Here I am again, 21 years after our last RAFA final, 1964 v Pinewood lost 4 - 6. and before 1961 lost 4 - 6 to Co - op. Memories of these games are a classic match between Mary Robinson and Barbara Cain in 1961, and John Davies for Pinewood psyching me out of a vital game by bouncing the ball 8 or 9 times before serving. Also in that match George Ithell said put me on against Bill Blundell, I have never lost to him. He lost, in straight games. Anyway enough of this, back to the present. Steve Baker "our discovery" has to play Paul Birken discovery of the season. Paul growing in stature in physique & ability ts too sound for Steve 21-11 21110. Everyone tells me I must beat John Johns, so I borrow Mike's bat hoping the majic will rub off. It does, on an he plays above known form to win 23-21 in the 3rd, after I led 20-18.

With the tension gone Steve recovers famt for a good win over George, but the match that followed was worth the entry fee alone. Paul Birken, Div 2 singles champion, and only 3 losses all season Mike Thorne "errant genius". Mike takes the first, Paul the second and the standard of play could not be bettered in the 1st division. In the 3rd game Mike's reflexes and kills are too much for Paul. The point that gave him 16-9 was played so fast that the eye could hardly follow the ball. Paul killed the ball 3 times, but Mike's returned them all on the half-volley, and killed the next shot. Set to Mike, but Paul is going to be a great player, and for Mike anything is possible. In the end 7 - 3 to Manor. Steve says we will win next year.
