As it stands Kingfisher 'A' with their awesome squad have the title within their grasp and it would take a spectacular turn around in fortunes for Our Lady of Peace 'A' to overhaul them. Any slim chance they may have must start with a comprehensive win against their rivals in early January. With Hari on 22 wins from 22,

Martin 9 from 9 and Darren 19 from 20 and still with Ross Saxby and Dmitry to call on Kingfisher look pretty unbeatable. Sonning Common & Peppard 'A' have crept almost unnoticed into 3rd place after a slow start to the season. Just 2 points separate the next four teams. Kingfisher 'B' are joint 4th alongside Kingfisher 'D', who ended the first half of the season in style by whopping my SC&P 'B' team 8-2 – They will miss Jordan Huang in the 2nd half as he moves up to Manchester, but I believe they have a more than adequate replacement lined up.

Kingfisher 'C' and Sonning Common & Peppard 'B are joint 6th, and although both teams are far from safe from any relegation trouble. They will still have more than an eye over their shoulders in this very even division – particularly in mid table. Sonning Common & Peppard 'C' are in 8th, just 2 points ahead of Tidmarsh A, who have a game in hand against the bottom side Tilehurst Royal British Legion 'A', so Tidmarsh still have their fate very much in their own hands. Tilehurst however look adrift at the foot.and only a comprehensive win against Tidmarsh in that game in hand can bring

them back into contention to avoid the drop.

A brief summary of each week's action since the last newsletter:

Jamie Barlow got a maximum and Nigel Maltby managed a single for Sonning Common after he beat Adrian Cretu 11-7 11-5 3-11 11-8 in the final set of the night. Kingfisher 'B' moved up the table after an 8 -2 win against Tidmarsh 'A', Phil Mead and Alan Cummings with trebles while Mike Stanners beat Simon Barter 11-9 11-8 7-11 3-11 11-9.

Our Lady of Peace 'A' kept leaders Kingfisher 'A' just about in their sights after they were comprehensive 9 - 1 winners at Tilehurst RBL 'A', Sam Ricks and Steve Murgatroyd with maximums, while for the Tilehurst team Keith Winter had a notable 11-8 1-11



In Division 2, the eventual champions will undoubtedly be crowned from one of the current top three. However, all three teams have encountered unexpected setbacks, with Kingfisher 'E' upsetting the bookies on more than one occasion. At this moment, it looks as if Sonning Sports 'A' are on track to win the Division, although they are likely to be chased all the way by Reading FC 'A', with Our Lady of Peace 'B' the dark horses in this three-way race. At the other end of the table, I think Kingfisher 'G' will finish bottom, despite having a strong squad, with Tidmarsh 'C' in 10th place, since I expect Tilehurst Methodists 'A' to win sufficient points not to be drawn into this relegation battle.

Eric Van Looy (Tilehurst Methodists 'A') is still top of the Individual Averages on 91.67%, although he has only played in one match this Quarter, followed by Mike Childs (Reading FC 'A') on 88.89%, Roger Pritchard (Kingfisher 'F') on 83.33% and Nick Sears (Sonning Sports 'A') on 82.61%, these three having played in twice as many matches as Eric. Kingfisher 'E' have played a further 5 matches, winning twice, and have climbed one place, from 9th to 8th. All five members of the squad have played their part but Eyup Odemis was also asked to play up, on one occasion. In the first of these matches, against Our Lady of Peace 'B', Luca Bianchi made his first appearance, accompanied by Andrew Adair and Stephen Leggett. Although Stephen won twice, including a 13-11 7-11 7-11 11-6 11-2 victory over Louise Forster, OLOP took an early lead and were winning 4 - 2. After Andrew & Stephen lost the Doubles, to Dave Godfrey & Darek Kaminski, by the narrowest of margins 9-11 14-16 9-11, Kingfisher 'E' needed to win the three remaining sets to secure a draw. Sadly, although Luca defeated Louise, to secure a point, Andrew lost to Darek over 4 games, which meant that despite Stephen beating Dave 12-10 11-13 11-5 11-9, in the 10th set, the match ended in a 4 - 6 loss.

Club mates Kingfisher 'G' were the "visitors" for the next match and Luca demonstrated that he had blown off the rust by winning all three and with Abhay Gore winning once, beating Satej Jaywant in the opening set 10-12 11-4 8-11 11-8 14-12, as well as Stephen reprising his success of last week, by again winning twice, a 6 - 4 win was assured. In fact,

until he lost his last set to Neil Dellar 9-11 8-11 8-11, Stephen was on track for his own treble. Stephen was also picked for the away trip to play Sonning Common & Peppard 'D', extending his selection to 6 matches, Clive Gold made his first appearance for a month and Eyup played up from Division 3. However, they could each only win one set, eventually losing the match 3 - 7, although the effort exerted belies the result, with 46 games being played in total, six sets requiring 5 games to determine the winner. This competitiveness included the Doubles, with Danny Dockree & Jon Abbott denying Clive & Stephen a win, the games ending

beating second placed Sonning Sports 'A' 7 - 3, Stephen recording his second maximum of the Season, while Andrew and Clive both won twice, Clive within touching distance of his own treble, before losing his final set, against Paul Savage, 12-10 11-9 5-11 10-12 10-12.

At the end of the first Quarter, **Kingfisher 'F'** were in 7th place, having played 5 matches. They were due to play a further 5 matches in this Quarter but, due to a postponement, only 4 matches have been played. However, with two wins and one draw, the team have almost doubled their points total and, as a result, have climbed one place, to 6th. Their first match was an 8 - 2 win over Our Lady of Peace 'C'. Ajai Kamath recording his third maximum, although all eyes were on Rick Leachman who was playing for the first time in two years and his performance merited the PoM award. Even though he narrowly lost his opening set, to Arun Rajagopal, 11-4 10-12 9-11 12-10 7-11 and found himself two games down in his next set, he fought back to defeat Kaan Kitay 5-11 8-11 11-9 12-10 11-6 and ended the night with two wins, as did Roger Pritchard. Ajai & Roger also played together in the Doubles, for the second time, winning again.

Unfortunately Ajai & Roger lost their 100% record the following week, beaten 11-6 16-18 7-11 9-11 by Angus Jones & Mark Jones, although their individual performances were sufficient to ensure the team defeated Sonning Common & Peppard 'D' 6 - 4, their performances reversed from the previous week, in that Roger recorded his third maximum, while Ajai recorded two wins, with the 5-11 11-5 8-11 12-10 7-11 loss to Mark Jones denying him the opportunity of a treble. However, another point was required for the victory and this was thanks to Eapen John winning his opening set, against Angus Jones. Kingfisher 'F' were unable to make it three consecutive wins as they lost a close encounter

with Tilehurst Methodists 'A' 4 - 6 and at 2 - 5 down, after the Doubles, they fought back, with Ajai victorious in his final set to record a single, followed by Roger winning a close match-up 3 -2 to record a double, but the comeback was over as Eapen John was unable to emulate his success in winning his opening set, when he defeated Phil Jones 13-11 11-6 4-11 11-8, ending the evening with the one win.

A fortnight later, Kingfisher 'F' welcomed Tidmarsh 'B' who have been in 4th place for much of the current campaign. John Liddle made his third appearance, but was unable to break his duck, losing all three, although he did partner Roger to a Doubles win, on their first outing this Season, Roger also winning all three to record another maximum and secure the draw that had only been possible thanks to Eapen winning his final set. Their final match, against Reading FC 'A', was postponed because the venue was unavailable and has been rescheduled to be played the following week. Kingfisher 'G' were in 10th place at the start of this second Quarter, having played 6 matches, but with only three more matches played and one further match postponed, they now find themselves at the bottom of the table, equal on points with Tidmarsh 'C', having played the same number of matches, although they are still looking for their first win. They opened this Quarter's fixture list with their worst defeat to date, losing to Sonning Common & Peppard 'D' 1 - 9, Neil Dellar recording one win after victory in the opening set of the match. However, it was all downhill from there, with Hamid Mohseni and Anup Chopra both losing all three, although they both won games against Angus Jones. There were some close calls, with Neil losing his second set to Danny Dockree in the 5th game and his final set, to Jon Abbott, 11-9 3-11 9-11 9-11, while Hamid & Anup also had a battling debut in the Doubles, before losing 4-11 13-11 11-7 1-11 6-11.

Another away fixture, another loss, although a much closer call with club mates from Kingfisher 'E' just edging it 6 - 4. Satej Jaywant replaced Anup in the starting roster and although he wasn't able to record a singles win, his best chance being the opening set of the match, he partnered Neil to a debut win in the Doubles. Although Neil lost his opening set, he won his remaining two singles, with Hamid earning the team's other point in winning his final set, against Abhay Gore, 10-12 11-2 11-9 11-4. The following week, they suffered another narrow defeat, this time losing 4 - 6, at home to Tidmarsh 'C'. Satej got the team off to a great start and ended the evening with his second maximum, being pushed all the way in his final set, eventually defeating David Sheppard 13-15 12-10 9-11 11-5 11-9, as well as making a successful debut with Hamid, in the Doubles. Neither Anup nor Hamid were able to secure any wins, although it was not for lack of effort, with all

three of Hamid's singles going to 5 games. Their match against one of the title chasing teams, Sonning Sports 'A', was postponed and will now be rescheduled to be played next year.

Our Lady of Peace 'B' ended the last Quarter in 3rd place but, following a fine run of form, winning and drawing twice, they currently occupy top spot, albeit having played one more match than the two teams directly below them. In their first match this Quarter they beat Kingfisher 'E' 6 - 4, Darek Kaminski winning all three for the first time, his set against Stephen Leggett his toughest contest before he won 11-5 11-6 10-12 13-11, while Dave Godfrey won twice, as well as partnering Darek to a Doubles win, on their first outing this Season, narrowly beating Andrew Adair & Steve Leggett 11-9 16-14 11-9, which secured the points. Louise Forster was the third player, but was unable to find a win, although her first opponent needed 5 games to secure victory.

One week later, for an away trip to Tidmarsh 'C', Louise dropped out and Alistair Richardson took her place, winning one set when he beat David Sheppard 11-6 10-12 11-8 11-6. However, Dave and Darek both recorded trebles and also reprised their Doubles win, which meant that the match was won 8 - 2. A top of the table tussle, against Sonning Sports 'A', was next on the schedule and Dave was replaced in the roster by Chris West. During the evening 42 games were played, with the results pretty evenly split. Chris West and Darek each won twice and then partnered up, for the first time, narrowly losing 2 - 3. However, Alistair chipped in with another win, defeating Harry Brough 9-11 16-14 6-11 11-5 11-7, which meant that the match was drawn 5 - 5. Three weeks later, OLOP 'B' were up against their club mates from the 'C' team, but needed a substitute to make up the numbers, Jan Polnik playing up from Division 4. Sadly, Jan's style was too well known to his opponents and he was unable to record any wins, although he took Kaan Kitay to 5 games, eventually losing 9-11 3-11 12-10 11-1 8-11. However, Darek and Alistair both won twice and partnered up, for the second time, to win the Doubles, thus ensuring that the match was drawn 5 - 5.

Our Lady of Peace 'C' were in 5th place at the end of the first Quarter, having played 5 matches, and having played a further 5 matches, with two wins and one draw, they have dropped to 7th place, one point ahead of Kingfisher 'E' in 8th place. The first of the five matches was away to Kingfisher 'F' and with Patrick Daniels unable to repeat his efforts from two weeks earlier, the match was lost 2 - 8, the points being earned by Kaan Kitay, who took the scalp of Roger Pritchard 6-11 11-8 11-7 11-8, and Arun Rajagopal, who managed to overcome Rick Leachman 4-11 12-10 11-9 10-12 11-7, both players winning their opening sets.

One week later, Tilehurst Methodists 'A' were the visitors and after a close contest, OLOP won 6 - 4, thanks to Binit Bhaskar holding his nerve to beat Masoud Ghabachi in the 10th set, to record his double. Pradeep Desh won his first two sets, to record a double, but was denied his treble by Phil Jones who won 8-11 19-17 11-4 2-11 11-8, while substitute Simon Brookes recorded one win which, along with the Doubles, were all vital in securing victory. Pradeep Desh was left in charge for the next match, away to Tidmarsh 'B', and showed his potential as a future Team Captain, by persuading Parvin Baishkiyar and Morgan Sykes to play-up, after illness and holidays affected the rest of the squad. After the first 6 singles, Morgan had won twice while Pradeep and Parvin had both won once, meaning the team was guaranteed at least a draw after Morgan & Pradeep won the Doubles 11-7 11-3 10-**12 13**-11. However, Pradeep then won his final set, against Chris Webb, 6-11 11-8 11-7 6-11 11-7, to guarantee the victory, the match ending 6 - 4.

Two weeks later, Binit, Patrick and Pradeep welcomed Reading FC 'A', another of the Division's leaders. Pradeep again won twice, for the 6th consecutive match, but with Patrick losing all three and the Doubles being lost, the match ended in a 3 - 7 loss, after Binit defeated Wayne Alleyne in the 10th set 10-12 11-7 11-6 11-9, to earn his single. A week later, Binit, Pradeep and Kaan were travelling to face another top team, in the shape of club mates Our Lady of Peace 'B'. Although Binit & Pradeep lost the Doubles, losing to Darek Kaminski & Alistair Richardson 3-11 10-12 8-11, reducing their win percentage to 50%, honour was satisfied as the match was drawn 5 - 5, since Pradeep and Kaan both won twice, while Binit won once.

Reading FC 'A' were in 1st place, undefeated, after winning their first 6 matches but, after playing only three of their four scheduled matches they have fallen to 3rd place. However, like the team one point ahead, they have a match in hand so the number one spot is still within reach. They started this second Quarter with an 8 - 2 home win over Tidmarsh 'C', Mike Childs with another maximum while Wayne Alleyne and Jazz Dhillon both ended the evening with two wins apiece, each losing their opening set in the 5th game, to deny them the opportunity of a treble, Jazz the busier player, since all three of his singles needed 5 games to determine the winner. Mike & Wayne also returned to winning ways in the Doubles, having lost their 100% in their previous match.

The following week, Reading FC 'A' travelled to Sonning Sports 'A', for the big showdown between two of the front runners, Jazz stepping down and Tony Alleyne returning to the fray. However, Mike dropped points for only the third time, losing his second set against Nick Sears 11-9 7-11 11-1 9-11

7-11, and with Mike & Wayne losing the Doubles, coupled with Wayne only recording the one win, while Tony lost all three singles, it meant that they returned home having lost the match 3 - 7. Due to there only being 11 teams in this Division, it was almost three weeks before Reading FC 'A' played again, this time against Our Lady of Peace 'C', with Jazz returning to the line-up and Tony stepping down. Wayne recorded one win, Jazz two wins, Pradeep Desh denying Jazz his treble, Mike three wins and with Mike & Wayne also winning the Doubles, the match finished in a 7 - 3 victory. Their final match which was scheduled to be played on 8th December had to be postponed, due to a site audit. However, this match should be played shortly and the match report will appear in due course.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'D' were scheduled to play 5 matches this Quarter, but with their match against Tidmarsh 'C' being postponed, by Christmas and Covid, it is now anticipated this will be rescheduled for next January. The Commoners ended the first Quarter in 8th place, but after a very successful second Quarter they have more than doubled their points total, even though they have played one fewer match, and having climbed to 5th they are now only four points adrift of Tidmarsh 'B', who have played one match more. They started this run with a magnificent 9 - 1 win, at home to Kingfisher 'G', Jon Abbott and Danny Dockree both recording trebles while Angus Jones had to be content with a double after losing his opening set. However, Jon had a fight on his hands to secure his treble but, after losing the first game to Neil Dellar, went on to win 9-11 11-3 11-9 11-9. In the Doubles, Danny & Jon were pushed all the way, but eventually defeated Hamid Mohseni & Anup Chopra 11-4 11-13 7-11 11-1 11-6, maintaining their 100% record.

Jon made way for Mark Jones, for the away trip to play Kingfisher 'F' but the team got off to a bad start, losing the first three sets. Mark steadied the ship by winning a tense 5-game set, defeating Ajai Kamath 11-5 5-11 11-8 10-12 11-7, and after winning the Doubles, with Angus, the team was trailing 3 - 4. Although Angus was unable to find that elusive win, losing his final set 8-11 11-8 12-14 11-13, Mark won his final set meaning that a draw was possible, if Danny won the 10th set. Sadly, it was not to be and Danny was unable to add to his earlier win, meaning that the match ended in a 4 - 6 loss. Mark and Jon again swapped places, for the visit of Kingfisher 'E' and this strategy worked, with the team winning 7 - 3. Danny led the way, winning all three, although he needed 5 games to win the 1st and 10th sets. Jon guaranteed at least a draw by winning his final set, thus securing his double, and Angus won his final set to record a single, thus ensuring the team's victory. Mark returned, with Angus dropping out, for the visit to Tilehurst Methodists 'A'. Danny was again the star player, winning all three to record his

third maximum in four matches and again partnering Jon to their third win this Quarter, cementing second place in the Doubles Averages, with 5 wins from 5. Jon also overcame Jes Eassom, in the opening set, to record one win and Mark also won once, beating Masoud Ghabachi, meaning that they won the match 6 - 4.

Sonning Sports 'A' were also scheduled to play 5 matches in this Quarter, but their match with Kingfisher 'G' has now been rescheduled for 6th January. Despite only playing 4 matches, Sonning Sports have retained their 2nd place and although the team at the top has changed over this Quarter, Sonning Sports has played one match less and is therefore still in the driving seat to win the Division. The first of these 4 matches was an away trip to Tidmarsh 'B', which resulted in a 7 - 3 win, Nick Sears recording a treble, Paul Savage a double and Keith Machin a single, defeating Dale Ballard 11-6 11-6 7-11 11-9. Paul's loss included two high-scoring games, Mike Aistrop eventually winning 11-5 3-11 20-18 17-19 11-7.

The following week, all the players returned the same results as in their previous match, which meant that Nick recorded his 6th maximum, Paul recorded his 5th double and Bob Woodmansee recorded his 3rd single. Impressive in a normal week, but this match was against fellow title chasers Reading FC 'A' and in also winning the Doubles, to retain their undefeated status, the 7 - 3 win allowed them to replace Reading FC 'A' at the top of the table. One week later, Sonning Sports 'A' played away at Our Lady of Peace 'B', another title rival. Harry Brough was drafted in from Division 4 and won his final set, beating Darek Kaminski 11-8 5-11 13-11 9-11 11-6, a crucial step in securing a 5 - 5 draw, which was achieved after the team fought back from 1 - 4 down, with Nick recording one win, Paul two wins and continuing their impressive Doubles run.

Due to the postponement, it was three weeks later when Sonning Sports 'A' travelled to play Kingfisher 'E', who upset the apple cart by winning 7 - 3, opening up the title race once again. This was the first match where apparent talisman Nick wasn't selected to play, which also meant that a new Doubles partnership was on display for the first time. Regardless, Paul continued his record of winning at least two singles in every match, by recording a further double, and he also partnered Bob to a Doubles win.

Tidmarsh 'B' were in 4th place, after their first 6 matches, and having played another 4 matches in this Quarter, winning once and drawing once, they are still in 4th. The squad of 5 remains the same, with Mike Aistrop and François Durand making two further appearances, Dale Ballard and Barry Carter



being selected three more times, Chris Webb playing in one match, meaning that Ray Webb has also been needed to play up, on one further occasion. This Quarter started with a 3 - 7 home defeat by Sonning Sports 'A', Mike on target for a maximum before losing his final set to Nick Sears 5-11 11-13 9-11, Dale having no success all evening, losing the final game in each set 9-11, and Barry winning once.

Tidmarsh 'B' had no match scheduled the following week, so it was a fortnight later when they welcomed visitors Our Lady of Peace 'C', who subsequently left with a 6 - 4 win, despite François recording his second maximum of the Season, with Mike securing the other point in winning his final set, while Chris is still working hard to record his first win. This match saw Chris partner with François for the first time, in the Doubles. A fortnight later, Dale, Barry and substitute Ray Webb travelled to play Kingfisher 'F' and after 39 games were played, the result was a 5 - 5 draw. Dale and Barry both won twice, Barry being denied his treble when he lost his final set to Roger Pritchard 8-11 11-8 9-11 11-6 9-11, while Ray's single also played its part in securing the draw.

The final match of this Quarter saw Tidmarsh 'B' select a very strong team, for the visit of Tilehurst Methodists 'A' and a very successful strategy it proved to be, with Dale, Barry and François all undefeated on the night. This dominant performance included the Doubles, with Barry & Dale recording their third win together to ensure the match ended 10 - 0, the team dropping only four games all evening and winning each of the 9 games that were decided by the minimum two points allowed.

Tidmarsh 'C' were scheduled to play 5 matches this Quarter, but with one Christmas postponement, have ended up playing the same number of matches as Kingfisher 'G', swapping places with Kingfisher 'G', by dint of a better win rate. In fact, having lost all five matches in the 1st Quarter, they continued this losing streak in their next two matches, albeit against table toppers Reading FC 'A' and Our Lady of Peace 'B', before turning it around with wins against Kingfisher 'G' and 'E', the two teams directly above them at the start of this Quarter. No further signings having been made, the squad still comprises Simon Craig, Richard Hudson, Captain Dave Sheppard and Ian Wu, Ian still the only team member to record a maximum. Simon, Richard and lan travelled to Reading FC 'A' where despite a close contest, with 39 games played, only Simon and lan, with one win apiece had anything to show for their efforts, the match ending in a 2 - 8 loss. And by close, I mean close, since Ian narrowly defeated Jazz Dhillon 9-11 9-11 11-9 12-10 11-8 in what was surely one of the closest matches this Season, while Simon followed up lan's win with his own comeback, beating Wayne Alleyne 11-9 2-11 6-11 11-9 11-9. However, it was all downhill from here, with Reading FC winning the remaining 7 sets.

It was no better the following week, when visitors OLOP 'B' won by the same score line, in a possibly more one-sided contest, since only 35 games were played. In some respects, the players could have saved themselves a lot of effort, since every set was won by the person who won the first game. David replaced Simon, in the line-up, but was unable to record a win, the two points being courtesy of lan and Richard, who both defeated Alistair Richardson. lan almost made it two wins, but in a close contest lost to Dave Godfrey 5-11 4-11 11-9 11-9 9-11. David & Richard made their debut as a Doubles pair, but lost in straight sets. On 15th November, Tidmarsh 'C' travelled to Kingfisher, to play their 'G' team, Simon, Richard and David all losing to Sate Jaywant but, after winning all their other singles, they eventually won the match 6 - 4, which was their first success this Season. However, David had a close contest with Satej, in the final set, narrowly missing out on his first maximum, after losing 15-13 10-12 11-9 5-11 9-11, David & Richard reprised their Doubles pairing but again lost in straight sets, being beaten by Hamid Mohseni & Satej 10-12 3-11 13-15.

Two weeks later, Kingfisher 'E' were their next visitors, when they went one better, winning 7 - 3, lan recording his second treble, fighting back from two games down, to win the opening set, against Abhay Gore, 9-11 10-12 11-5 11-5 11-8. Simon reprised his two wins from the previous match, the 11-8 9-11 10-12 5-11 loss to Andrew Adair, ending his hopes of a maximum, while David recorded a further win, in beating Abhay, as well as partnering lan to the team's first Doubles success. This Quarter should have ended with an away trip to Sonning Common & Peppard 'D' but, with the venue being unavailable on the requested date, the match was initially postponed until the 15th December. However, with the increase in Covid cases, due to the greater transmissibility of Omicron, the match has now been postponed until the New Year.

Having played 6 matches in the first Quarter, **Tilehurst Methodists** '**A**' have only played 4 more matches and, with just one more win to their name, have dropped from 6th place to 9th. Their star man is still Eric Van Looy, but he has stretched his resources and possibly his wife's patience by playing in three Leagues, as well as fighting to keep his standing in the virtual table tennis world ! Jes Eassom continues to be the backbone of the team, missing just one match, but this Quarter has been matched in appearances by both Masoud Ghabachi and Phil Jones, with Bill Stamatiou appearing twice and Eric just once. After their designated "week off", Jes, Masoud and Phil travelled to Our Lady of

Masoud also had a close match with Simon, winning the opening game but eventually losing 11-5 7-11 10-12 10-12. Phil fought hard for his maximum, for which he earned his first PoM, beating Simon in his opening set, then defeating Binit Bhaskar 11-7 9-11 5-11 11-7 11-6 before winning his final set, against Pradeep Desh, 8-11 19-17 11-14 2-11 11-8.

Eric and Bill returned for the next match, a visit from Kingfisher 'F', replacing Jes and Masoud in the roster, but even though Phil was unable to repeat his success of the previous week, Eric won all three of his sets, Bill won twice and together they recorded their second Doubles success, which was enough to win the match 6 - 4. Ajai Kamath undoubtedly pushed Eric the most, with three close games before Eric sussed his style and won 11-9 10-12 11-9 11-4. However, Bill was the slightly busier player, dispatching Ajai over 3 games, then Eapen John over 4 games (9-11 11-6 11-8 11-9) before losing to Roger Pritchard in 5 games, thus missing out on his first maximum. Unfortunately this was the only win this Quarter and Jes, Masoud and Phil were on the wrong end of another 4 - 6 score line, losing at home to Sonning Common & Peppard 'D', Phil almost reprising his success from two weeks earlier, while Jes and Masoud each won once, Jes defeating Mark Jones 11-7 11-7 11-7 in the 10th set, while Masoud came out on top, in his match-up with Jon Abbott, winning 12-10 13-11 9-11 4-11 11-7. In an was tried, but Masoud & Phil were unable to overcome Jon Abbott & Danny Dockree, although their 10-12 8-11 7-11 loss surely merits a further experiment. Phil started his match with a narrow win over Mark Jones, 5-11 11-5 10-12 11-8 18-16, but lost his final set, against Danny, which determined who went home undefeated.

For the last match of this Quarter, Jes, Masoud and Bill travelled to Tidmarsh 'B', where they were unfortunate to meet a side with a point to prove. Masoud lost his sets without winning a game, although the 3rd game in two of these sets was won by the minimum 2 points required. OLOP 'D' have lost three of their last four matches with the scores in all four matches being close. Those matches have yielded mixed results with two wins, two defeats and a draw, although in the defeat against OLOP 'E` they were only able to field two players.However, they are more than doing enough to show that they should end up in a very comfortable mid-table position. Dave Edwards and Ray Webb have had a good run of results and are averaging in the 70's and 60's and Terry Hardie has picked up at least one win every time he has played. Springfield have only played three times recently partly because they had some issues with their hall availability which it looks like they have been able to resolve. In those three matches they suffered 7 - 3 defeats to Pangbourne WMC and Tidmarsh 'D' but they did manage to beat Kingfisher 'H' by the same scoreline. With six players in their squad it is not easy to predict how they will do in the rest of the season as, with three players winning regularly and three struggling a bit, team selection could turn out to be crucial. Skipper Jason King has their highest average closely followed by Rob Wilkie and if they can field their best team for some of the crucial matches they could just avoid relegation

Prediction –10th

Best Recent Performance – Rob Wilkie with two great wins in five against Pangbourne WMC including recovering from two down to beat Leroy Wilson in five.

OLOP 'E` are another team who have only played three times recently but in the matches played they have had two good wins plus a heavy defeat against the leaders. So they find themselves in the bottom two but with a match in hand and it looks like it will be a close contest between them and Springfield to avoid the second relegation spot. Parvin Baishkiyar has been showing some good form and is now averaging 71% and they probably need him to play in most of the remaining fixtures if they are going to avoid the bottom two.
