A letter from Norman Berry :-
Hevine hold the position of Fixture Secretary for 8 of the past 10 years I have decided that I no loner. ish to ronain a. comittee memive The decision was made much u...iove when I vastad a club on a two fic in matter, (a) to advise anothe if of their toans that the last matel of their scason would not be played. (b) I was interested in the result of a certain match. What I didn't oxpect was a request from anothor club member to leave their promises. This kind of re-action I could do without and I would suggest that this club put forward nominations for the comittee to fill at least one vacant position. What is probally known, is that a has been put in to produce Results and Loague Tables for the nowspapers and averages for the Wirral Hom.

That is probally not known by the ordinary league nember is the anount of rule - bending or dubious practices carried on by some d bop. This season has seen many instances and in my opinion meny more than in provious seasons. Take the first division.

At the beginning of the season it appeared to be a race between Alderley, Wirral Gas \& New Brighton. Alderleys registrations looked vory strong, as did Wirral Ges, with New Brighton putting forwarl a formidable overall teand. In practice what happened? - MLDHRLEY Trevor Manning Wirral No 1 turms out only in crucial matchos, 7 so far this soason. Wayne Percival a Chezhire ranked player has managed to play 2 matches and by coincidence were both against Wirral Gas. Dont however spare any pity for Wirral Gas for in these matches they produ ced Keith Williams the Lancashire INo 4 and Liverpool no 1 for his only 2 matches in the Wirmal league, losing all his singles. New Brighton did however play the majority of their matches with the same 4 playors not withstanding that 2 of their players were Liverpool domicilod at the beginning of the scason.

Inother query that arises with regard to Liverpool and North Wales domiciled players is with representation in our Lancashire \& Cheshire teams. At present the foreign strength is 4 seniors and 2 juniors and I :now criticism has been voicod by members of the league in ths rospocitit second Division has been quite competitive and it would appear that Nal.go will win the Division from Alderley 3 . I have however hear
 on a clash of dates and in cosequenceflderley suffered a shock defeat, which could have cost them the Division.

Division 3. It would appear that $\mathbb{N}$. B.C.C. 2 will now win this division by tactics certainly within the rules, but considered by the chasing toans to bo completely unfair and unsporting. Table Tennis in the midile divisions was at one time played in a friendiy atnosphere,
and not as competitively ruthless as in the higher divisions.
In this cotext clubs were allowed considerable latitude in the starring
y of their players and whilst the league rulos could stop this practice
nt thery are rarely usod. Clubs in this catagory in the 2 middle aivisions are F:newood, Caldy, Engglish Martyrs, T.R.U.E.C., N.C.L.T.C. , Wirral Gas \& Neston. in 6 of the above instances the higher ranked team could be strenghthened by the indlusion of mombers of the lower ranked tean.

Tiis leads on to division 4 where the division is being contested by Bng. Mar: 2 \& Wirral Gas 3. both these teams aro in breach of the rulos e for ontire.y different reasons. Tho results for the season have shown that in the case of the fomer tam they have a player who could be in a higher division, anc $\%$ the latter team is not playing to its full strength.

Wallasey Lanor 3 are almost certainly winners of division 5 with Oxton $X$ Bats muners up, this divis ion contains quite a nuaber of young pulors who will make the higher divisions as the years progress.

Four teans $\%$ present fight out division 6 with Beauforts the
favourites. I ofter wonder what goes through the rinds of the more experienced in the Poauforts, Wall Ferries \& Upton C.C. teans when they
are faced with the i1 \& 12 year olds in this division. At present they may be able to takc it casy and be lenient. they should reflect howover that these youngsters wall progress rapidly and within a short time will be knockire thon off tae table.

A surther area of contention is the requesta by Clubs after the 31 st Jan. foa the registration of additional players and re-starring of other playors. I can as f:xture secretary and in docordence with the rules either accep: or regect such roquests. In this respect this season has been no different from previcus seasons. Since the 1 st Feio. I have received. 4 such requests, nearly all indicating that if they aro regected, they will have to. tura up with a player shont or not turn up ai all. In the interests o: plaring Table Tennis the request has nomally been accepted.

However these decitions can sometines have repercussions not envisačed at the jine of acceptance ard can have bearings on future results. I have orays he-d the view that the league is in existence to promote the
ing o Table Tennis at ail levels.
This report is not intended to upsct acmbers, it is mainly to point ou difficulties and anomalies in trying to comry out a thankless task.

The A.G.M. is due in May and I an sure that the comittee will be plesed to receive any constructive assistance in any of the foregoing mat:rs.


Wirrals first teem finishea off their season by being beaten 9-1 by Liverpool. Trevor Manning scored the only victory. Worse news, however, is that Warrington have been awarded a gane they had lost to Preston because Preston had played an ineligible player. this means that Warrington move ahead of Wirral in the division and the Wirral will be relagated.

Our second tean also finished the season by losing to Blackburn 9-1. This may cost then the division championship but at lerst they wiere already assured ofpromotion to Div. 2 where they will be . competing with our first team next season. This has been a fine achievenent by Phil Luxon (player nanager), Malcolm McEvoy \& Billy Wardle.

The third team completed their season with a $6-4$ win over Blackpool, this tean have had a disapointing season, but althou, they lost nore than they won they have avoided relagation, the fouth tean also recorded a win in their final matchto finish up in a respectable position in div. 5. This tean has been used to give experience to players who have never represented Wirral before and to juniors. Best results were obtained by Bernie Wentworth \& Andy Taylor but Roger Butler after a poor start won scveral natches in fine stylc.

The junior first tean beat Ellesmere Port in the final mutch of the season by $6-4$ to win the Div. 2 championship. The tension generated by the importance of the match(only a win was good enough for our team) neant that the quality of play was not as good as anticipated. Andy Taylor, Berhie Wentworth and Gary Daw wore the regular members of this tean and high hopes are entertained of the tean winning Div. 1 next season.

The junior second tead finished their season by beating Macclesfield to attain a respectable mid- table position. The recular tean was Paul Birken, Neil Kirsopp \& Neil Montague. Opportunity was also given taken to give representative experience to Paul Wright, Grahan Fletcher, Julian Weatierall \& Leigh Donnison.

Congratulations to Andy Taylor who was picked to play ir a reqional tean to play a visiting tean from Norway recentiy I believs ha won one \& lost one of his gaxes.
