of match winners, Ollie Bonser is currently on 100%, Michal Pszczolka is on 83%, Carl Edlind is on 80% and John Evans is on 66%. On the Doubles front, two new pairings have been tried, neither winning, while the one winner has been the existing pairing of Ollie Bonser & Carl Edlind, which now has two wins from two outings.

Top of the Division for five weeks, Our Lady of Peace 'E' have now dropped to second place, although they have a game in hand on the new leaders. They started this second session brightly, with a 7 - 3 victory over Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', Chris Bunn's 9-11 11-9 11-13 11-6 11-8 win over Steve Christelow and Mariusz Paluszkiewicz's 5-11 11-9 11-9 8-11 12-10 win over Toby Barter, proving to be pivotal, Chris ending with a treble, Anna Slobodskoy recording a double and Mariusz a single. For the next match, away at Springfield 'E', Ralph Philips replaced Mariusz and subsequently recorded a treble, Chris and Alona both narrowly losing to Marcello Caramma, Marcello beating Chris 12-10 11-9 10-12 11-8 and Alona 11-9 14-12 11-9. The following week, Jan Polnik returned from holiday, to replace Anna in the starting line-up, against Milestone 'C'. Another imperious display from Ralph, winning in straight sets for the third time, a hard fought maximum from Chris and a single for Jan Polnik, who defeated Tony Hayden, meant that OLOP won 8 - 2. Week 11 saw Chris, Jan and Andrew Adair travel to Tilehurst Methodists 'C', where the points were shared in a 5 - 5 draw, with Chris and Andrew beating both Andrew Stone and Steve Wood, Steve losing to Christ 16-14 11-13 7-11 6-11 and to Andrew 11-13 6-11 11-7 6-11, while Jan beat Andrew 9-11 11-7 11-6 12-10. This match saw OLOP lose their first Doubles, Roy Hull & Steve Wood beating Jan & Chris 14-16 11-5 11-8 13-11, although they still have a number of undefeated pairings. The following week, the same OLOP team also drew 5 - 5 with their other title rivals, Reading FC 'B'. Chris recorded a further double, beating Derek Anderson and Harry Edwards, but lost the final set, against Joe Bull, 11-5 11-6 7-11 7-11 9-11, while Jan and Andrew both recorded singles, Jan beating Joe 11-9 11-7 16-18 6-11 12-10 and Andrew defeating Harry, with Chris & Andrew winning the Doubles to secure the draw.

Ralph Philips is still their number 1 and is undefeated, but the Division is currently having some respite while he is taking his mock exams. He has only played in 4 matches but, having dropped two games in his first match, he has subsequently won 9 sets without dropping a single game. Although this team has lost their undefeated Doubles tag, which stretches back to the start of last season (and possibly beyond), OLOP currently have five other unbeaten partnerships.

When the last Newsletter was published, Reading FC 'B' were sitting in 3rd place and now, having played a further five matches, they are still in 3rd place and remain in contention for the title. For four of these matches they have fielded the same group of three players. Due to postponements, it was four weeks after their last match that Reading FC entertained second placed Tilehurst Methodists 'C'. Methodists took an early lead, before Derek Anderson beat Rob James, to pull one back, following which Methodists responded with a further two wins, before Derek beat Steve Wood. Tony Edwards & Derek then took on Roy Hull & Steve Wood, in the Doubles, losing 9-11 12-10 11-6 8-11 8-11 to be 2 - 5 down, in the match. However, Joe Bull beat Rob to pull one back and Derek then beat Roy 8-11 11-6 6-11 13-11 11-6, to complete his treble. However, Harry Edwards was unable to get the better of Steve, in the final set, and therefore the match finished 4 - 6. A few days later, Reading FC 'B' travelled to Sonning Sports 'C', where they secured a 7 - 3 win, Joe Bull and Harry Edwards both recording trebles, while Tony Edwards recorded his first win of the season, when he beat Stephen Edwards 9-11 12-10 11-7 11-9. This was followed by an emphatic 10 - 0 home win over Springfield 'D', with Joe Bull, Derek Anderson and Harry Edwards all recording trebles, Harry working hard for his wins, none more so than the 7-11 14-12 11-9 10-12 11-9 win over Tom Berryman, Tony Edwards & Derek also clinching the Doubles 13-11 11-8 11-9.

Reading FC then travelled to leaders Our Lady of Peace 'E', where a most competitive match ensued, with 6 sets going to 5 games each and Reading winning the last three sets to snatch a dramatic draw. The fightback started with Harry beating Jan Polnik 11-9 3-11 11-9 6-11 11-7, continued with Derek beating Andrew Adair 11-5 11-13 9-11 11-9 11-8 and was completed when Joe beat Chris Bunn 5-11 6-11 11-7 11-7 11-9, to draw the match and deny Chris a maximum. Their final match was at home, to Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', which was won 6 - 4, Derek and Joe both back to winning ways, each recording a treble.

Derek remains their number 1, but is closely trailed by Joe, with Harry in third place. The strength of this squad is demonstrated by the fact that even though they have only won three of the five matches played, one of their players has won the PoM award, each time. On the Doubles front, Reading have still only played three combinations, but their main pairing of Derek & Tony Edwards has only won one more match, Joe stepping up to partner Tony when Derek was unavailable, but with no better luck.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' started the second round of matches in 6th place and immediately faced their own Club, in the shape of their 'G' team. Gerry Bacon was undefeated, while Julian James and Mike Casserley both recorded doubles, which meant that the 'F' team not only won 7 - 3, but have bragging rights for the next few months. The following week, SC&P 'F' travelled to Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' where, despite Mike Casserley recording his third treble, they lost 6 - 4, Steve Knott beating Jamie Li-Telford 12-14 11-8 11-6 11-9 for his second single. Gerry, Julian and Mike were selected for the postponed game against Springfield 'E' and they came up trumps, Gerry and Julian both recording maximums, while Mike recorded a double, to help win the match 9 - 1. The same team travelled to Milestone 'C' where they won 7 - 3, despite Ollie Bonser recording a maximum, thanks to doubles from Gerry, Mike and Julian. Mike, Gerry and Derek Maltby were selected to face visitors Tilehurst Methodists 'C', losing 3 - 7 despite Mike Casserley recording a further treble, with Gerry having no luck,



losing all his sets in 4 games. For their 6th match, Julian, Gerry and Mike travelled to Reading FC 'B', where they each beat Harry Edwards but lost to Derek Anderson and Joe Bull, Mike & Julian picking up a further point by winning the Doubles.

Mike Casserley has been their stalwart, playing in every match so far and tops their rankings, closely followed by Julian James and Gerry Bacon. When called upon Steve Knott can usually be relied upon for a point, while Derek Maltby is still looking for his first singles win. SC&P 'F' are another team that fields a regular doubles pairing, in this case Mike & Derek. Although they have only won two of their most recent five matches, their 11-9 4-11 12-10 7-11 5-11 loss to Kennet Valley's Steve Christelow & Jamie Li-Telford could, on another day, have been a third win. In Derek's absence, Julian partnered Mike to a Doubles victory, over Reading FC 'B', which means that they currently have a 100% record.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' were in 9th place, after the first free week. They started with an "away" trip to their 'F' team, which was lost 7 - 3, their points courtesy of Arran Reeve's 10-12 12-10 11-9 8-11 11-9 win over Julian James, Simon Blake's win over Mike Casserley and Anthony Reeve's & Simon's Doubles win. For the first time this season, Anthony did not record a singles win, which is always a possibility when you play against club mates who know your game so well. However, Anthony was back with a vengeance recording a maximum in each of the next four matches, taking the PoM award each time, while dropping only 3 games. First up was a home match against Kingfisher 'I', which with Arran winning two, including an 11-9 10-12 11-6 11-9 victory over Gill Bennett as well as an 11-4 11-9 11-9 win against Derek Crombie, and David Pearson also beating Derek Crombie, along with the Doubles, meant that a 7 - 3 win was secured. The following week, Anthony, Arran and David hosted Tidmarsh 'E' and with only the Doubles and Arran's victory over Mike Bundy to add to Anthony's wins, the match was drawn 5 - 5. After the second "free" week, Anthony and David were the sole travellers to Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' where, despite a close call when David beat Russell Moores 11-9 12-10 11-8, they were undefeated and thus won 7 - 3. Springfield 'E' were the next visitors, when Anthony and David were once again a team of two. Thanks to a win for David, who beat Paul Martin, along with the Doubles and a treble from Anthony, a 5 - 5 draw was achieved.

Anthony Reeve is the undoubted number one, with 79%, while Arran Reeve, David Pearson, Simon Blake and Marko Madzar are all achieving low 30%s to low 40%s. With SC&P 'G' only able to field 2 players over recent weeks, they have taken steps and signed a new player, Jim Warren. On the Doubles front, they have recorded victories in each of their recent matches and leading the pack, with three wins is the new pairing of Anthony & David, while another new pairing of Anthony & Arran have one win.

Sonning Sports 'C' are another team who are sharing playing duties evenly throughout the squad and haven't fielded the same team in consecutive matches. They started this second tranche of matches at the foot of the table, with no wins under their belt. Although they are still awaiting their first win, they did secure a draw in their first match against Milestone 'C', with Michael Byrne and Phil Peat both defeating Colin Phillips, while John Scott not only beat Colin, but also defeated Michal Pszczolka 11-6 11-6 8-11 14-12 and then partnered Michael to a crucial 11-9 13-15 11-6 9-11 11-9 Doubles win, over John Evans and Michal. The following week, Michael, Jude O'Halloran and Mo Cole visited Tilehurst Methodists 'C' picking up 2 points, in an 8 - 2 loss, thanks to Jude's 7-11 4-11 12-10 12-10 11-9 win over Steve Wood and Mo's 11-6 12-10 2-11 1-11 12-10 win over Rob James. In Week 9, Sonning Sports 'C' faced another title contender, when Reading FC 'B' visited. Mo's place in the squad was taken by Stephen Edwards, who was unable to add to his earlier win, although he was close to beating namesake Tony Edwards, before eventually losing 11-9 10-12 7-11 9-11, while Michael and Jude both beat Tony and then combined to win the Doubles, ending the night with a 3 - 7 defeat. For the match against Springfield 'D', which was brought forward and played in the "free" week, Michael was rotated out and replaced in the team by Mo Cole. Stephen started the ball rolling, with a 13-11 11-8 10-12 11-5 win over Dave Parkin, which was followed by Jude's 21-19 11-1 11-13 8-11 11-6 win over Tom Berryman. Springfield won the next two sets, before Mo beat Dave Parkin to put Sonning Sports 3 -2 up. However, the next four sets were won by Springfield and although Jude beat Dave, in the final set, to record a double, the match was lost 6 - 4. In what turned out to be their final match before Christmas, due to their match with OLOP 'E' being postponed and their match with Springfield being played early, Michael Byrne, John Scott and Mo Cole travelled to Tidmarsh 'E'. However, since it was still November, there was no Christmas spirit on offer and Tidmarsh won 10 - 0, although the match was closer than the scoreline would indicate, with Mo losing 9-11 10-12 11-7 10-12 to Roger Stevens, while John took Roger to a 5th game.

Jude O'Halloran and John Scott have the best averages, with Phil Peat third on the list. However, Phil has not played since early November and their statistically best side have not played together, yet. Although they are bottom, going into the New Year, they are only one point behind Kingfisher 'I', having still to play OLOP, so the fight to avoid the wooden spoon is still on. On the Doubles front, three new pairings have been tried, with Michael & Jude taking the spoils against Reading FC 'B'. Michael & John have also played together again, this time winning to help secure the draw with Milestone. All three wins have been courtesy of a pairing which includes Michael, although he has lost a Doubles match, when paired with John.

Springfield 'D' were in 8th place when the last Newsletter was published and after playing a further 6 matches, with just the one win, have dropped to 10th. Their next match was against their clubmates who play for the 'E' team and, as expected, there were a number of close contests, with Maggie Kellermann-Thornton and Chris Speight both getting the better of Colin Jones, while Chris was also victorious against Marcello Caramma, winning 11-9 10-12 11-9 10-12 11-2. However, their third player, Tom Berryman, was unable to add to the wins, with the match ending in a 3 - 7 defeat. Dave Parkin and Chris had to face Milestone 'C' on their own, after their third player was taken ill, and it proved to be a mountain too high to climb, Springfield losing 9 - 1, with Chris recording his side's only win, when he beat Colin Phillips. Tilehurst Methodists 'C' were their next visitors, Alan Goold making a rare appearance and taking the scalp of Rob James 11-9 3-11 9-11 11-9 11-9 before Maggie earned their second point, defeating Steve Wood in the final set 11-4 9-11 7-11 11-4 11-9, with the match finishing 2 - 8. Springfield's match with Sonning Sports 'C' was brought forward and played in the free week, with Chris Speight recording his second treble and Tom Berryman his double, after defeating Stephen Edwards and Mo Cole, Chris and Tom also victorious in a crucial Doubles, to win the match 6 - 4. The following week, the same Springfield side faced Reading FC 'B', with Chris, Tom and Dave Parkin leaving empty handed after a 10 - 0 defeat, although, on another day, the result may have been closer, Harry's 7-11 14-12 11-9 10-12 11-9 win over Tom being a prime example. For their final match before the Christmas break, Springfield fielded the same team for the third consecutive match, this time against Tidmarsh 'E'. Chris managed to record one win, beating Steve Andrews 11-8 7-11 2-11 11-6 11-7, as did Tom, in defeating John Harland, resulting in an 8 - 2 defeat.

Chris Speight is top of the averages, on 48%, with Maggie Kellermann-Thornton just behind on 46%, followed by Tom Berryman on 37%. Both Chris and Dave Parkin have played in five of the latest six games, with Tom having played in four. On the Doubles front, two new pairings have been tried, without success, with the only win courtesy of Chris & Tom, who now have two wins from four outings.

Springfield 'E' started this second phase of games in 5th place, ahead of Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' on matches won but, after 2 wins and a draw, they have now dropped to 7th and are behind the curve in regard to my earlier prediction. Their first game, after the Newsletter was published, was against their compatriots in Springfield 'D', which they won 7 - 3, thanks to the Doubles, a single for Colin Jones when he defeated Tom Berryman 10-12 11-8 11-5 12-10, a double for Marcello Caramma, and a treble for Paul Martin, who defeated Chris Speight 11-6 3-11 10-12 11-6 12-10, in the final set, to determine who went home undefeated. The following week, the same Springfield team faced Our Lady of Peace 'E', who arrived with a strong squad comprising Ralph Philips, Chris Bunn and Alona Slobodskoy. Marcello beat Alona 11-9 14-12 11-9 and then Chris 12-10 11-9 10-12 11-8, but was unable to beat Ralph, with the final score 2 - 8 in favour of OLOP. The match against Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' was postponed for a week, with Julian Lancaster replacing Paul in the starting line-up. However, this didn't help and the Commoners were heading for a clean sweep until Marcello beat Mike Casserley 11-9 10-12 11-5 9-11 11-9, to deny Mike his treble and save the whitewash. Their next opponents were Kingfisher 'l', who were only able to field two players, and they consequently suffered the backlash, with Paul, Julian and Marcello all remaining undefeated, resulting in a 10 - 0 victory. Paul, Julian and Marcello were again selected for the next match, which was away at Sonning Common & Peppard 'G', who could only field two players and those three defaulted points proved to be vital, as the Commoners' Anthony Reeve was in fine form. recording his maximum with Marcello the only player to take him to five games, Marcello and Julian gaining the wins over David Pearson to guarantee a share of the points in the 5 - 5 draw, Julian winning 9-11 12-10 8-11 11-2 11-5 and Marcello 11-6 11-7 12-10. For their final match before Christmas, they entertained Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', but this time the situation was reversed, in that only Colin Jones and Marcello were fit to play, Paul having gone down with the flu. Having conceded three points, before the match started, Springfield started well, with Marcello beating Russell Moores and Colin beating Toby Barter 6-11 12-10 5-11 11-8 11-9. However, once Steve Christelow beat Marcello and Russell beat Colin Jones 5-11 11-7 11-4 6-11 12-10, Marcello's defeat of Tony Barter, to record his second win, was not enough, Steve & Toby's 10-12 12-10 11-7 11-9 Doubles win ensuring a 3 - 7 result.

Marcello Caramma leads the averages, for Springfield 'E', on 64%, with Paul Martin on 52%, Julian Lancaster on 36% and Colin Jones on 25%. With the team relying on just 4 people, they have signed a new player, Johnny Worrall, who should make his appearance in the New Year. With regard to the Doubles, no new pairings have been tried, but two wins have been recorded, one for Marcello & Paul and one for Julian & Paul. These results mean that their most successful Doubles pairing is Marcello & Paul, with two wins from three outings.

Tidmarsh 'E' were in 7th place, after 5 matches were played, and now, after a further five matches have been played, resulting in four wins and one draw, they have climbed to 4th. There have been no additions to this squad and playing duties have generally been shared around, although Mike Bundy has only had one further outing, since the last Newsletter was published. Tidmarsh started the second phase with a bang, beating Kingfisher 'I' 1 - 9, Meriel Low winning her final set, against John Harland, to deny Tidmarsh a clean sweep, with Roger Stevens and Steve Andrews both recording maximums. With their scheduled match against Reading FC 'B' not taking place, it was two weeks later that Tidmarsh travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'G', which ended in a 5 - 5 draw, Pete Sinclair defeating Arran Reeve 6-11 8-11 11-3 11-8 11-6 and David Pearson over 3 games, while Mike Bundy earned his single with an 12-10 5-11 5-11 15-13 11-8 win over David Pearson and John Harland chipped in with the other two wins, one an 11-7 11-9 9-11 11-8 victory over David and an equally impressive 11-9 11-8 4-11 15-17 13-11 victory over Arran.

Steve Andrews, Roger Stevens and Pete Sinclair recorded their team's best win so far when, in their next match, they defeated Sonning Sports 'C' 10-0, although Sonning Sports can consider themselves unlucky not to go home with at least one point, Roger in particular having to work hard for his two wins over John Scott and Mo Cole. The following week they travelled to Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' where, thanks to a Steve Andrews' treble and doubles for both John Harland and Pete Sinclair, they returned home as 2 - 8 winners. However, Steve had to work for his treble, defeating Jamie Li-Telford 11-5 9-11 12-10 13-11, Lewis Oke 11-7 11-8 13-11 and Toby Barter 8-11 9-11 11-8 11-9 11-7. In their final match before Christmas, Tidmarsh entertained Springfield 'D', Roger Stevens leading the way with a hard-fought treble, defeating Tom Berryman 12-10 7-11 10-12 11-9 11-8, Chris Speight 10-12 13-11 11-8 11-5 and Dave Parkin 13-11 11-6 11-3, while John and Steve both recorded two wins each, to help win the match 8 - 2.

The strength of this team is demonstrated by the fact that their whole team has a 70%+ average, with the exception of Mike Bundy, who has played fewer matches and has an average of 33%. Over the last five matches, Tidmarsh have won four of their Doubles, losing just once, the loss attributed to a new pairing of John Harland & Pete Sinclair, who subsequently improved their average by defeating Kennet Valley's Lewis Oke & Toby Barter, in a close affair, with the oldsters just edging out the younguns 13-11 11-9 12-10, a contest which is possibly a candidate for Doubles set of the season. In their very next match, Steve Andrews & John won out in another close affair, beating Springfield 'D's Chris Speight & Tom Berryman 11-9 11-13 3-11 11-5 12-10 a win which puts them top of their Doubles averages.

When the last Newsletter was published, **Tilehurst Methodists** '**C**' were in 2nd place and were the only undefeated team. Six matches later, the Methodists are still undefeated and sit at the top of the table, albeit having played one more match than the chasing pack.
