

With the first half of the season over we can see a clear split in the division. The top three teams remain very close with only 4 points separating them, we then see two teams in a mid-table position and finally the final 5 teams make the low-table position.

Bounds Green 1 have had a very consistent first half of the season; they haven't lost a match yet and sit at the top of the table. Dawud Khan, Simon Jameson and Ben Link all appear in the averages. I'm sure the team will keep working hard the rest of the season so with luck they have given themselves a very good chance of winning.

Winchmore Hill 1 are tying with Tottenham 2, both teams has lost two games and has identical SF and SA! Unfortunately, John Fitzgerald of Tottenham 2 was out of action for a few weeks due to injury otherwise they wouldn't have had to call on players from lower divisions to help them and they would probably have been in a better position than they are now. Fred Burdett and David Wilson prove to be a strong duo for Winchmore Hill 1.

Ellenborough 6 lead the way in the teams trying to catch up with the top teams, albeit only by 1 point. Their position maybe a little surprising, being that the team that were relegated from the premier, but the season is not over yet.

Mayfield 4 sit one point behind Ellenborough 6 and with Remy De Lynen, who remains undefeated so far, they must fancy their chances for a better second half of the season. However, if they rely solely on Remy, things may not go their way.

Now come four teams that are separated by 3 points, Mayfield 5, Coolhurst 1, Bounds Green 2 and Potters Bar Free Church. It may be that Bounds Green 2 has the advantage as they have a game in hand and at this point in time it is too close to call as to who will finish where.

Winchmore Hill 2 haven't been able to win a game so far but Mark Barrell is doing his best to win the team points. Maybe their luck will change next half of the season; we can but wait to find out. Thanks to all the captains who have been so diligently getting their cards in on time.

Welcome to season 2016/17 consisting of 9 teams with two each from Ellenborough, SPS and Winchmore Hill and the remainder from Bounds Green, Tottenham and Mayfield.

After 6 weeks of matches, Ellenborough 8 were in the lead with 41 points: Bounds Green 3 on 39 and Ellenborough 9 on 31 points. Now that we have arrived at the end of the 1st half of the season, we see a slight change in the top 3 positions: Ellenborough 9, Bounds Green 3 and Ellenborough 8 with 61, 59 and 53 points, respectively.

Ellenborough 9's Thanos Morphitis lost his 100% to Chan Vithani (BG3) in the 4th game on 21st November and Steve Cumberbatch (formerly 3Es) also lost his to Tony Watts of Mayfield 7 in the 5th game. Chan lost his 100% to Ashok Shah (Mayfield 7) in the 5th game on 3 October.

Mirek Jozwiak (BG3) played all 24 games as did the 3 members of the Winchmore Hill 5 team: Dom Philp, Henry Rudd-Clarke and Barry Burnell. Barry had a great night in early November when he beat Ron Smith.

When Harold Webb of WH4 played against Ellenborough 8 on 4th October he commented on how much his team enjoyed the match "with plenty of nets and edges making the game more exciting" (or was it frustrating for others!)

On 18th October Jackie Berman (SPS3) had a lengthy game against Sheheryar Mogul (WH4) and finally won that in the end 21-19!

Bounds Green clearly like to play hard and complete as many games as possible. They played 40 out of a possible 45 games in the match against Mayfield 7 to win 6-3. Not content with that, they played 42 games against Ellenborough 9 and again won, but this time on a better score of 7-2.

Not surprisingly, Ellenborough 9 beat Ellenborough 8 by 7-2. Adding Steve Cumberbatch to that team after the initial registration of players has increased its strength.


