




Team Handicap Competition 2018-19

27 teams will be competing, two fewer than last season. The biggest change has seen Sonning Common and Peppard drop from six sides down to two, but in the process they still include over 90% of their registered players in teams of 15 and 16, making team selection challenging. Our Lady of Peace have gone the other way and disbanded last season's victorious 11 player team for three smaller ones. Abhay Gore, Pradeep Desh







The draw for this season's competition was made by Abhay Gore and Pradeep Desh, members of the current holders, Our Lady of Peace 'D'. 16 teams entered, split nine / seven in favour of division three. Having gained promotion to league Division Two, OLOP will unfortunately be unable to defend the trophy but this bodes well for yet another keenly contested competition.

As the first week started, having yet to lose a set in the league, Kingfisher 'G' started as favourites, although I expect them to be pushed hard by Reading FC 'A'. Exactly sixteen teams have entered this season, so the competition will be a straight knock-out and there will be no re-entering of teams with 'best' losing result .

This week saw the first rounds of both team competitions.

The match of the round in the Lower Divisions knock out brought the 2016-17 finalists back together, and it was Reading FC 'A' who triumphed this time. Tidmarsh 'D' were unable to recover from a 4 - 0 deficit, having lost three of those opening sets to a third game decider.

Elsewhere, pre-competition favourites Kingfisher 'G' were ruthless in their 9 - 0 drubbing of Springfield 'E', where only three sets required a deciding game. Sonning Common and Peppard 'E' moved up a gear to take the final six sets in an 8 - 1 win at Kingfisher 'I', Miguel Caballero / Meriel Low took the consolation set for Kingfisher.

In an almost identical match Springfield 'B' also took the final six sets in their 8 - 1 win at Milestone 'C'. This time Michal Pszczolka / John Evans won the consolation set. Springfield 'D' also triumphed 8 - 1 but in a much tighter match against Reading FC 'B'. Here the first four sets all required a deciding game and all went to Springfield, three by a slim 11 - 9 score-line.

up to win the doubles with David. They then drew for the third time in their match with O.L.O.P 'D'. Nils and David both won two each and they also won the doubles.



their 'H' team. The following week, Kingfisher were narrowly beaten 4 - 6, by Springfield 'D', despite Meriel recording a treble, the match starting with Gill Bennett losing to Tom Berryman in a nail biting 25-23 12-14 9-11 8-11 which, even at this early stage, may well have included the highest scoring game of the season. Week 4 saw



Kingfisher travel to Our Lady of Peace 'E', where they lost 7 - 3, Miguel being denied the opportunity of a consecutive treble after losing to Chris Bunn, in his first set of the evening. with Gill Bennett defeating Mariusz Paluszkiewicz in the first set of the match, to help Kingfisher climb to 7th place. In the following match, against Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', with the score tied at 4 - 4, Gill had to concede her final set, due to illness, meaning that the final result was in the balance, with both Miguel and opponent Mike Casserley undefeated. However, Miguel was unable to beat Mike and Kingfisher therefore lost the match 4 - 6, dropping back down to 9th place, their other wins courtesy of singles from Gill and Meriel, who both beat Steve Knott.

consistently chipping in with singles, Derek Crombie also getting off the mark, with his victory over Tony Edwards. Their one match win coincides with a Doubles victory, although this season, every set won puts points on the board.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Kingfisher have tried three combinations, with two pairings averaging 50%. Meriel has played in both wins and in the recent match with Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', Meriel & Miguel lost in a closely contested 9-11 9-11 11-5 13-15, against Derek Maltby & Mike Casserley.

Milestone '**C**' have retained the core of their team from last season, which means that Tony Hayden, John Evans, Carl Edlind and Colin Phillips are still around, and although they have lost Maksym Schipka to Kingfisher, they have inherited Michal Pszczolka following their merger with the Saiyan Brothers and Ollie Bonser from their 'B' team. Milestone got off to a great start, beating Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' 10 - 0, Carl, Ollie and John leading Milestone to victory. Week 2 saw Springfield 'E' visiting Milestone, Springfield winning 6 - 4, and although Carl beat Colin Jones in the final set, to record his treble and deny Colin his maximum, it was not enough to avoid defeat, Tony's win over Julian Lancaster earning Milestone another point. The following week, Milestone travelled to Tidmarsh 'E' leaving as 6 - 4 winners, thanks to John's maximum, John losing only one game all evening, and Carl's double, John & Carl also combining to win the Doubles. Next up was the visit to Tilehurst Methodists 'C' which Milestone lost 7 - 3, Tony, Colin and John each beating Andrew Stone, to win one apiece. The following week Milestone welcomed Reading FC 'B' and, after a pulsating contest, Michal and Joe Bull, who had each won both of their previous sets, met in the final set to determine the outcome of the match. Michal won 12-10 11-8 11-9 to record a maximum in his first outing, in the process helping to win the match 6 - 4, Carl assisting with a double, as well as partnering Michal to a Doubles win. John was the other participant in the match, his closest set being the 9-11 11-9 11-9 8-11 8-11 defeat by Harry Edwards.

After topping the table in the first week, thanks to the Division's only 10 - 0 win, so far, Milestone's fortunes have fluctuated and they are currently in 4th place. However, they are well situated for the task ahead, with every player in their team winning at least one set, with four players having achieved maximums and both Ollie and Michal on 100%, having each played in only one match. I would expect to see them both play many more matches and, if so, Milestone 'C' are my wildcard to win the Division.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, five different pairings have been tried, one per match, with the results going the same way as the match, which means that the last two wins were crucial in winning both matches 6 - 4. Carl has played with four different partners and he has been involved in all three wins.

Our Lady of Peace 'E' are another team that has retained most of their players from last season, with Jan Polnik again teaming up with Mariusz Paluszkiewicz, Chris Bunn and Alona Slobodskoy, Andrew Adair rejoining his ex-teammates after a year playing in a higher division, with Ralph Philips joining as a replacement for Graham Stark, who has been promoted to their 'D' team. Our Lady of Peace won their first game, against Springfield 'D' 9 - 1, Chris and Jan recording trebles, with Andrew only able to record two wins, after losing 10-12 11-7 8-11 7-11 to Alan Goold. Our Lady of Peace then travelled to Tidmarsh 'E', where they lost 6 - 4, with Mariusz beating Steve Andrews 11-5 8-11 8-11 11-9 13-11, Jan beating both Steve and Roger Stevens to record a double and then partnering Andrew to a Doubles victory, beating John Harland and Steve Andrews 13-15 13-11 12-10 11-6. The following week they were back in form, beating Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' 9 - 1, thanks to a treble from Ralph, on his senior debut, doubles from both Andrew and Chris, the Doubles and a conceded set. However, the sets were much tighter than the match score would indicate, with 40 games being played, 9 being won by the minimum two



points. Week 4 saw Our Lady of Peace beating visitors Kingfisher 'I' 7 - 3, Chris recording a maximum, Alona a double, Mariusz a single, along with Jan & Chris winning the Doubles. The following week, Our Lady of Peace travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'G', winning 9 - 1, Ralph recording his second maximum, Alona recording her first maximum and Jan chipping in with another double, as well as partnering Ralph to another Doubles win.

Although they dropped to 5th place, after losing to Tidmarsh 'C', Our Lady of Peace are usually to be found in the top three and are currently in 1st place. The core of this team have been together for a number of years and Ralph Philips looks to be a brilliant replacement for Graham. Ralph, along with Chris Bunn, is one of five Division 4 players still on 100%, and since both Jan Polnik and Alona Slobodskoy have also recorded trebles, Andrew Adair has recorded multiple doubles and Mariusz Paluszkiewicz has recorded multiple singles, I believe that this is the strongest squad and is therefore my tip for Champions.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Our Lady of Peace have continued on from last season and are yet to lose a Doubles match, although Andrew & Jan were pushed close by John Harland & Steve Andrews, before winning 13-15 13-11 12-10 11-6. Altogether, four pairings have been tried, with Jan & Ralph playing together twice, which means they are currently Our Lady of Peace 'E's most successful combination.

Reading FC 'B's team comprises Derek Anderson, Harry Edwards, Mark Edwards, Tony Edwards and Keith Greene, from last season's 'B' team, bolstered by the inclusion of Joe Bull, who played for their 'A' team, last season. For their first match, Reading FC had an away day to Kingfisher 'l', winning 7 - 3, thanks to maximums from Harry and Derek, with Tony losing out to Derek Crombie 13-15 11-6 6-11 9-11. The following week, Reading FC defeated visitors Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' 6 - 4, Joe Bull recording a maximum on his first outing, Harry being denied his own maximum when he lost the final set, to Anthony Reeve, 10-12 5-11 11-6 12-10 10-12, with Tony again ending the evening with nothing to show for his efforts, his best chance possibly being the 9-11 8-11 9-11 defeat by Simon Blake. In Week 3, Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' could only field two players, although they went down fighting, eventually losing 1 - 9, Derek beating Russ Moores 12-10 14-12 11-3 and Steve Christelow over 5 games, Joe also beating Steve 9-11 8-11 11-4 14-12 12-10 to remain unbeaten on the night, with Harry securing another point by beating Russ. The following week, Springfield 'E' were the unlucky visitors as Reading remained in the zone and again won 9 - 1, Joe winning PoM for his maximum, Derek being denied his maximum when he lost to Paul Martin in his final set and Harry overcoming all his opponents, starting with his 11-8 11-9 11-9 victory over Paul Martin, followed by an 11-13 11-9 14-12 11-4 win over Colin Jones and finishing with a 10-12 11-9 4-11 12-10 13-11 win over Julian Lancaster. In Week 5, Reading FC travelled to Milestone 'C' and had their first upset, losing 4 - 6, as Michal Pszczolka beat Harry, Derek and Joe on his way to winning his first PoM, Harry and Joe each earning a single by beating John Evans, Harry just coming out on top in a pulsating 11-9 9-11 9-11 11-8 11-8 encounter, while Derek recorded a double by also beating Carl Edlind.

Tony Edwards is still to get off the mark, having played twice, but Derek Anderson, Joe Bull and Harry Edwards have all recorded multiple maximums, earning them their current 3rd place. Keith Greene and Mark Edwards are yet to make an appearance although their stats from last season indicate how strong a squad this is and I fully expect this team to finish in the top four.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, three pairings have been tried, with Derek & Tony being the best pairing, until last week's defeat by Carl Edlind & Michal Pszczolka, which has dropped them down the averages, meaning that the Joe & Tony and Joe & Harry pairings are now vying for top spot, both pairs being undefeated from one match played.

Sonning Common & Peppard 'F's team comprises the players who played last season as the 'G' team, with the exception of Marko Madzar, who was promoted mid-season. This means that this season's returning players are Derek Maltby, Mike Casserley, Gerry Bacon, Steve Knott and Julian James. SC&P 'F' started in fine style, with a 9 - 1 home win over Sonning Sports 'C', Mike, Gerry and Julian all recording trebles and only the Doubles being lost. The following week, SC&P 'F' travelled to Springfield 'D' where they drew 5 - 5 which, so far, is the only match where the points have been equally shared. Mike was the star, for SC&P 'F', winning the final set to earn his team the draw and to record his second maximum, abetted by Steve and Julian each winning one set. After such a good start, Week 3 was a tad disappointing as visitors Our Lady of Peace 'E' won 9 - 1, Gerry winning the final set, against Andrew Adair, to avoid the whitewash. However, it wasn't plain sailing for OLOP, since 37 games were played, over 9 sets, with 9 games being won by just two points, 8 of these in OLOP's favour. A postponed match meant that Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' had no opportunity to avenge this defeat until Week 5, when they beat Kingfisher 'I' 6 - 4, Derek & Mike beating Meriel Low & Miguel Caballero in the Doubles 11-9 11-9 5-11 15-13 to help ensure the win, Mike back to winning ways with his third maximum and Gerry recording the one win, plus a walkover when Gill Bennett was unable to continue. The postponed match, against Tidmarsh 'E', was rearranged for Week 6 when Derek made his first appearance and afterwards mentioned that he first played against John Harland, at Chiltern Edge School, some 50 years ago, though I'm not sure who won that first encounter! However, this match was lost 3 - 7, with Mike recording two wins and Mike & Derek combining to win the Doubles.

Gerry Bacon, Mike Casserley and Julian James have all recorded trebles, Mike multiple times, with Steve Knott having won once and Derek Maltby still to get off the mark. Due to the strength of their squad, Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' are currently in 6th place and I fully expect that they will be able to continue this form and finish the season in a similar position.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Sonning Common & Peppard 'F' have only fielded two pairings, resulting in two wins for Derek & Mike after 4 outings, Steve & Julian losing the one set they have played together.

This season, Sonning Common & Peppard have entered two teams in Division 4, so there is likely to be an extra touch of frisson in the mix, especially as both sides appeared to be unsure as to who was playing in the 'G' team! However, the official records show that Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' comprises Anthony Reeve (who appeared briefly for their 'E' team last season), Arran Reeve (who is stepping up from the Youth Division), Marko Madzar (who played last season for the 'E', 'F' and 'G' teams!), David Pearson (who took a break last season, but had previously played for the BBC Club) and Simon Blake (who played for last season's 'F' team). In their first match, Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' entertained visitors Tilehurst Methodists 'C', but lost 3 - 7, Anthony being denied a treble after losing to Rob James 11-2 11-8 7-11 5-11 6-11 and Marko picking up a single in beating Andrew Stone 10-12 11-9 11-7 11-5. The following week, SC&P 'G' travelled to Reading FC 'B', narrowly losing 6 - 4, Anthony again being denied a maximum after losing to Joe Bull 4-11 8-11 11-9 12-10 7-11, Simon picking up a single in beating Tony Edwards 11-9 11-8 11-9, with David also beating Tony, to earn his team a further point. Sonning Sports 'C' were the visitors in Week 3, SC&P 'G' winning

7 - 3, Anthony losing his first singles game 10-12, but then going on to win 9 games on the trot, in the process earning himself a treble, with Arran and Simon both recording doubles. The following week, SC&P 'G' visited Springfield 'D' again, winning 7 - 3 with Marko turning up the heat for his first maximum, aided by a double from David, who was denied his own treble when he lost to Maggie Kellermann-Thornton 11-8 8-11 5-11 11-7 7-11, and a single from Arran, who beat Alan Goold 11-5 16-14 7-11 8-11 11-6. However, in Week 5 Our Lady of Peace 'E' were the visitors and, despite a number of close games, Simon's 11-5 12-10 9-11 10-12 8-11 loss to Jan Polnik being one example, OLOP left as 9 - 1 winners, David beating Jan 4-11 8-11 11-6 11-7 11-8 to help his team avoid the whitewash.

SC&P 'G' are currently in 9th place, with Anthony Reeve and Marko Madzar the two players to record both a maximum and a PoM award. However, David Pearson, Arran Reeve and Simon Blake are also contributing with doubles and singles, and I fully expect this team to climb the table, as the season progresses.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' have tried four different pairings, with Marko & David being their sole winners. However, although they have lost twice, Simon & Anthony are potential future winners, since both losses were over 5 games.

Sonning Sports 'C' include five players from last season's Division 5 winning team who, due to the squad size of 9 players, had limited playing opportunities, with Michael Byrne, Jude O'Halloran and John Scott playing in 4, 5 and 6 matches, respectively, while Mo Cole and Phil Peat were selected to play together in the final Doubles match of the season. This season they are joined by new-comer Stephen Edwards. In their first match, they came up against an in-form Sonning Common & Peppard 'F',



who beat them 9 - 1, Mo losing to Mike Casserley 5-11 15-13 8-11 8-11, before partnering Michael to a 3 - 0 Doubles win, over Mike & Derek Maltby, to avoid the whitewash. The following week, Sonning Sports welcomed Kingfisher 'l', who subsequently left as 4 - 6 winners, despite a worthy attempt at rescuing a draw, Sonning Sports fighting back from 2 - 5 down, with three consecutive 5 game sets. John stepped up to the plate first, beating Meriel Low 9-11 12-10 15-13 9-11 11-9, and he was then followed by Stephen, who overcame Derek Crombie 11-9 15-17 4-11 11-9 12-10, before Michael narrowly lost the final set, to Miguel Caballero, 8-11 11-8 10-12 11-9 9-11, Miguel having previously beaten John 11-8 8-11 15-13 4-11 12-10 and Stephen 9-11 11-7 11-8 12-10. In Week 3, Sonning Sports travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' where they lost 3 - 7, Jude winning a double, in beating Simon Blake and Arran Reeve, and then partnering Mo to a 12-10 11-7 5-11 8-11 11-7 Doubles win, over Anthony Reeve and Simon Blake. The following week they met Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' who had also lost their first three matches. John started the match with a win, defeating Jamie Li-Telford, with Phil gaining his first win when he also defeated Jamie 15-17 11-6 11-6 12-10. Unfortunately results then tailed away, with Stephen narrowly losing to Jamie 11-7 9-11 11-13 9-11 before John beat Russ Moores, in the final set, to clinch another point for his team and crucially, despite losing the match 3 - 7, stay above Kennet Valley. However, this was to change in Week 5, following an 8 - 2 defeat to Springfield 'E', Jude again recording a double, with neither Michael nor Mo ending the evening with a win, despite a number of close games.

Sonning Sports are not far off converting some of these close defeats into wins, which will be essential if they want to avoid the wooden spoon. Jude O'Halloran and John Scott have already recorded doubles, with Michael Byrne, Stephen Edwards and Phil Peat all recording a single, while Mo Cole is still to get off the mark. Their results against Kennet Valley and Kingfisher will probably be pivotal, as to how their season unfolds.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Sonning Sports have tried four pairings, resulting in two wins, with the averages showing Michael & Mo on 100% and Mo & Jude on 50%.

Springfield 'D' comprises Tom Berryman, Alan Goold and Chris 'Spike' Speight, who all played for Springfield 'C' last season, in Division 5, along with newcomers Maggie Kellermann-Thornton and Dave Parkin. Springfield 'D' had the misfortune to come up against Our Lady of Peace 'E', in their first game, and were beaten 9 - 1, Alan saving the team's blushes by winning his final set, against Andrew Adair, 12-10 7-11 11-8 11-7. The following week they drew 5 - 5 with Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', with Chris winning two, Tom and Maggie each picking up a single and Tom & Chris winning a crucial Doubles. In Week 3, Springfield 'D' travelled to Kingfisher 'I' where, despite Meriel Low recording a maximum for Kingfisher, the team won 6 - 4, thanks to doubles from each of Tom, Maggie and Alan, one of Tom's wins being his 23-25 14-12 11-9 11-8 victory, over Gill Bennett. The following week, Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' were the visitors, who left after playing 39 games with a 3 - 7 victory, Maggie recording her second, consecutive double while Chris won his set against Arran Reeve. Week 5 saw Springfield 'D' victorious once more, with a 7 - 3 win over Kennet Valley Free Church 'B', Tom Berryman recording a straight sets treble, Chris being made to earn his treble against Toby Barter, eventually winning 11-7 11-13 11-13 11-6 11-9, with Dave also recording his first win.

New signing Maggie Kellermann-Thornton looks to be a great acquisition, winning sets in all the matches she has played, and Dave Parkin may be following in her footsteps, winning a set in his only appearance to date. Tom Berryman and Chris Speight appear to have rediscovered their form, both recently recording their first trebles, and with Alan Goold continuing his form from last season, I predict that Springfield 'D' will finish in 6th place.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Springfield 'D' have tried four pairings, their only success being Tom & Chris's victory against Kingfisher. However, since Tom & Chris also lost against Our Lady of Peace, their average is currently 50%.

This season's Springfield 'E' team is effectively last season's 'D' team, with the omission of Adrian Wegrzynowski, who is now playing for their 'C' team. No replacement for Adrian has been announced, yet, so this season's squad currently comprises Marcello Caramma, Colin Jones, Julian Lancaster and Paul Martin. The season kicked off with a home match against a Tidmarsh 'E', which was won 6 - 4, thanks to a treble from Paul, a double from Marcello and a Doubles win, when Paul & Marcello beat Steve Andrews & Pete Sinclair. The following week, Springfield 'E' travelled to Milestone 'C' where, despite Carl Edlind recording a straight sets treble, they were again 6 - 4 winners, Marcello recording his second double, Colin kick starting his season with a double, Julian winning a single and another Doubles win, this time for Marcello & Colin, who beat Tony Hayden & Carl Edlind 12-10 11-9 7-11 8-11 11-7. In Week 3, table topping Tilehurst Methodists 'C' were the visitors, when Paul, Julian and Marcello were only able to beat Andrew Stone, eventually losing 3 - 7. The following week, Springfield 'E' travelled to new table toppers Reading FC 'B', losing 1 - 9, with Paul Martin winning his final set, against Derek Anderson, 11-8 5-11 11-5 14-12, to earn a point. In Week 5, Sonning Sports 'C' were the visitors, Springfield 'E' running out 8 -2 winners, courtesy of Marcello's first maximum, doubles for Colin and Julian, who both lost to Jude O'Halloran, and a Doubles win.

So, after five matches, Marcello Caramma and Paul Martin have both recorded trebles, whilst Colin Jones and Julian Lancaster have both recorded doubles, which bodes well for the future. However, because of the small squad, although I fully expect an upper mid-table position, I believe that Springfield 'E' will probably finish in 5th place.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, four different pairings have been tried, with three being successful. Marcello & Colin have played once and won once, as have Marcello & Julian, so both these combinations are on 100%. Just behind, with one win from two attempts are Marcello & Paul, on 50%, which means that Colin is the only player not to be on a losing side !

Tidmarsh 'E's squad comprises Steve Andrews, Mike Bundy, John Harland and Pete Sinclair, who all played for the 'E' team last season, and joining them is Roger Stevens, who played most recently for Pangbourne WMC. Tidmarsh kicked off their campaign with a visit to Springfield 'E', losing 6 - 4, with Pete winning twice while Mike and Steve both won once, although Steve was close to a double, just losing out to Marcello Caramma 9-11 12-14 14-16. The next week, Tidmarsh entertained Our Lady of Peace 'E' and I'll admit I was surprised to see that Tidmarsh had won 6 - 4, with John Harland turning in a Captain's performance and winning all three in straight sets, ably assisted by a double from Roger and a single from Steve. Checking the archives, this was John's first treble since October 2012 and in an exclusive, follow-up interview, this success was attributed to his bionics (OK, his new knee !) settling down, allowing him to be more mobile around the table. In Week 3, Milestone 'C' came to visit and this time Tidmarsh were on the losing end of a 6 - 4 scoreline and a John Evans hat trick with Pete only able to win two, while Roger and Mike could each only win one. The match scheduled for Week 4 was postponed until Week 6, which meant that their next match was at home to Tilehurst Methodists 'C', who won 2 - 8, Steve beating Rob James 4-11 11-9 12-10 10-12 11-9 and Roger beating Rob 11-2 11-7 5-11 7-11 11-9. Tidmarsh travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'F', for their rearranged match, ending the evening with a 3 - 7 win, thanks to a first treble for Steve and doubles for both Mike and John.

Both Steve Andrews and John Harland have already recorded maximums, with Mike Bundy, Pete Sinclair and Roger Stevens all recording multiple wins, including at least one double. I therefore believe that Tidmarsh will finish mid-Table, with 6th place within their grasp.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Tidmarsh are another team which have used a different pairing in each match, with no success, losing each time, although the stats indicate that the loss is less when Steve is one half of the combo. However, I was most impressed by the fact that Steve & John were only defeated 15-13 11-13 10-12 6-11 by Andrew Adair & Jan Polnik.

This season's **Tilehurst Methodists** '**C**' is a new combination, with Roy Hull dropping down a Division to bring his table tennis wisdom to the returning pair of Rob James and Steve Wood, the fourth member of the squad being newcomer Andrew Stone. Tilehurst Methodists travelled to Sonning Common & Peppard 'G' for the first match of the season, winning 7 - 3, Rob beating Arran Reeve 9-11 11-8 7-11 12-10 11-5, to set him on his way to a treble, with Roy assisting with a double and Andy coming through a close encounter with Arran Reeve, 9-11 12-10 10-12 11-8 11-5, to win on his debut. Kennet Valley Free Church 'B' visited the following week and were beaten 8 - 2, Steve Christelow highlighting some wicked serves, on his return to his old stomping ground, in beating Rob 18-16 8-11 11-4 12-10 and Roy 9-11 11-3 13-11 11-5. In Week 3, they travelled to Springfield 'E', with Roy and Steve both recording maximums, leaving as 7 - 3 victors after they also paired up to win the Doubles. The following week. Milestone 'C' were the visitors and they were also beaten 7 - 3, with Rob and Steve both recording maximums, Rob & Steve also pairing up to win the Doubles, beating Tony Hayden & John Evans 12-10 12-10 11-7, while Andrew's best opportunity to add to his tally was in his defeat to Colin Phillips. In Week 5, Tilehurst Methodists travelled to Tidmarsh, winning 8 - 2, a scoreline which didn't truly reflect the match, with 39 games being played, 17 of which were won by the minimum 2 points. At the end of the match, Roy and Steve had both recorded maximums, Steve only just beating Roger Stevens in his first set, 12-10 9-11 10-12 11-9 11-6, while Rob won one, losing his other two matches in 5 games, his loss to Steve Andrews 11-4 9-11 10-12 12-10 9-11 being especially close.

Tilehurst Methodists were briefly top of the table and are currently lying in 2nd place. They are the only undefeated team in the Division, although they have yet to meet two of the other teams who have topped the table in these first few weeks. Roy Hull, Rob James and Steve Wood have all won multiple trebles, with Andrew Stone having just the one win to his name, so far. With only four players in the squad, I believe that this means Tilehurst Methodists will be competing with Reading FC 'B' and Milestone 'C' for the runners-up spot.

As regards their Doubles partnerships, Tilehurst Methodists are the only other team to have won all five of their matches, utilising three different pairings. Statistically, Roy & Steve are slightly better than Roy & Rob, both pairings having played together twice. However, once Rob & Steve play together a second time, they may well take over the number one spot.

In the preceding verbiage, you may have spotted that, unlike the other sections, there are no photographs. So, if you would like to see your image in print, in a subsequent Newsletter, please submit your photos to our Newsletter Editor.

In the meantime, your challenge for the next edition is to beat any of the following since, so far, the most games played in a set is 40, the highest game score is 25-23, the "closest" set (maybe quite arbitrary since I don't see the blood, sweat and tears) is John Scott's 9-11 12-10 15-13 9-11 11-9 victory over Meriel Low, the competitors with the longest history are Derek Crombie and John Harland, at about 50 years and, again open to interpretation, the "closest" match was Sonning Sports 'C' against Kingfisher 'I', when 18 games were won by the minimum two points.
