THE CHRISTMAS HANDICAP TOURNAMENT

Held at H.Q. after Christmas, there were four preliminary sessions, two on Sunday and one each on Monday and Tuesday. A knockfout round was played after the groups in each session, producing eitht players to contest the Final Session on Wednesday in two groups of four.

Gary Watson (-9) was the lowest handicapped player. There were three First Division players from Southport - Andy Clark (+1), who plays representative matches for Southport, Steve Nield (+4), and Lee Pilkington (+3). Andy and Steve went through to the Final Session, but Gary lost in the knock-out round to Alderley's Sandy Sanderson (getting 19 start up to 31). Alan Currie (ex-Pinewood), who was on holiday from Bournmouth, turned up and was allocated a rating of +4. Alan just edged out Caldy's Eddie Jones from group runner-up spot 20/26, 27/25, 27/25 (Eddie receiving 12 start up to 26). In the knock-out round, Alan then gave Neil Allen of G.R.P.C.C. 8 start, but lost to Neil 15/21, 21/17, 12/21.

Little Cerie Tierney of Civic (+30) ran up in her group, shaving John Griffiths of Oxton 21/12, 16/21, 21/19 (Cerie with 5 start). John also had a titanic struggle against Neil Allen who gave 13 start and won 17/26, 26/24, 26/20. Neil Allen did well to give Cerie Tierney 18 start up to 31 and winning 27/31, 31/24, 31/24. Cerie lost in the knock-out round (getting 19 start to 31), to Roy Adams of Civic, 28/31, 31/33. Caldy's John Sherratt, playing in the Handicar for the first time, was given a tentative rating of +8. Although John beat an out-of-form Ron Jones (John with 3 start), he lost runner-up spot to Mike Ashton of Caldy, who received 6 start and won 18/21, 21/15, 22/20.

Tiny Peter Walsh Junior of Civic (+30), whose forehand seems to have "come a ton" this season, had a magnificent win in his group against Mark Newns of Oxton (+17), 26/16, 20/26, 26/12. Unfortunately for Peter, Mark went through on games average. Mark in turn knocked out Peter Walsh Senior (who gave away 7 start), 19/21, 21/14, 21/17. Dave Jones of Thingwall had a good session off his handicap of +16. He won his three group games, with Frank Sorrentiino (+14) running up. An interesting player in this group was Glynn Tierney of Civic, who found himself struggling with +6, having started this season with a rating of no less than +16. Glynn says he has set himself a target to reach Soratch before the end of the season! Suzie Sorrentino of Civic (+21) won her group, and with 7 start in the knock-out round disposed of her Dad, 21/17, 18/21, 21/14. Sandy Sanderson (Alderley), had an exciting group match against Mark Newns (Oxton). Sandy gave Mark 7 start and, with his super-anti/long grass combi-bat, bamboozled young Mark 21/16, 23/21, 22/20.


