Hoylake opened up the match with the first doubles hoping for an early lead, but John & Trevor proved Dave & Mal wrong & took the closely contested game 21/19 in the third. The second game was a repeat of the Wirral Closed final John this winning it quite easily two straight.

With Pinewood 2-0 up Mal went on to play Alan, Mal always looked like winningbut only after a few very good points did he complete it, there was one interesting point where Alan hit the ball about 3 ft. off the table & Mal voleyed it presumably trying to catch it, the point was awarded against him but it did not put him off his rythm.

John hoping to win the match alone, put himself on against Phil, he completed his trio of wins by dominating the game as he had done against Dave, it contained some intersting rallies but most went Johns way. Next on were the two number ones Lynne & Ted Lynne dominated this game and won it convincingly putting Pinewood in what looked like a commanding 4 - 1 lead.

Mals second singles against Trevor was quite a crunch set, the game consisted mostly of pushing and waiting for an opening to attack, with Trevor attempting to keep the ball away from Mal's forehand the game became very nailbiting. Even though Mal won in two24/22 21/18 it was a great game to watch. Dave's final singles against Lynne went in Hoylal favour again with Lynne unlucky to lose the second game, with Pinewood 1 now only 4 - 3 up they needed another win so they called on Alan & Ted they were in for a surprise because Ted played above himself to win the first game Alan came back to win the second, Ted was 20 - 15 up in the third & only managed to win it 19 in the third.

With the match at four sets all Phil played Trevor. Trevor won the first game 17 & with the second at 22/21 against Phil, Trevor hit the edge & it was amazingly retrieved by Phil who went on to win 24/22

He lost the third 13 but not easily, so it was 5 - 4 to Pinewood and the second doubles to play, Lynne & Alan won this quite easily to put Pinewood in the final against Upton V.H.

Chief umpire and tea maker on the night was Norman Berry (not a bad brew) and there were quite afew watching.

The much awaited match between the two leading competitors for the first division league championship got off to a cracking start that prooved to be the standard for the whole evening.

The first game between Alan Timewell (Upton) and Trevor Barraclough resulted in a very long and exiting set, how the umpire wished he had brought an alarm clock with him... both players adopted the defensive game with Alan introducing occasional bursts of hitting to great effect to win 22/20 20/22 & 21/17.

SCORE 1 - 0 to Upton.
Alan Pickering (pinewood) then levelled the match with a fairly comfortable win over Alan Currie winning 21/8 21/18.

SCORE 1 - 1.
The next set provided a feminine touch with the Wirral Ladies champion Lynne Fennah (pinewood) playing Gordon Atwell. Gordon after winning a very close fought first game 22/20 won the second quite easily 21/7 with deliberate top-spin against Lynne's quick hitting.

SCORE 2 - 1 to Upton.
In the fourth set the Wirral champion John Fennah (Pinewood) came up against a very determined Alan Timewell, the admiral display of Alan's defensive game reduced John to adopt a somewhat unusual pushing game intermingled with occasional hitting. John won the first 21/17 and Alan was extremely unlucky to lose the second 20/22.

SCORE 2 - 2.

After this very close fought set Gordon Exell (Upton) and Trevor entered the arena to contest the fifth game, again a very defensive attitude was taken by both players with Gordon showing how effective his backhand smash is down both wings to run out the winner in the first game 22/20. However Trevor maintained his consistent game whilst Gordon found the pressure too much to be able to reproduce his smashes and Trevor won the next two games 15 & 10. SCORE 3 - 2 to Pinewood.

Pinewood now having the lead for the first time decided to press home their advantage by calling on Alan Currie to play John, as

expected John ran out an easy winner 8 & 13.

SCORE 4 - 2 to Pinewood.

At this stage a very worried Alan Timewell decided to ask Alan Pickering to play Gordon Atwell who again produced a very controlled display of hitting and defence when necessary, winning 12 in the first game. In the second Alan changed his game hitting consistently to go 19/16 onlt to see Gordon steal the game 21/19.

SCORE 4 - 3 Pinewood.

In the first doubles the two Gordons got the better of John & trevorin two straight games 15 & 17 by their efforts in a tight all round game combined with crucial kills at the right moment.

SCORE 4 - 4.

At this stage both teams were very concious that the match may well result in a draw with sets and points playing an importent part. Sets were even whilst Pinewood had the advantage of 17 points.

Upton's captain then called what proved to be the most crucial set in the match. Gordon Exell proved that careful defence coupled with a need t to lose as few points as possible had an easy win over Lynne 6 & 2. SCORE 5 - 4 to Upton 17 points advantage to Upton.

With the last set being critical to both sides tension on the players was apparent, the two Alans (Upton) beat Alan & Lynne in straight sets 16 & 9 to win the match and the Lonsdale Cup for Upton.

All the players are to be congratulated for a very high standard of play sportmanship and spirit that evident, keeping the spectators on the edges of their seats throughout the match.

Only one thing possibly marred the match, Upton being the only team in the semi - finals to play in their correct order of ability, decided to change their order whilst Pinewood reverted to their correct order of ability. If both teams had played the game' who would have won?

The opportunity to correct this changing the order of play will present itself at the A.G.M. An ammendment is being proposed to insist teams play in ranked position in the singles and that i & 2s play 1 & 2s and 3 & 4s play 3 & 4s.


