We have been fortunate to receive sponsorship in the form of 'Jonny Leach' bats and T S P balls from ROSEBANK SPORTS to whom we are grateful.

How often have we heard comments like "If it wasn't for that spin serve" or "Take his £50 bat away and I'd 'ave him" (yes you can pay that much these days). Well we've decided to give you the chance to put your money where your mouth is, and incidentally give the 'boys with the bats' a chance to show that skill is skill regardless of the equipment.

There are still a surprising number of players who have refused to submit to the lure of sponge since its inception in the early 'sixties' - this is your competition, you will be able to play with your normal bat while all the others will be using strange ones.

Add in the one or two wooden bat players, who will have to add rubber to their bats and who knows we may have the recipe for some fireworks.

We expect the singles to be taken very seriously with £40 prize money and the kudos of 'top hard bat man on Merseyside' at stake.

The doubles is expected to be very slightly more lighthearted because of the fact that partners will be drawn by the Committee - thus giving lesser players the chance to partner a 'star' in the quest for the £24 prize money and the title of hard bat doubles champs.

BURY JUNIORS 4 v WIRRAL JUNIORS 6

The Wirral Junior squad have not had the best of seasons in the Lancashire and Cheshire League, picking up only one point in four matches. Bury were 100% up to this match, and Wirral needed a good start to be in with any sort of chance.

Rob Bevan found the going tough against the Bury No. 1 losing the first game to 16 and then going 0 - 5 down in the second on his own serve, before coming to terms with his opponent's forehand loop. His character showed and a determined effort brought him the second game 22 - 20 and the third by 21 - 19. Wirral were in the lead for the first time this season.

Andy Howells, after an initial blast, which saw him leading 8 - 2 struggled gamely, but unsuccessfully to go down in the third game to Bury's No. 3.

Wirral's lead was restored by Geoff Oldfield who coasted through against the opposition's No. 2, and thoroughly demoralized him in the process.

This prized open the door for Wirral and with Rob Bevan adding two further sets to his initial win and Geoff and Andy winning one each, a somewhat crestfallen opposition reviewed their prospects of league success this season. Personally, I hope they make it, their friendly welcome and hospitality were exceptional in a competition in which these standards are generally high.

WIRRAL GAS 4 v BIRKENHEAD Y.M.C.A. 6

The last league meeting between these teams resulted in a draw, so a close match was in prospect for this R.A.F.A. Cup semifinal.

The first four sets went with the call, all in straight games with Y.M. exploiting Peter Chadwick's elevation to No. 1 to claim their two sets.

Gas then took a 3 - 2 lead with John Harris just getting the better of Alf Hayes 23 - 21 in the third game after the hardest set of the match. Unbelievably, John elected to play again immediately against Brian Fuller, and after losing the first game 21 - 11, Brian made John work hard for every point to run out a comfortable third game winner.

The stage was now set for the clash between Frank Irwin and Y.M.'s fourteen year old Rob Bevan. This produced the best table tennis of the evening both in attack and defence. One return of Frank's from a cross table kill will be remembered by all present for a long time, and although this shot virtually won the second game for Frank, Rob came back coolly to take the third with a little to spare.

The situation was reversed in the next set with Reg Bissell taking on Wirral Gas junior Geoff Oldfield. Despite a bad start in the first game Geoff pulled a lot back before going down 21 - 18. He opened up in the second game to win convincingly by 21 - 12, and then after making the early running in the third game, allowed Reg to claw his way back for a 22 - 20 win.

Y.M. now fancied their chance, but in the second doubles the scores stood at 10 all in the third before Alf Hayes backhand started to penetrate, allowing the Y.M. pair to clinch the match. The final doubles set was then a formality with Gas winning to add

some respectability and justice to the scoreline.

This match was a personal triumph for Rob Bevan who, just 12 months ago was a sixth division number 4, and dropped a set or two occasionally. 5 30 05
